

Nigerian Vice-Chancellors Call For Adequate Security On Campuses

Concerned about the recent attack in Bayero University, the Vice Chancellors of Nigerian Universities charged the federal government to beef up security on the Campuses of Nigerian Higher Institutions for the protection of lives and property.

The Vice Chancellors, who spoke under the auspices of the Committee of the Vice Chancellors of Nigerian Universities, and led by its Chairman and Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Professor Ishaq Oloyede, came to commiserate with the University over the recent attack on Christian worshippers. The Vice Chancellors expressed their displeasure over the unfortunate incident and called on the government, as a matter of national concern, to expedite action to bring about lasting peace throughout the country.

The Vice Chancellors visited the families of the bereaved and

sympathized with those who were injured.

Professor Essiet of the Faculty of Agriculture, who lost his son during the attack, told the Vice Chancellors that he was comforted by the peaceful atmosphere of Bayero University and its detribalized staff with whom he spent many years like one family. He expressed appreciation to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Rasheed, for his utmost concern and the exemplified leadership qualities he demonstrated over what befell the family.

The wife of the late Professor Ayodele, Miss Bola Ayodele, who was visited by the Vice Chancellors, said the family was fully aware that what happened was not an internal crisis, but purely a societal problem, which required God's intervention. She said her deceased husband would be buried on Saturday at his home town of Ikerin Opin, Ekiti L.G.A., Kwara State.

On his part, Professor Olofin of the Geography Department, who narrowly escaped in the attack, said it was a trying moment in his life and

prayed to God to restore lasting peace in the country.

Former Speaker Masari Faults Leaders Over Insecurity
