Students' Poor Reading Culture Worries Vice Chancellor

Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR, has expressed concern over the poor reading culture of students, saying that academic excellence is only achievable through wide reading and extensive individual research.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking after he received a collection of 247 books donated to the University by family of the late Sheikh Nasiru Mustapha.

He said those who excelled and made names in the academia and other fields of human endeavor never acquired such fame on a platter of gold but rather worked very hard for it through wide and extensive reading and research.

Professor Rasheed stated that it was very unfortunate that some students these days would tell you boldly that throughout their stay in the University they never had library card let alone make use of its facilities, vet excel they want to academically, "this is practically impossible," he lamented.

He said efforts would continue to be made to draw the attention of students to the importance of not only using library facilities but also imbibing the culture of reading which he said remains a crucial key to academic success. On the donated books, the Vice Chancellor said the late Sheikh Nasir Mustapha (author of the books) was his former Principal and teacher at the School for Arabic Studies, (SAS) Kano, adding "he was a pious man who lived a life dedicated to scholarship and Islamic teaching and research."

The books, he said would go a long way to assist both students and teachers in teaching and research work, saying to achieve this, 'I shall discuss with the various departmental heads on how to put the books to maximum use rather than dumping them in the library as they might not be properly utilized due to students' poor reading culture', he stated.

He expressed gratitude to the family of the late scholar and assured them that the books would be put to good use.

Earlier, son of the late Scholar, Dr. Mustapha Nasir Malam, a senior lecturer at the Department of Mass Communications presented the books to the Vice Chancellor and said members of the late Sheikh's family decided to donate the books to BUK in order to serve as *Sadakatil Jariya* to their late father as well as for the books to be put to maximum use by the larger society.

He said the collection of books is made up of 247 different titles cutting across Arabic literature, Arabic Jurisprudence and Islamic Studies and thanked the Vice Chancellor for accepting the donation.



He suggested that the books should be added to the main library reserve collection for better access to all.

Infrastructural Expansion:

BUK'll Not Increase Students Population - **VC**

Bayero University will continue to maintain its current student population level in spite of the on-going infrastructural expansion and introduction of new academic programmes, Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR, has said.

He told the newly elected national leadership of Bayero University Kano Alumni Association (BUKAA), which paid him a courtesy call on Tuesday 28th January, 2014, that the management was not contemplating the possibility of a review of its student population upward, 'this is a deliberate effort on our part to ensure the maintenance of high academic standard and quality', he remarked.

The Vice Chancellor stated that when he assumed duty over three years ago, he inherited a population of about 35,000, saying that gradually it was reduced to 28,000 and that 'if I will have my way before the end of my tenure, I shall reduce the population further to 25,000. This is just to make sure that quality was not in any way compromised', he promised.

Professor Rasheed also told the BUKAA national leadership that the University had 8 Faculties and only two Centres when he took over three years ago, saying that 'we expanded and improved our academic

rating as well as expanded our reach and 'God willing by the end of March, 2014 the University will have 14 Faculties with a functional College of Medical Sciences,' he stated.

He congratulated the BUKAA leadership, adding that this was the first time the University had a properly and legally constituted leadership of the Alumni Association and assured of the willingness of the management to work with it for the progress of the University. The Vice Chancellor added that 'we are lucky to have a decent and highly respected executive committee and above all people we can work with', he said.

Prof. Rasheed said the university does not have tall dreams and that 'we are not going to give you targets but all we expect from cooperation, support you are to attract goodwill to the willingness university. Do yourself not give unnecessary pressure, do your best and leave the rest to God', he counseled.

Earlier, in his address, the National President of the Association, Malam Mohammed Dattijo Usman had told the Vice Chancellor that the association was having its maiden meeting after its election last year, saying that the new exco had found it necessary to pay him a courtesy call in order to intimate the management on their agenda and what they were planning to do to assist the university.

He commended the university management under the leadership of Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed over what he described as a monumental and tremendous infrastructural expansion going on which



he said gladdened their heart, and urged the management to maintain the tempo.

BUK to Host International Confab on Islamic Banking in April

Bayero University, Kano will convene an International Conference on Islamic Banking and Finance in April, this year, as part of efforts to stimulate teaching and research in that area, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR, has disclosed.

He said the conference would be promoted by the University's International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance and would attract renowned Islamic Banking scholars from across the globe.

Professor Rasheed who was speaking when he received the new Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of Jaiz Bank, Muhammad Nurul-Islam, on Monday, 27th January, 2014, during a courtesy call stated that the Governor of the Central Bank, Malam Sunusi Lamido Sunusi would deliver a keynote address while his counterpart from Malaysia has also agreed to attend the conference.

The Vice Chancellor congratulated the new Jaiz Bank Chief Executive Officer and urged him to bring his wealth of experience to bear on the management of the bank in order to restore the confidence of both customers and investors.

