



## **Private Bill on Zakkat to be Sent to Kano State House of Assembly- Emir of Kano**

A private bill that will empower Kano State Government to collect Zakkat from individuals will soon be presented to the state House of Assembly for consideration, Emir of Kano, Muhammadu Sanusi II, has announced.

He said the proposed bill was currently being put together and that as soon as it is ready, it would be forwarded to the Kano State lawmakers. He stated that the Committee on Social Reform jointly established by the Kano Emirate and Bayero University was working on the proposed bill which when considered and made into law would empower the government to collect Zakkat from individuals.

The Emir who was speaking at a Round Table Discussion organized by the committee on Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2016 at the BUK Senate Chamber said Allah (SWT) ordered government to do everything humanly possible to collect Zakkat from wealthy people.

He said, 'It is un-Islamic for government to fold its arms and allow people to do what they wanted, especially on issues of Zakkat.'

Other parts of the bill, according to Emir, it would give government power to collect and distribute Zakkat to eligible persons.

The Emir also disclosed that another bill on marriage issue would also be prepared and presented to the Kano State House of Assembly. This bill, he said, would go a long way towards

reducing cases of divorce in our society. He said part of the content of the bill was that it would make it necessary for a husband to follow certain strict rules/conditions before he divorced his wife.

On the work of the Committees, the Emir expressed dismay over the delay in discharging their duties, adding that 'this kind of Round Table Discussion will be holding quarterly to ensure speed in their work.'

In his remark, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, thanked the Emir for his concern about Bayero University. He also thanked the Emir for the warm reception accorded management staff of Bayero University when they visited him in his palace recently.

Professor Yahuza Bello thanked the Emir on behalf of University of Maiduguri for accepting to receive an honorary Doctorate Degree on Saturday, 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2016. "That is why it became necessary for us to postpone our convocation by one week to enable the good people of Kano State to join the Emir in receiving the degree." Professor Yahuza added. In support of the Committee, the Vice Chancellor announced the University's donation of five million naira to enable them to discharge their duties as expected.

Former Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR in his speech thanked the Emir of Kano for initiating the Social Reform Committee and involved Bayero University which according to him would assist the lecturers to put their researches into practice.

When presenting their different reports, Professor Kabir Yunusa of Zakkat Committee and Professor Abubakar Mustapha of Education Committee and Dr. Bashir Aliyu Umar of Marriage Affairs briefed the Emir on what they had done and promised to work hard to see that the target goal was achieved.

### **Induction: VC Commends CHS's Teamwork, Networking**

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has said the combined induction organised for the three Departments in the College of Health Sciences (CHS) was a milestone to showcase the attitudinal teamwork and networking that reign in the College and the University as a whole.

Professor Yahuza Bello, who was speaking on Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2016 at the induction ceremony of 3<sup>rd</sup> sets of Radiography, Physiotherapy and Medical Laboratory Science graduands, said in future all inductions for the professionals would be conducted in a day to further symbolise the spirit of teamwork that has been reigning in the University.

He said this year was the first time a combined induction was organised, thanking the three Registrars of the respective Councils/Boards who made it possible. Similarly, Maryam Dauda Usman collected all the awards from the Department of Medical Laboratory Science, which includes best pre-clinical student's award, best clinical student's award, best 1<sup>st</sup> professional examination's award (2014/2015), best final professional examination's award (2015/2016) and overall best student's award from the department.

Also, from the Department of Physiotherapy, Adua Kawthar Adenike collected three of the four awards of best student in pre-clinical, best student's award in clinical and overall best student's award of the Department, while Musbahu Aminu Usman collected the award of best student in project.

Furthermore, Zubaida S. Ya'u collected four of the five awards of the Radiography Department, which include best project award, best professional clinical award, best student's award in clinical examination and best final year student's award, while Maryam H. collected best overall graduating student's award of the Radiography Department.

In his address, Kano State Commissioner of Health, Dr. Kabiru Ibrahim Getso, said the state government had taken measures to ensure

efficient health delivery services in the state, part of which was the upgrade of Muhammad Abdullahi Wase Hospital, introduction of many schemes, provision of equipment to health centres and many other services to enhance healthcare delivery services in the state. He assured that the state government would continue to support Bayero University in its effort to succeed.

