**BUK is Set for the 30<sup>th</sup> Convocation**

Bayero University is set to hold the 30<sup>th</sup> Convocation ceremony for the conferment of higher Degree, Degrees, Diploma and the award of prizes on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2013.

Speaking at a press conference on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> June, 2013 the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, mni, MFR said 14,591 people would be graduated from the 2010/2011 and 2011/2012 academic sessions.

The Vice-Chancellor told the group of correspondents that on the eve of the convocation a building of Faculty of Dentistry, a twin-150 theatre at the Old Campus and another twin-649 theater at the New Campus would be commissioned.

Professor Rasheed explained that the 30<sup>th</sup> convocation ceremony would not feature a pre-convocation lecture and Chancellor's Night.

It will be recalled that the 29<sup>th</sup> convocation was held on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2011 and the University conferred honorary degrees on the CBN Governor, Sanusi Lamido Sanusi, Dr. Kase Lawal and Major General Theophilus Danjuma (Rtd.)

**V.P's Wife, Amina Sambo Seeks Bright Future for Nigerian Youth**

The wife of the Vice President, Dr. Amina Mohammed Namadi Sambo, has advocated for a prosperous future for Nigerian youth through inculcating moral values in them by the teachers and parents.

Speaking at a two-day National Conference on Nurturing Youth for Nation Building organized by the Sisters' Directorate of the International Institute of Islamic Thought, Nigeria Office IIIT (N) held in Bayero University on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2013, the wife of the Vice President lamented the precarious nature of Nigerian youth who are subject to all sorts of vices that are detrimental to nation building.

Dr. Sambo called on all the stakeholders to join hands together to save the future of Nigerian youth so as to have the good leaders that would transform country.

Delivering a keynote address on **Empowering the Youth for Societal Development: An Islamic Conceptual Model for Charting a New Course and Plan of Action**, Dr. Salisu Shehu said the youth is one of the most talked about issues in the media, politics, government policies

and academic discourse and constitutes more than 50% of Nigeria's population, as attested to by the 2006 National Census Result.

Dr. Shehu, who spoke extensively on the youth, societal development and national survival, also dwelt on the Islamic perspective on the youth. He cited relevant prophetic hadiths where youthful age remains sacrosanct to the worship of Allah.

The speaker, who is the Director, Institute for Continuing Education (ICE) and the Secretary of IIIT (N), averred that the most significant contexts in the case of youth development are the family, the school, the peer group and the larger community, saying the significance of these contexts to the project of youth empowerment is that they constitute the indispensable realms within which any programme must be situated.

The ICE Director, also propounded that the youth empowerment and development programme should comprise of Three Components: religious and moral training, social responsibility and leadership training and skill development and vocational training.

The Chairman of the occasion and the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, Mni, MFR said the event marked an important milestone in the University's calendar, as issues

that would redefine the future of Nigerian youth brought to the fore.

The Vice-Chancellor appreciated the efforts of Mrs. Namadi Sambo for her various development initiatives aimed at nurturing youth to be the good leaders of tomorrow.

He appointed her as the Bayero University Ambassador for moral and intellectual values.

The convener of the conference, the Head of Political Science Department, Dr. Aishatu Isma'il, in her opening remarks earlier said the conference was organized to address the daunting challenges facing the youth in Nigeria with a view to finding out a sustainable future for them.

#### **BUK Alumni Commends Prof. Rasheed led Management**

Members of the Bayero University Alumni Association have described the Phenomenal development now going on in both campuses of the University as a fall out of the sincerity, dedication and selfless service given by its management led by the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed mni, MFR.

Members who took turn to air their views at a meeting it held with the University Management last Tuesday

## **SUG Asks NASS to Stop ASUU Strike**

The Students' Union Government (SUG) of Bayero University, on behalf of the entire students has called on members of the National Assembly to intervene in the impending nationwide strike to be embarked upon by the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU).

Speaking at a one-week orientation for new students, the President of the Union, Comrade Sani Sa'id Ibrahim, said it is disheartening to BUK students in particular and Nigerian students in general that ASUU is planning to go on strike over some

issues which the Federal Government has hitherto failed to address.

In a paper titled: "*Challenges, Prospect of the Federal Parliament*", the Guest Speaker, who is also the Deputy Minority Leader, Honourable Abdulrahman Kawu Sumaila, mentioned subsequent changes in the leadership of the two chambers based on different allegations of corrupt practices as part of some of the challenges of the parliament and the passage of the freedom of information bill, which guarantees Nigerian's free access to information.

Speaking further on the challenges of the parliament, Hon. Sumaila was disturbed by the rate of leadership turn out at the National Assembly, particularly the Senate during the first and second phases of the Fourth Republic (1999-2003) and (2003-2007) where individuals in quick secession emerged as leaders. According to him this was occasioned by poverty of political leadership and other inclinations, most of which were completely dirty and morally injurious to the nation.

On the positive side of the legislative functions and out-puts of the nations legislations the periods, the Deputy Minority Leader said the passage of the Freedom of Information Bill (FUI), which recently passed both houses and was signed into law by the President, Constitutional Amendment;

Anti Terrorism and Money Laundering Prohibition Bill, Sovereign Wealth Bill and the Electoral Act, amongst others, were some of the landmarks.