He said part of the reason why there was a lot of skepticism about the operation of the bank was because people thought it would not succeed and might follow the path of failed banks, "but with your appointment as the chief executive officer coupled with your resume in the Islamic Banking sector in Bangladesh, a country where Islamic banking debuted and became highly successful, confidence of the people on the bank's viability had been restored. "We will spread the good news about your current effort to build the bank," he remarked.

Professor Rasheed assured the management of the bank of willingness of the University to work closely and collaborate; and called on it as a first step towards such collaboration to partner with BUK on the convening of the forth-coming International Conference on Islamic Banking and Finance.

Earlier, in his address, the Jaiz Bank Managing Director, Mohammad Nurul-Islam told the Vice Chancellor that they were in the University to introduce the new Chief Executive Officer of the bank and to intimate the management of the efforts the new management was making to reposition the bank and build investors' confidence as well as explore possible areas of collaboration with the University.

He said the bank is opening more branches in the country and across West African Sub-region, would remain transparent and work very hard. This, he said would sustain improvement of the bank's equity from three billion Naira in 2012 to №20 billion by the end of 2013, adding 'God willing our target for 2014 will be №25 billion in the first quarter; №50 billion in the second



quarter and by December it will be \(\frac{\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{quarter}}}}}{100}}{100}\) billion Naira', he promised.

Sociology and Community Medicine Get New HODs

Dr. Maikano Madaki has been appointed the new Head of Department of Sociology for a term of two years commencing from 27th January, 2014, according to a letter of appointment signed by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR.

In a similar vein, Dr. Sunusi Abubakar has been appointed as Head of Department of Community Medicine for two years with effect from 14th March, 2014. His appointment letter was also signed by the Vice Chancellor.

In both letters, the VC advised them to "give sound academic and administrative leadership" to their Departments and "encourage democratic participation by your colleagues in running the affairs of the Departments."

British Council Trains BUK Students On Effective Leadership Skills

British Council has trained four students of Bayero University, Kano on effective leadership skills organized for "Leaders of Tomorrow" in Abuja. The training took place on 26th September, 2013 for cohort 2 module 1.

Speaking to the Bulletin on 23rd January, 2014, Hamisu Haruna Hamisu, a participant from Level 400, Department of Education, said "The programme tagged

Leaders of Tomorrow, was aimed at grooming students' leaders who are the hope for future leadership in Nigeria and the world at large."

Also speaking, a co-participant, Sesay Amara Femoh, said the training enabled them to come up with a programme called 'Readers Enlightenment Project' to be executed on the campuses of Bayero University next semester.

During the programme, the participants learnt effective communication skills and were trained to be selfless, honest, and have trust in God to achieve leadership goals.

The participants were selected under the platform of their different associations for effective representation of the six targeted Universities from Northern Nigeria. This was done following their individual online applications for the training. The names of the participants are: Hamisu Haruna Hamisu and Sesay Amara Femoh both of Level 400, Department of Education, who were selected under Muslim Students' Society of Nigeria (MSSN); Mary Iveren Tofi from the Department of Physical Health Education represented ROTRACT Club and Binta Sadiq of the Department of English and Literary Studies served as representative Justice of Chamber International (JCI).

The proposed "Readers' Enlightenment Project" for BUK is aimed at improving passion of readership and research among the University students, considering the importance of the library at all times in the life of students. The participants also called



on the University management to support their up-coming project.

Human Rights Violation Has No Abode in BUK - VC Assures

Bayero University has a workable mechanism in place to tackle various issues of human rights violation, Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR has disclosed.

He told members of Kano Civil Society Forum (a coalition of Civil Society Group in the State) who paid him a courtesy call on Monday 27th January, 2014, that the University being the trainer and custodian of the nation's youth had always considered all cases of human rights violation seriously, especially as it affects students and had put appropriate machinery in place to address them.

Professor Rasheed said a lot more needed to be done to address the menace of human rights violation in the larger society, adding that Bayero University would, with all sincerity collaborate with them to reduce it to the barest minimum.

The Vice Chancellor stated that it was unfortunate that in most cases those who are supposed to be seen protecting laws and forbidding human rights abuses often ended up as worst violators, and advised the forum to focus its advocacy more to the larger society 'which does not have any mechanism in place for tackling such abuses and pay less attention to institutions which he believed have deviced various means of tackling the issues.

He said any society that "neglects its youth definitely neglects itself," adding "this is the more reason why your efforts in addressing the menace of human rights violation especially on youth need to be complemented and supported. We in BUK will definitely extend such to you," he remarked.

Earlier, Chairman of the forum, Malam Bala Abdullahi, said they were in the University to seek collaboration in area of youth rights violation, saying that 'we believe BUK has a lot to offer in that area.'