The Guest lecturer and Chief Medical Director of Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH), Prof. Aminu Zakari Mohammed, said Bayero University is one of the foremost universities in Nigeria that has been recognised worldwide.

He commended the Management of the University for the huge investment at the College of Health Science and urged the graduands to observe the ethics of their respective professions.

The new Provost of the College, Professor Sani Usman Alhassan, appealed to the Kano State Government to ensure that its hospitals and health centres were accredited for physiotherapy services.

The Registrar/CEO Medical Rehabilitation Therapist (Registration) Board, Akanle Olufunke T. told the graduands that their next one year of internship training was very critical to their career and must be taken seriously, urging them to be focused and determined to engage in some personal commitments and development.

Registrar/Chief Executive, Radiographers Registration Board of Nigeria, Michael S. Okpaleke, assured that the steady increase in the number of Radiographers from Bayero University and other institutions would defuse the acute manpower shortage in the north, urging the graduands to maintain good

relationship with their patients, especially the duty of confidentiality of patient's medical record.

The Registrar/Chief Executive officer of Medical Laboratory Science Council of Nigeria, O. F. Omotuyi, advised the graduands to key into the Compulsory Continuous Professional Development Programme (CPD) to enhance proficiency and remain updated in their profession and for licence renewal.

## **BUK has Zero Tolerance for Examination Misconduct**

The Dean, Faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology, Dr. Abdulwahab Lawal, has advised newly matriculated students against engaging in any form of examination malpractices, saying that Bayero University has zero tolerance for any form of examination misconduct and would not condone such negative tendencies.

Speaking at the Faculty's 2015/2016 orientation of fresh students and presentation of awards which took place at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, New Campus on Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2016, Dr. Abdulwahab also urged the fresh students to guard against the antics of bad friends who often mislead them, saying that the only solution to the above negative tendencies was for them to endeavour to live above board by obeying school rules and regulations as well as work hard.

He said character and good conduct were other very important attributes of serious and obedient students, adding "I urge you to justify the confidence your parents have on you by exhibiting good conduct."

The Dean disclosed that as from next academic session, the faculty would introduce best student awards as part of efforts to encourage academic competition among the students.

He said the purpose of the orientation was to acquaint new students with dos and don'ts as well as how to make the best use of campus life.

Dr. Abdulwahab said the faculty which has three departments, Computer Science, Information Technology and Software Engineering has a total of 1,325 undergraduate students with over 40 academic staff out of which about 20 are pursuing PhD programmes both at home and outside the country.

In his presentation, the Dean, Student Affairs, Professor Ismail Zango, represented by the Deputy Dean, Dr. Shamsudden Umar, took the students through the nitty-gritty of academic life including processes of securing bed space, participation in unionism, dress code as well as transportation to and from the two campuses of the university. He also revealed that as from next academic session, bed space application would be on line.

Speaking on social life on campus, Malam Mansur advised the students strongly against keeping company with bad friends, fighting, stealing, rape, and examination malpractices. He said all these mentioned vices carry serious punishment.

He urged them to work hard, be in company with serious and intelligent students who would help them academically and socialize as well as participate in various union activities, but that should not be at the expense of their academic activities.

Malam Mansur also said as part of efforts to discourage students from patronizing football viewing centres outside the campus, the

university had furnished common rooms available in most of the hostels for students to listen to news and watch football.

### **Physiotherapy Dept. Honours Three of its Staff**

## **Bayero University Remains Debt Free, Despite Monumental Developments - VC**

The monumental projects that have greatly expanded access and boosted teaching and research were undertaken without borrowing and Bayero University remains debt free, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Muhammad Yahuza Bello has declared.

He explained that past Vice Chancellors in BUK had been focused on raising funds from sources other than government, in order to develop facilities and equip them during their tenure, and even after their tenure, all those VCs in good health had been dedicating their time and energy to uplifting the status of the University.

Speaking on Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2016, during a breakfast radio programme *Barka da Hantsi*, on Radio Freedom, the Prof. Yahuza attributed the success so far achieved to fundraising efforts beginning with the launching of the endowment fund, generous donations from philanthropists, grants from Nigerian and foreign intervention agencies, as well as the hard work and

dedication to duty of staff and students of the University.

