## **Professors Challenged to Present Inaugural Lectures**

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *nni*, MFR has challenged Professors in Bayero University to expeditiously present their inaugural lectures as part of their statutory responsibilities to enlighten the University community in their specialized fields.

Speaking at the 12<sup>th</sup> Professorial Lecture delivered by Professor Aliyu Kamal of the English and Literary Studies Department on Wednesday at the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, the Vice Chancellor said inaugural lectures are integral to the reputation of any serious University.

Prof. Rasheed noted that Bayero University has over 150 Professors and 20 new ones would soon be produced to join the league of senior academics.

He said the University is equipped to present inaugural lectures every week in the next 5 years and would not rest on its oars to continue to produce highly qualified academics to ensure excellence.

While presenting the guest lecturer, the Head of the Department, Dr. Sadiya Sani Daura, said Aliyu Kamal is a Professor of Applied Linguistics who rose through the ranks to become a senior academic in the University. She said Prof. Kamal won several awards, including the Umar Ladan Price for Best Student in 1982 and his novel, *Fire In My Backyard* received the best ANA/Chevron

novel prize in 2005. Dr. Daura added that the lecturer wrote 8 articles in different journals and is the co-author of three books on Language and Linguistics and eleven novels.

Earlier, the Chairman of the Inaugural Lecture Committee, Professor M. S. Abdulkadir, welcomed members to the 12<sup>th</sup> Professorial Lecture and said in the next three weeks another lecture would be presented. Professor Umma Jalingo delivered the vote of thanks. Members of management, Deans and Directors were also present.

The title of the 12<sup>th</sup> lecture was *The Islamic Novel: Style and Structure*.

### ***12<sup>TH</sup> Professorial Inaugural Lecture:* In spite of Glaring Differences, Muslim Writers Can Imbibe English Language Styles**

**- Prof. Kamal**

A Professor of Applied Linguistics in the Department of English and Literary Studies, Bayero University, Professor Aliyu Kamal says in spite of the many differences between Islamic and English Novels, he believes that the latter “has a great deal to offer to Islamic Novel in the form of thematic treatment in an effort to enlighten and entertain the reader.”

Professor Kamal was speaking as a Guest Lecturer at the University’s 12<sup>th</sup> Professorial Inaugural Lecture with the topic *The Islamic Novel: Style and Structure*, which took place on Wednesday, 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2014 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium.

The erudite scholar in the paper discussed the Islamic Novel from the ways it shares some aspects of fictional writing with the English Novel and from the ways the two forms of literature diametrically oppose each other. Some of the aspects they share, according to Professor Kamal, include being multidisciplinary and entertaining the reader, while the two literary forms differ greatly on the question of the abstract, eternal values as a reference point, the place of change and authority in the life of man.

He went further to make a succinct comparison between the two novels by saying that the preoccupations of characters are either shown to diverge from religion, as in the English Novel, or bind to religious precepts, as in the Islamic Novel. He also said whereas individualism is stressed in the former, the latter projects communalism and thus portrays the individualist character as exclusive, diversionary and egocentric-character traits likely to harm the relations holding between characters.

By being neutral, Professor Kamal stated, the English language, as a vehicle of literary expression, has a great deal of stylistic devices to offer to the Islamic Novel and buttressed his argument by offering analysis of eleven novels he wrote over a ten-year period.

The Applied Linguistic Professor further stressed that the English Novel is the most flexible “of all literary forms, as it cannibalizes and mixes with other literary models, such as drama, epic, satire, history and tragedy,” adding that “being secular, investigative and suspicious of authority,

the English Novel is like science, portraying a secular empirical world by focusing on culture. It is self-authorizing, non-conformist and no longer depends on custom, mythology, religion or community.” “Rather,” he said, “it is a product of modernity, which is a period characterized by disagreement on fundamental values and beliefs fragmented and discordant – a period skeptical of all authoritarian claims to truth.”

Professor Kamal also said “the English novelist conveys fantasy rather than moral truths out of the belief that the ordinary reader delights in the exotic and extravagant, the monstrous and the miraculous. The writer selects, transposes, rearranges and edits and argues for change by compellingly dramatizing what is wrong,” adding that, these shortcomings of the English novel notwithstanding, “it provides a great deal of hints the Islamic Novel can draw on to do very much of a good job.”

The Professor said the Islamic Novel, on the other hand, “dwells on the major aspects of the Muslim life, ranging from history to science and politics to give an impression of the Muslim expression of impeccable manners.” He also said, “being communal and using revealed truths and wise sayings arguably mean that the Islamic Novel is written with the reader in mind.”

Be that as it may, the Islamic Novel adopts the narrative style, “literary” grammar, long and short sentences and the extended metaphor, as well as cooperative narration and proverbs for comprehensibility, creativity and legitimacy of presentation.

## **AZMAN President Abdulmunaf Yunusa Donates ₦5million to 100 Indigent Students**

Indigent students of Bayero University have received a boost from Alhaji Abdulmunaf Yunusa, the President of AZMAN Group, as the philanthropist doled out ₦5million to be distributed to 100 students at ₦50,000 each. Alhaji Yunusa also promised to make the donation an annual event as part of his company's corporate social responsibility (CSR).

