BUK Shines at Universities Staff Games 2016

Wins Football Trophy, Gets Medals in Badminton and Table Tennis

ayero University has won the prestigious football trophy of the Nigerian Universities Staff Association (NUSSA) Games hosted by the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN) played in Kaduna between 8th and 16th December, 2016.

Bayero University defeated University of Jos 3-1 in the final of the soccer event thus crowned the new champions of NUSSA football category.

Joseph Goeshalong gave the Unijos an early lead when he tapped in a simple finish at the expense of BUK's defensive blunder, however, ten minutes after, Rabi'u Mohammed Sagir made a superlative pass to Abdulmajid Mohammed, who rounded Unijos goalkeeper to score a fantastic goal that restored BUK's hopes.

Two minutes after the equalizer, Murtala Garba received an inch- perfect pass from the majestic midfielder, Isa Jibrin (Rabah Madjer) to score a superb goal and put BUK into a driving seat.

At the resumption of the second stanza, Unijos mounted pressure on BUK team

searching for an equalizer but the water- tight defense marshaled by Umar Lazy thwarted all efforts and the introduction of talismanic and physical Sulaiman Garba in the midfield made the situation worse for the Josites.

Midway into the second half, it was another celebration galore for Bukites as Murtala Garba scored his 2nd goal of the match and the 4th in the tournament to give BUK a comfortable 3-1 lead.

Enroute to the historic trophy win Bayero University beat Federal University, Lokoja 1-0, thrashed Delta State

University 4-0 and walloped IBB University Lapai 2-0 in the quarter final. At the semi-final, BUK escaped by the whiskers following a narrow defeat of the host University 5-4 in the penalty shootout after the match ended 1-1.

Bayero University also won Gold medal at the male single in Badminton, as Shehu Abdullahi became the talk of the town when he hammered all his opponent universities by two straight wins in each match to qualify



for the final. In the final, he defeated the University of Ilorin, the defending champions of NUSSA, to be crowned the new champion of Badminton single and wrote the name of Bayero University in gold.

Similarly, Bayero University won bronze medals in table tennis and badminton mixed doubles.

The Director of Sports, Professor Rabiu Mohammed, expressed appreciation to the Vice Chancellor for the support in terms of sports development. He described the BUK's success as the will of God.

CQS Marks International Day of the Arabic Language

he Centre for Qur'anic Studies in conjunction with the Egyptian Centre for Cultural and Educational Affairs of the Egyptian Embassy held a two-day International Conference as part of the activities marking this year's International Day of the Arabic Language. The occasion took place on Monday 19th December, 2016 at Theatre F, Faculty of Earth and Environmental Science (New Campus).

The United Nations had set aside the 18th of every December as International Day of the Arabic Language.

In his address, Egyptian Consul-General, Dr. Ibrahim Abdulbasit, urged the Muslim Ummah to endeavour to learn the Arabic language as doing that would enable proper understanding of the Islamic religion.

He said the Holy Qur'an, which was revealed to Prophet Muhammad (SAW), was in Arabic. Therefore, understanding Arabic, especially by the adherents of Islam was a plus and a quick route to the proper understanding of the religion.

The Consul-General commended Bayero University, Kano for establishing a Centre for Qur'anic Studies, saying that he wished the university would enter into collaboration with similar centres in Egypt for the purpose of the cross fertilization of ideas and experiences for the benefit of the two countries.

Also speaking, the guest speaker, Professor Sammani Sani, who is the Director Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages & Folklore, said it had become necessary for the Hausa people, who are predominantly Muslims, to learn the Arabic language, adding that it was the only way for proper understanding of the Our'an, including its recitation and *tafsir*.

He said Sciences today, including Medicine and Engineering were being taught in Arabic, adding that 'we in the Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages & Folklore are currently working to translate the holy Qur'an into Hausa language. We want to request the assistance and support of the Centre for Qur'anic Studies in that regard.'

The Director of CQS, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad, expressed appreciation to the Egyptian government for the confidence it has on the Centre and BUK, adding that currently BUK and the Centre were into collaborating with some Institutions in Egypt and hoped that such collaboration would be sustained.

Countries that participated in the conference included: Turkey, Sudan, Chad, Niger, Egypt and the host country, Nigeria.

Professor Abdallah Conferred with Igbo Chieftaincy Title

he Chairman of the Enugu State Council of Traditional Rulers and Chancellor, National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), HRH, the Egwe, Eze Ogbunechendo of Ezema Olo, Ambassador Lawrence O. C. CDA Conducts 2nd International Conference on Drylands

cholars from different parts of the world gathered at the 2nd International Conference on Drylands organized by the Centre of Dryland Agriculture, Bayero University, Kano to discuss and deliberate on agricultural diversification with a view to fine-tuning sustainable strategies to address food insecurity in the drylands of the sub-Saharan Africa.