He emphasized the need for the legislators to set out of their systematic and self-inflected impediments and confront the challenges they face with a view to rationally performing the functions for which they were elected.

According to him, this is particularly so in that the benefits, democratic self-fulfillment and governance of the Nigerian masses are clearly looked into in the existence of an effective non-corrupt legislature and legislative process devoid of political decadence.

Also speaking, Professor Aliyu Dauda of the Faculty of Education, who spoke on *Education as a Tool for Social Change* described education as the fundamental factor for the development of any society. He observed that on the other hand arrogance and pride are the bases of self destruction.

In his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed extolled the virtues of the minority leader for his laudable assistance to the University.

The occasion was chaired by Dr. Aisha Abdu Isma'il, Head of Political Science Department with the DVC

Admin, Prof. Sadik I. Radda, the Registrar, Alh. Sani Ibrahim Amin, the Director, C.I.T, Dr. A.B Baffa, the Bursar, Buhari Musa, the Director, Directorate of General Administration, Mal. M. D. Nasiru and members of the Academic staff in attendance.

### **Round Table Discussion:**

#### **V.C. Challenges Academics to Embrace Change in line with Globalization**

Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed mni, MFR has challenged Academic Staff to be courageous enough to embrace change in line with the fast emerging globalization.

Speaking as a Special Guest at a one-Day Round Table Discussion organized by the Directorate of Academic Planning, Prof. Rasheed stated that BUK academic staff cannot afford to continue to teach students with board markers, saying that global trend now is teaching through the use of Power-points.

He said to encourage them to change in line with the global trend, BUK Management will provide each academic staff with Ipad facilities as part of the effort to achieve smooth transition from writing on the board to using Power-points to deliver lectures.

Professor Rasheed commended the organizers of the Round Table Discussion and said such a forum in which “we will examine ourselves in the two most important rituals of matriculation and convocation”, was a welcome development.

He said the exercise was a kind of quality assessment of the various roles we played in teaching and examination conduct and called on all to participate actively and at the end of the day show improvement in their conduct.

**The first paper titled:**

“*Procedure For Handling Examination Malpractice*” was presented by Dr. A. B. Ahmed, Dean Faculty of Law. He said examination malpractice was nothing but the violation of the rules and regulations of the conduct of examinations set up by the University Senate, saying that “This is achieved through the attempt to gain advantage over other students by the use of unfair and unacceptable methods”.

Dr. Ahmed said it was in an effort to protect the quality of the degrees awarded by the BUK Senate that necessitated setting up rules and regulations for the conduct of examination in the University.

He said as for the procedure to handle exam malpractice, it was important to administer examinations in

accordance with the examination regulations and also keep students under continuous but un-obstructive supervision

He also suggested that the best condition be provided for all students without disruption or distraction, as well as electronic devices, such as Ipads or Radio, must not be used during examinations.

Invigilators should report actual alleged instances of student misconduct occurring in the examination halls, adding that whenever a committee of investigation is to be set-up to investigate exam malpractice, it is important that suspects be fully informed of the allegation against them, so that issues of bias will not arise.

**Poor Reading Habit Bane of PG Students – DVC Academics**

The last minute rush to beat deadline set by Departments/ Faculties for some PG Students as well as poor reading and writing habits have been identified as part of the factors militating against the timely completion of Higher Degrees in the University.

The assertion was made by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Muhammad Y. Bello, while presenting a paper titled: Postgraduate

Supervision, Best Practices at a one-day Round Table Discussion organized for Deans, Heads of Departments and PG Coordinators by the Directorate of Academic Planning.

He observed that poor planning at various levels, both in admission process, registration, and lack of work plan and under utilization of Information Technology were some of the obstacles bedeviling postgraduate studies at Bayero University.

On the way forward, Professor Yahuza Bello advised students to write and submit their research proposal on time to avoid unnecessary delays, as it could lead to the extension of one's programme.

In his contribution, Professor E. A. Olofin of Geography Department urged PG students to always endeavour to come up with deep literature review in their studies as that would enrich their conceptual and theoretical ideas on their research programmes.

In his closing remarks, Professor, Mustapha C. Duze, Director, Directorate of Academic Planning, thanked the participant for their patience and advised the various heads at the occasion to effect positive changes as discussed.

Also speaking, Professor M. I. Yakasai of the Department of Education said a research supervisor is expected to function in many ways in the process of interacting with a student under his supervision. He added that such functions are characterized by mutual understanding, discussions, commanding and assisting the student.

Prof. Yakasai said "even though a supervisor is expected to serve as a guardian to his student, he is also expected to ensure that the researcher does not commit plagiarism". He added that providing anti-plagiarism software by management will curtail such problems and make it much easier for the academics.

Professor Yakasai, who is the Dean, Faculty of Education, explained that given that a research begins with an identification of the problem, the supervisor therefore is expected to assist the student to come up with the problem area for the study, guide learner to identify the varieties of the study and assist them in outlining the background of the study.

The Dean emphasized that research or project supervision has been an integral part of the lecturers' job and is pertinent for any lecturer to discover new knowledge and at the same time disseminate it. Project supervision he said is not an easy task



but yet compulsory to lecturers. Therefore in so doing, patience and perseverance are needed when attending to students and more time should be devoted to students being supervised so that numerous functions outlined can best be achieved.
