## NOTAP to Establish Intellectual Property Centre in BUK

he National Office for Technology Acquisition and Promotion (NOTAP) has planned to establish its centre in Bayero University, Kano as part of its drive to entrench intellectual property initiative.

The Director of the Centre, Dr. D.M Ibrahim made this known at the 2<sup>nd</sup> National Conference ACIcon 2016 on Bridging the Gap between Academia and Industry in Nigeria: Refocusing the Engineering Discipline.

He said there were 38 intellectual property centres in Nigeria and that because of the strategic importance of Bayero University, there was the need to establish such a centre, in the institution.

The DG, who was the chairman of the occasion, explained that, the conference came at no better time when the world economy is driven by knowledge and the developed economies depend largely on research and technology. He said the economic recession and the continuous fall in the price of crude oil has provided unlimited opportunities for intellectuals to explore various means of revamping the economy through intellectual property.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who declared the conference open and represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, said the University management has, over the years, been proactive in supporting research engagements, built infrastructures and developed capacities as part of its strategic objectives.

"Bayero University is aware of the importance of the role Engineering played in narrowing the gap between academia and industry despite constraints, which 'we hope this conference is aimed at addressing such obstacles," he said.

Earlier in his welcome remarks, the Chairman of the Local Organizing Committee, Professor S.S Adamu, said the National Engineering Conference is an annual event organized by the Faculty of Engineering, which provides the opportunity for researchers, engineers, technologists and policy makers to discuss and deliberate on topical national issues that affect Engineering. He challenged the policy makers to use the outcome of the conference in solving some of the issues affecting Nigeria especially with this current economic recession, for national development.

Professor Adamu further expressed appreciation to all the members of the local organizing committee, staff and students of the Faculty as well as reviewers all over the world for giving their assessment on the papers presented.

## Asymmetry Occurs in All Human Bodies, By Mustapha Gide Including the Most Beautiful Girls – University Don

Senior Lecturer and Head of Anatomy Department, College of Health Sciences, Bayero University, Dr. Anas I. Y., has said that asymmetry or differences in human parts occur everywhere in the body, including faces, and all the three types of asymmetry may co-exist in the face or elsewhere.

Dr. Anas of the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, while presenting his lecture titled, "The Beauty or the Best Choice? A Study of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Hausa Facial Models,"

as part of the lecture series being rotated among Faculties of College of the Health Sciences, said differences in the sizes of human parts even among the most beautiful girls is inevitable, no matter how negligible. He said that people everywhere wanted to possess anything of beauty, especially to have a beautiful woman, car, house, etc.

Dr. Anas, identified parts of the human body used to judge "beauty" and included the face as one of them. He noted that the face was a medium of identity; it tells whether one is young or old, in good mood or in a bad mood. He quoted a Hausa adage, "Labarin zuciya a tambayi fuska," meaning. "The mood of somebody's face is the reflection of his heart."

He said that girls assess boys by looking at their faces just as boys assess the girls they love through the assessment of their faces. He, however, said once you noticed difference in the size of the eyes of your girlfriend, you could say that she was asymmetric. He said all human faces were asymmetric because facial

asymmetry existed in all faces, including the most beautiful on earth, whether girls' or boys'.

The University Don opined that attractive faces had a lot of benefits, including being treated more positively, because they were not denied access to places or favour. They got higher grades in universities and colleges; they were frequently sought as allies for friendships and received lesser punishment in school; they were more quickly employed, they had long life and possessed



reproductive success, etc.

The presenter said he conducted the study with the aim to quantify the facial asymmetry of the Hausa population, so that it may help in the drastic reduction of the number of divorce in Kano and everywhere. He said the lecture was based on anthological perspective.

#### What are the complications of typhoid fever?

- When typhoid fever is not treated promptly and effectively, the following may
- The most serious complication of typhoid fever is intestinal bleeding or holes (perforation), which usually occurs at the second or third week of infection, if not treated properly.
- There may be an inflammation of the heart muscle (Myocarditis).
- There may be an inflammation of the lining of the heart and valves (endocarditis).
- Pneumonia may occur more, especially in children below the age of twelve (12).
- Inflammation of the pancreas (pancreatitis) may occur.
- Kidney and bladder infections can occur.
- Psychiatric problems such, as delirium, hallucinations and paranoid psychosis, can occur temporarily
