30th Convocation Graduates 14,626 - 54 Bag First Class Honours

Bayero University has conferred higher degrees, degrees and diplomas to a total of 14,626 graduands who have been found worthy both in character and learning at the 30th Convocation ceremony.

The ceremony which took place at the University's Convocation arena on Saturday 22^{nd} June, 2013 marked the graduation of candidates from 2010/2011 and 2011/2012 academic sessions.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR congratulated the graduands for working so hard to make their parents and well-wishers proud.

Professor Rasheed told the gathering that Bayero University has gone through tremendous transformations in physical structures and academic programmes and laid a vibrant foundation to be one of the leading institutions for learning and research in Nigeria.

The Vice Chancellor enumerated a number of academic programmes, research centres and new faculties established in the University all in an effort to improve the quality of teaching, learning and research.

"As a testament to our University's growing influence, we have continued to collaborate with reputable Universities at home and

abroad, particularly in the areas of collaborative research, staff development, benchmarking and brand-making as well as industry training," he remarked.

No More Sub-Degree Programmes in BUK – VC

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR says Bayero University will no longer offer any subdegree programmes but will concentrate on awarding degrees and higher degrees.

The Vice Chancellor said this on Wednesday 19th June, 2013 while addressing a press conference on the 30th Convocation ceremony.

Prof. Rasheed explained that the Institute for Continuing Education (I.C.E) overseeing the affairs of sub-degree programmes would now conduct open and distance learning as the University is fully prepared to start part-time degree programmes in various disciplines.

"Admission into any sub-degree programme is stopped from this session but the current students are to complete their various diploma programs," the Vice Chancellor added.

The Vice Chancellor stressed that Bayero University in its continuous drive to improve the quality of teaching and research as well as broaden access, by next year every class will have interactive board as part of effort to promote e-learning in order to meet the challenges of global best learning practices.

Nineteen Students Get Reward for Academic Excellence

In view of its support for the development of science and technology, the Petroleum Technology Development Fund (PTDF) has presented letters of scholarship award to nineteen successful students of the University.

The students who were chosen based on their performances in their various fields of study also received a laptop each with N50,000 naira subscription fee.

At a brief function organized by the Electrical Engineering Department, a representative of PTDF, Mallam Garba Bako said the fund would in addition pay them \$\frac{1}{2}\$150,000 each as up-keep allowance and refund whatever money was charged the students by the University.

He, however, cautioned them to guard against cultism or examination malpractice which he said would lead to the withdrawal of the offer.

The Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) Professor Muhammad Y. Bello. represented the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed mni, MFR, at the occasion, described the effort of PTDF as timely and in consonance with the determination of Bayero University in developing **ICT** as the bedrock in technological advancement.

The Vice Chancellor said the University has directed for the conversion of two kitchen complexes to computer rooms where three hundred to five hundred computers would be installed in a drive to provide access to IT resources for all students.

Professor Rasheed urged the beneficiaries to maximize the unique opportunity to continue to excel academically.

For any students to continue enjoying the scholarship he/she must maintain a minimum CGPA of 3.00 on the scale of 1.00 to 5.00.

Among the beneficiaries, eight students were from Electrical Engineering Department, four from Computer Engineering, two, Civil Engineering and one, Mechanical Engineering, one, Physics Department and



three are undergoing Postgraduate programmes.

2013/2014 Promotions Exercise

The Director, Personnel Affairs has asked Deans, Directors, Heads of Department and Unit to forward their submissions on the 2013/2014 annual promotion of senior staff.

A statement signed on his behalf by Aishatu M. Uba (Mrs) said, Heads of Department/Unit should please ensure the following:

- a) That there are vacancies to which staff are to be recommended for promotion in line with approved 2013 budgetary provisions;
- b) That staff should have served for three years in the promotion by 30th September, 2013 and appointment duly confirmed;
- c) That cases of administrative staff in various faculties/department should be routed through the Registry Department Appointments, Promotions and General Purpose Committee;
- d) That the cases of Stores officers in various faculties/departments should be routed through the University Bursary Department;
- e) That cases of Librarians and Library Officers in various faculties/departments should be routed through the University Library;
- f) That cases of Academic staff must pass through the Departmental and Faculty A&PCs and minutes of the meetings of the Faculty Appointment and Promotions Committee should be attached to the recommendations:
- g) Staff on approved Study fellowship could be promoted up to the rank of lecturer I or equivalent, provided that he/she would not

- be promoted twice in one Study fellowship period;
- h) All submissions should be strictly based on the extent promotion guidelines for the appropriate cadre.

Departments/Units are to forward **twenty copies** (20) of their submissions to the Directorate of Personnel Affairs not later than **Friday** 2nd **August**, 2013.

It should be noted that only two (2) salary Structures exist in the system: CONUASS (01- 07) for Academic Staff and CONTISS (01 - 15) for Senior Administrative, Professional and Technical Staff across the cadres.

Faculty of Medicine Seminars Call for Integrated Approach in Teaching and Research

The need to promote integrated approach in curriculum development, teaching and research in medical and life sciences and applications of subject with wide range of applications such as statistics has been emphasized.

This is part of the outcome of deliberations after the five seminar sessions conducted by the Faculty of Medicine between July, 2012 and March, 2013 during the 2011/2012 academic session in an attempt to promote academic activities and public services in the University.

The interactions and inspiring deliberations made by the participants during the seminar session, prompted some useful outcomes in terms of identified new concepts and different research angles, including consultation



between various stockholders on the feasibility of establishing stem cell research and an appropriate ruling on autopsy and brain death.

Other outcomes include regular monitoring and revision of the clinical status, as well as guidelines for the management of infection in the immunosuppressed individuals.

The seminar sessions observed that themes, scope, content and quality of presentations, as well as their benefit in terms of the contributions to the academic and professional development of the participants are adequate to be allotted a Continues Medical Education (CME) credits by the relevant statutory bodies.

A statement signed by Dr. Faruk Sarkin Fada said each of the seminar session was attended by an average of 200 participants from wide range of disciplines including medical and allied sciences, basic sciences, arts and humanities and legal and religious studies.

The seminars were presented based on multidisciplinary subject, and were coordinated by Dr. Faruk Sarkin Fada and chaired by the Dean, Faculty of Medicine, Professor Abdulrazaq Garba Habib for the purpose of promoting integrated knowledge production and dissemination.