Alhaji Yunusa, who handed the cheque to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR also, donated a brand new 18 – seater bus to the University, for the use of the new Centre of Qur'anic Studies. The event took place at the Convocation Arena, where the University Management organized a reception in honour of Alhaji Abdulmunaf Yunusa, who is a friend of the University for his immense contribution towards the socio-economic development of the country and also for his company's recent milestone, which is set to commence airline operations very soon.

Alhaji Yunusa also requested for a plot of land in BUK to build a filling station that would provide petrol, gas, and kerosene to the community.

The AZMAN Group President further tasked eminent businessmen and corporate organizations to assist towards improving the education sector, as government alone could not do it.

The Vice Chancellor expressed gratitude to Alhaji Yunusa Abdulmumin for the

goodwill gesture and said the University would continue to identify with him and his good works.

Professor Abubakar Rasheed said Alhaji Yunusa's sterling contributions towards socio-economic transformations have endeared him to be placed among distinguished Nigerian philanthropists and accolades have testified him as one of the foremost business entrepreneurs who made giant strides in the development of this country.

“Recently, Alhaji Abdulmunaf was awarded an honorary Doctoral Degree by Western Pacific University, U.S.A and the Leadership Newspaper recognized him as one of the nation's most foremost businessmen. Being a friend to the University, we are proud to be associated with you,” the Vice Chancellor said.

Prof. Rasheed added that “we are also aware that your company has purchased two aircrafts that arrived at Malam Aminu Kano International Airport (MAKIA). This intervention to commence airline operations will go a long way in reducing the hardships encountered by passengers flying the local routes and would bring succor to the aviation industry.”

On the need to provide a plot of land for AZMAN filling station, the Vice Chancellor said within this week the University would allocate a land for that purpose and thanked him for the gesture.

Prof. Rasheed told the AZMAN President that the ₦5 million Naira donated would be given to indigent students who are in dire need of help and said a committee to screen such students would comprise of former Vice Chancellors, Professor Sani

Zahradeen and Professor Dandatti Abdulkadir, Dr. A. B. Baffa and two other staff. He requested for the presence of Alhaji Abdulmunaf Yunusa at the future date where the scholarship cheques would be distributed.

The ceremony witnessed the presence of Professors, senior academics and senior non-teaching staff of the University alongside family members, friends and associates of the celebrant.

### **Salaries, Wages and Professional Incomes Are Zakkatable - Dr. Warshu**

A Senior lecturer in the Department of Islamic Studies and Shari'a, Bayero University, Kano, Dr. Warshu Tijjani Rabi, is of the opinion that earned incomes of individuals such as salaries, wages and professional emoluments are zakkatable items and the "poor due" should be deducted from such emoluments on a monthly basis.

Dr. Warshu's contentious opinion was contained in a paper entitled *The Legitimacy of Paying Zakah on Salaries and Professional Incomes*, (Views of the contemporary jurists) presented at the fortnight Seminar organized by the International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF), BUK, which took place on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2014.

The scholar, who personally admitted in the paper that Zakah on salaries and professional incomes has been a contentious matter among contemporary jurists, however stated that he chose to align with the views of those jurists who supported the idea of including earned

salaries among zakkatable items for their superior argument.

He argued that evidences and proof from the two divergent views for and against showed that those who stand for charging Zakah on salaries are much more likely to be on the right side, because of, according to him, the solid, virtuous and unshakable evidences they have provided had convinced him that charging zakah on salaries and the like is inevitable. Zakat is a tax of 2.5% paid on savings, capital and profit after a year, which must be above a certain minimum (nisab) that is currently about ₦714,000.00.

Dr. Warshu who quoted copiously from the Holy Qur'an and the Prophetic Hadiths to justify his stand, also shared with the participants the experiences of Sudan where he said Zakah is obligatory on the salaries, wages, rewards and retirement pensions of state's employees and the employees of other sectors.

He said the elapse of a year is not a condition for charging Zakah on salaries, saying that once the monthly incomes of the year were added together, if they amounted to the *nisab*, then Zakah is due. The Zakah of salaries in Sudan, he further explained, is paid in installments and deducted at the source by the employer on behalf of the Zakah Chamber/Commission.

The Senior lecturer also took time to explain the wisdom behind zakah legislation and said that its payment not only purifies personal wealth, "but also secures your property against the ambitious eyes and hands of criminals, protects the

society against illness and poverty and purifies the souls of meanness and miserliness and also cleanses the souls of the poor of envy and grudges.”

On the viability of implementing Zakah on salaries in Bayero University, Dr. Warshu suggested that the University should charge its Department of Islamic Studies and Shari’a together with IIBF to carry out the task, adding that the two units can establish an office whose mission would be to propagate and market the idea among both teaching and non-teaching staff of the University and then co-ordinate with the Bursary Department to commence deduction of Zakah from the salaries of those whose earnings have reached the *nisab* and have accepted the idea (with no compulsion, the practice being voluntary).

He said if the idea became fully accepted, then the two institutions should establish a Council of Trustees, which would supervise the collection, administration and disbursement of the collected amounts to the due beneficiaries in the University.

But, because of the divergent views expressed by the participants for and against the opinion of the paper presenter, the Chairman of the Seminar, Dr. Muazzam Maibushra, pointed to the organizers the need for another scholar who has a contrary opinion with the present to be given the opportunity to present a paper, so that the two divergent opinions could be dissected and debated with a view to reaching a common stand in the interest of all.
