BUK's CICID, a Milestone to Recovering Nigeria from Emptiness **- DR. USMAN BUGAJE**

A one-time Political Adviser to the former Vice President Atiku Abubakar, Dr Usman Muhammad Bugaje, has implored the Centre for Islamic Civilisation and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID), Bayero University, to link up with sister centres in Malaysia, Turkey and other notable countries in order to bring about ideas that would recover Nigeria from emptiness.

Dr. Usman Bugaje, a former Member of the House of Representatives and a former Secretary General, Action Congress of Nigeria, said the Nigerian society was lost and empty in view of the unpredictable atrocities being committed, thereby pushing the country into a serious mess.

Speaking while presenting a paper on Inter- Civilisation Dialogue on Wednesday 13th January, 2016 at the Conference Hall of the Centre for Information Technology (CIT), Bayero University, Kano he said the University had done very well in creating the Centre.

He lamented that the norms and values that keep Nigeria as a single entity and a decent society were no longer there. This must be restored for a greater future, adding that the loss in the sense of justice and

discipline and the disconnection between knowledge and character, as well as the spread of immorality through the social media, are a great threat to the country, he added.

He said Muslims were supposed to be the models in exploring the potential of Islamic Civilisation and, as such, they must go beyond the material culture of the West and instead should consider the norms and values designed by Islam for the human society to exist comfortably.

Dr. Bugaje said Islamic Civilisation had been the best when compared with the Asian, the Western and the Chinese civilizations, amongst others, because it was driven by human values. Man needed a reason to exist and this had been taken care of in Islamic Civilisation, he said.

Dr. Bugaje expressed concern that in human civilisation, the environment is the host but Western civilisation created a path that destroys human beings and the environment. Global warming, smog, bombs and other problems created by it had become a threat to humanity, he added.

He however, said that as far as Nigeria was concerned, there were other problems, such as desert encroachment, which needed a clear policy because it was something that could not be allowed with the environment being the host “We have to be harmonious with nature and we have to go into dialogue,” he said.

He said the institution of the family was facing a great threat because of Western civilisation, citing the menace of same sex marriages and other anomalies brought about by Western culture. Also, parental values were no longer there because mothers and fathers go work at the time when the children go to school and when they return they all turn to television and social media, making it impossible for parents to have a meeting point with their children to inculcate the rightful values to them.

“We cannot also prosper until we as Muslims, do intra-religious dialogue to be able to bring issues, articulate them and come into dialogue, because

there are many issues the society do not have consensus about.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Saddiq Isah Radda, said the Management would pay more attention to facilitate activities in the centre, just as the Chairman of the occasion, Alhaji Bashir Usman Tofa, said the topic was timely, as it introduced the means towards resolving conflicts.

The Director of the Centre, Dr. Bashir Aliyu Umar, disclosed that it had series of events to conduct on Islamic Civilisation and dialogue in 2016, commending the Vice Chancellor for facilitating the discussion. He announced 13th February, 2016, as date for the next lecture:

Staff who wish to retire voluntarily can also forward their notice of voluntary retirement to the Registrar within the above mentioned period.

Affected staff are to forward photocopy of the document to the pension Secretary, also within the above mentioned period.

Security Division: Fire Safety Inspection & Risk Assessment of Public & Private Building in Kano Jigawa By Federal Fire Service

Reference: Circular SGF/OP/S.3/IX/331 dated 8th May, 2012.

The Federal Fire Service has been mandated to commence the enforcement of Fire Safety Regulation in Public and Private building in accordance with Fire Service Act (1963), National Fire Safety Code (2011) vide Federal Executive Council approval and circular reference No. SGF/OP/S.3/IX/331 dated 8th May, 2012. Consequently, the officers from Policy Regulatory and Inspectorate Department of the Federal Fire Service are scheduled to conduct a comprehensive risk assessment of BUK premises for a period of 2 weeks, as follows:

- a) New Campus – Monday, 18th January – Friday, 22nd January (0800-1600hrs)
- b) Old Campus – Monday, 25th January – Friday, 29th January (0800-1600hrs)

The inspection is aimed at ascertaining the adequacy of the fighting equipment in the campuses and the suitability and effectiveness of the equipment and visible hazard within the University campuses. The inspection will also include an assessment of the appropriate muster point and the need for fire safety/awareness training and other fire safety

related issues. The team of inspectors grouped into 3 batches will be accompanied and guided by the University Fire and Safety personnel from the Security Department.

A letter signed by the Director Security, Col. A. A. Mohammed (Rtd), said efforts are being made to ensure minimum disruption to normal University routine programme. In view of the foregoing, it is requested that all Departments, Units, Development sites, Offices, etc should assist the team to conduct a hitch-free inspection within the University environment.