In response to the question from the host Ado Saleh Kankiya, on the measures in place to redress students complaints, including difficulty in transportation, the Vice Chancellor assured that robust and fair channels exist for student grievances, academic and otherwise to be handled. He explained that the reduction in commercial vehicles on the route, responsible for recent difficulties with movement of students between the campuses is caused by the national fuel shortage crisis.

Prof. Yahuza however assured that the administration welcomes investors who may wish to put more commercial vehicles on the student route, to complement the numerous vehicles provided by the University, once they follow due process and register. The Vice chancellor was skeptical about the possibility of changing lecture times, as this would negatively affect the academic calendar, rather he suggested that staff and students should set out earlier in view of the lower number of vehicles available, until the normalcy returns.

Other issues covered by the hour long interview include the essence of having a staggered 32<sup>nd</sup> Convocation coming up between 20<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2016, spread over four days, to allow students and their families celebrate their achievements with their teachers in a relaxed atmosphere.

## GUIDE TO BETTER GRAMMAR

### Commonly Misused Expressions (2)

This week, we shall examine a few more expressions that are commonly misused by all categories of people in this great country. Your observations are welcome.

- John and myself did not embrace ourselves.

There are two noticeable grammatical blunders in this sentence. The first is 'myself'. The word 'myself' is referred to as *first person reflexive pronoun*. It is used when the object of a verb or preposition refers to the same person as the subject of the verb. Study the following examples:

- I didn't enjoy **myself** very much.*
- Of all the people I am critical of, I am most critical of **myself**.*

In the two examples above, you will realize that 'I' is the antecedent of 'myself'.

What is 'antecedent'? In English grammar, antecedent is a word or phrase that a subsequent word refers to. 'Binta' is the antecedent of 'her' in the following sentence:

- "I'll give this to Binta if I see **her**."*

Let us go back to 'John and myself...' If I ask you: what is the antecedent of 'myself'? Clearly it has no antecedent. That is why it is incorrect English to say 'John and myself...' Say, correctly: *John and I*

The second blunder is the pronoun 'ourselves'. When you say 'John and I did not embrace ourselves', you are saying 'John did not embrace himself and I did not embrace myself.' How reasonable could that be? Study the correct sentence:

- John and I did not embrace **each other**.*

Similarly, it is incorrect English to say: 'I and my brother lost the fight.' Say, correctly:

- My brother and I lost the fight.*

Note that when you speak about yourself and

others, mention yourself last, as in:

f. *Prof. Jo, Sister Ann and I are studying English.*

- I can be able to solve the problem.

This is another commonly misused expression. The sentence contains a linguistic redundancy (the redundant repetition of a meaning in a sentence, using different words). In this case ‘can’ and ‘be able to’ have the same meaning. Please avoid saying/writing ‘can be able’. Say, correctly:

- I can solve the problem.*
- I will be able to solve the problem.*

- Hajiya’s whereabouts is unknown.

The problem word here is ‘whereabout’. It is unknown in the English language. What we know is **whereabouts**, which may be used either as a noun or as an adverb, as in:

- Hajiya’s whereabouts is unknown.*
- Could you give us any information regarding the whereabouts of your brother?*

In the two examples, ‘whereabouts’ is used as a noun, meaning ‘location of somebody’. Now study the following sentences:

- Do you know whereabouts the hotel is?*
- I’ve forgotten whereabouts I parked my car.*
- Whereabouts did you find it?*

In examples (c), (d) and (e), ‘whereabouts’ is used as an adverb, meaning ‘in what place’ (where).

It should be noted that in British English ‘whereabouts’ may also take a plural verb. In other words it is correct to say/write:

f. *Hajiya’s whereabouts are unknown.*

- Tom submitted a fake Masters degree to the authorities.

The expression ‘Masters degree’ is a common mistake in English. Note that the correct expression is **Master’s degree** (in both American and British English), as in:

- Tom submitted a fake Master’s degree to the authorities.*
- He holds a bachelor’s degree in physics.*

Please note the *apostrophe s* (’s) in the two

examples. Note: capital letter ‘M’; small letter ‘b’.  
PLURAL: **Master’s degrees; bachelor’s degrees.**  
Please do not take things for granted. When in doubt, consult the dictionary.