At the opening ceremony on Tuesday, 13th December, 2016, the Director of the Centre, Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin, who delivered the opening remarks, said the CDA was promoting the sustainable use of the fragile natural resources of the drylands through the training of high level manpower that would work in the private sector, as well as various agricultural research, training and development organizations to address the problems and realize available opportunities.

"The research activities of the centre are interdisciplinary, focusing on climate change and the dryland cropping and animal production environment aimed at understanding complexities of the interaction," he said.

In his welcome address, the Chairman of the Local Organizing Committee, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, said the increasingly serious situation relating to climate

change and the global decline of water resources had amplified the enormity of global food crises that several global efforts were being made to address the issues that related to these. He added that in Africa, "we believe in collective approach and we are here to collectively present our efforts that focus efficient water use, water conservation and general agricultural challenges in the global drylands."

Declaring the conference open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammd Yahuza Bello, said the gathering of scholars, administrators, policy makers, practitioners, investors and other stakeholders in the field of agriculture and related discipline was again to address critical issues of agricultural development.

The Vice Chancellor explained that the 2nd International Conference taking place within two months after the earlier one showed the commitment of Bayero University in advancing the course of sustainable development through training and research in diverse fields of human endeavor.

Delivering a keynote address titled: "The End of Diversification? Current Trends in Dryland Research," Professor Mike Mortimore of Drylands Research, U.K.

said, despite an increasingly sophisticated understanding of dryland environments and societies, the uses now being made of the diversification concept in parts of Asia exhibited many of the shortcomings of the earlier work done in Africa. He said it took scientists more than decades to transform a perceived desertification crisis in the Sahel into a non-event.

Also speaking at the occasion, the Australian High Commissioner to Nigeria, Mr. Paul Lehman, likened Nigeria to Australia in terms of politics, climatic change and socio-cultural differences. He called for effective institutional collaborations to address the food crisis.

There were goodwill messages from Professor Jesse Njoka, the Director, African Drylands Institute for Sustainability, University of Nairobi, Kenya, Prof Issouffou Amadou from the Department of Crop Production, University of Maradi, Professor Dauda Kone

from University of Cote d' Ivoire and a representative of ICRISAT, Dr. Hakeem Ajeigbe.

In a communiqué issued at the end of the conference, it was recommended that there was the need for greater coordination, partnership and collaboration among all the stakeholders in crops and livestock production in the formulation and implementation of policies and programmes directed at increasing agricultural resilience and productivity.

The communiqué called for increased research and innovation on water and soils management as a key driver for the sustainable production of crops and livestock, as well as for the mitigation of the impact of climate change.

The conference was themed "Agricultural Diversification: A Panacea to Food Insecurity."

CBN Donates Books to BUK

ayero University, Kano has concluded plans to create a "Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Corner" in the Departmental Library of the Economics Department amidst the collection of 373 books donated by the bank.

Presenting the books to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, on Thursday, 15th December, 2016, in his office, the Director, Monetary Policy Department, CBN, Mr. M. K. Tule, said the decision to create such a corner was commendable given the new policies and concepts that are being reviewed and contested periodically by the bank.

Representative of the Director and Principal Economist at the CBN, Dr. Umar N. Bida, said creating a special corner in the library would enable CBN to showcase its publications in BUK. He added that the books would help the academia to bridge the existing gap in the scholarly environment, apart from effective collaboration in terms of training and research.

Mr. Tule said the collections of the publications were

sourced from the various departments of the CBN such as the Monetary Department, Financial Market Department, Research Department, Banking Supervision Department, Banking and Payments Department as well as other Departments of the bank.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, commended CBN for providing such credible resources of different volumes of books. He appealed for additional books for use in the Central Library.

Professor Yahuza Bello said the first intervention from the CBN had come to the University in a big way and in terms of a massive structure, the Centre of Excellence, which if completed will serve as a big resource to the University.

The Head of Economics Department, Dr. Ahmad Muhammad Tsauni, said that part of the intention for the request of the books was to create the CBN Corner in the Department of Economics in addition to updating the knowledge of both staff and students.

Only Accredited Varsities Approved for Studies – A & PC

This is to inform University Staff that the Appointments and Promotions Committee at its 167th meeting held on Tuesday, 20th December, 2016 approved that any staff intending to go for further studies should seek for admission only in a recognized University which is accredited by the National Universities Commission. Staff should also note that the duration for a full-time B.Sc degree programme in Nursing is four (4) years or

five (5) years depending on the mode of entry, while the duration of a part-time B.Sc Nursing Programme is 6-7 years depending on the mode of entry as the case may be and that the degree has no classification.

A statement signed by the Registrar, Hajiya Fatima Binta Mohammed, said likewise, all those seeking for employment with a B.Sc degree in Nursing should note the above.

Management Warns Against Late Coming, Truancy

The management of the University has frowned against truancy and late coming to duty post by the staff.

"It has come to the attention of the Registrar that many of the staff abstain from duty for days or come to work late without permission".