He said the forum has been in the forefront of conflict resolution particularly in the area of inter-ethnic and inter-religious harmony under the DFID programme as well as spear headed youth sensitization and mobilization against allowing themselves to be used as tools for violence and unrest.

2013/2014 AAU SMALL GRANTS FOR DISSERTATIONS/THESES PROGRAMME

The Association of African Universities (AAU) is pleased to announce the 2013/2014 edition of its **Small Grants for Dissertations/Theses Programme** under the Sida Research Cooperation support. The Programme is aimed at facilitating timely completion of doctoral research theses and dissertations, and improving the quality of research within its member institutions.

Eligibility: The Programme is open to graduate students, researchers, lecturers, and staff registered for PhD or MPhil in the nominating universities, and who are preparing dissertations/theses in fields of study that contribute to development, with special preference for the following themes:

- 1. Economics and related disciplines, especially entrepreneurship in Africa;
- 2. Engineering and information technology;
- 3. Education, Gender and HIV/AIDS;

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4. Agriculture, Food Security and related disciplines.

Application Procedure: AAU member institutions in good standing on the payment of their subscriptions¹, are invited to nominate a maximum of **THREE** (3) doctoral and **ONE** (1) MPhil candidates each, at least one of who <u>must</u> be female. At most **three** awards will be made in any nominating institution within the limits of available funds. Applications should therefore indicate the **degree of priority** it attaches to each of its four nominees.

Nominations must include the following:

Research Proposal: An original/innovative research proposal of not more than 10 typewritten pages clearly outlining the *Problem Statement*, *Literature Review*, *Methodology*, *Expected Results*, a *Work Plan* and *Timetable*.

Status Report: Report indicating progress so far made on the thesis/dissertation, what remains to be done and the additional resources required to complete the project.

Budget: A detailed Budget with expenses clearly linked to specific phases of the proposed activity. The Budget should not exceed US\$4,000 for the PhD and US\$2,000 for MPhil.

Apart from trips for fieldwork in the country in which the research is actually conducted, travel abroad is not funded.

NOMINATION DEADLINE: Nominations are currently being accepted from heads of institutions in good standing from now till February 28, 2014.

AAU Staff Exchange Programme Promoting Staff Mobility in Africa

Introduction

The AAU is pleased to announce the 2013/2014 edition of its Staff Exchange Programme which aims at facilitating academic mobility and encouraging networking among AAU member institutions, as well as contributing to improvements in the quality of training and research in African higher education institutions.

Under the Staff Exchange Programme academic staff from universities in Africa, or African academics in the Diaspora, are sponsored to undertake visits to universities in Africa to offer services such as teaching, graduate theses supervision, serving as external examiners or engaging in joint research.

Advantages

Staff Exchange missions allow academic staff to get acquainted with different work environments, mentor young scholars or researchers and meet their colleagues involved in the same research areas and in the long term help build cooperation between sending and hosting institutions.

The Visit

Duration: 4 - 12 weeks

The visit to the host institution under the AAU Staff Exchange Programme involves participation of the Staff Exchange Fellow in any of the following:

- teaching assignment;
- research collaboration;
- · graduate supervision; or
- external examination.

For research collaboration, Exchange Fellows are expected to research on a theme connected to one of the following areas:

- 1. The role of higher education in promoting sustainable development in Africa;
- Promoting university-industry linkages for graduate employability;
- 3. Agriculture, Food Security and related disciplines;
- Economics and related disciplines, especially entrepreneurship in Africa;
- 5. Engineering and information technology; and
- 6. Education, Gender and HIV/AIDS.

Please note that except in unforeseen or exceptional circumstances, an exchange mission cannot be postponed to the following year. For this edition of the Programme, all exchange missions have to be undertaken by end December 2014.

AAU Financial Support

The AAU will support up to six staff exchange missions and two African academics from the Diaspora will be sponsored on sabbatical leave for the 2013/2014 year.

Financial support for exchange fellows includes the following:

- US\$2,500 to cover economy class air ticket or the equivalent;
- US\$3,500 honorarium for a teaching or research mission
- US\$2,000 honorarium for an external examiner
- US\$1,000 to cover incidental expenses (paid as soon as the dates of the mission are agreed between the Exchange Fellow and the receiving institution)

African academics from the Diaspora who will spend part of their sabbatical leave in Africa for purposes of teaching or graduate supervision will receive a maximum of US\$5,000.

Home/Host Institution Obligations

The home institution of the visiting professor/lecturer shall maintain the payment of his/her salary and benefits for the duration of his/her absence from the institution for the purpose of the exchange mission.

The requesting institution shall cater for the local expenses of the visiting professor/lecturer including lodging, board, local transportation, and medical care during his/her stay at the institution.

Who Can Apply?

AAU member institutions in good standing on the payment of subscriptions are invited to request in writing, the services of a visiting professor/lecturer by completing the necessary forms below.
