CDA Holds Three-Day Training Workshop on Cropping Systems Analysis

A Three-Day Training Workshop with the theme "Cropping Systems Analysis of Smallholder Agriculture" opened at the Conference Room of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture of Bayero University on Monday, 30th May, 2016.

The Workshop was organized by the Centre for Dryland Agriculture in partnership with International Crop Research Institute for Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT).

Speaking shortly before he declared the training workshop open, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed satisfaction with the level of activities going on at the Centre, and challenged other Research Centres in the university to take their cue from CDA.

He said because of the spate of activities coupled with the centre's commitment in research, the university decided to build a new befitting Centre for the CDA which he said was nearing completion.

The Vice Chancellor welcomed the resource persons and commended participants for sparing their public holidays to attend the training workshop, saying that "this has gone to show that you have attached great importance to the training workshop."

Professor M. Y. Bello urged the participants to make the best use of the opportunity and acquire additional knowledge in Cropping Systems analysis which would be very useful to them. He wished them fruitful sessions.

Earlier, Director of the CDA, Professor Jibrin Muhammad Jibrin, had told the Vice Chancellor that the training workshop was organized by the Centre in partnership with ICRISAT as part of efforts to key into the global trend which is shifting towards streamlining research activities.

Professor Jibrin told the participants that 'this training workshop on cropping systems analysis of smallholder agriculture will provide you with background theory and applied experience to build on your existing cropping systems modeling knowledge and interpretation,' adding that skills learnt would be useful when designing new cropping systems or ex-ante analysis of altering technology on resource constraints and adaptation to changing climate.

'Your understanding and application in crop systems modeling and abilities to interpret outputs will be improved, resulting in aiding more informed decisions on cropping systems responses.'

He said young crop of scientists/researchers were the target which was why in the training workshop, there was a blend of participants - students and lecturers.

He thanked the Vice Chancellor for all the support and encouragement extended to the Centre which he said had gone a long way towards encouraging them to continue to do their best for the development of the Centre.

In his address, the Country Representative of ICRISAT, Dr. Hakeem Ajeigbe, said the training workshop would be quite valuable and that there was need to disseminate/share skills and knowledge with colleagues, hence the decision to jointly convene the training workshop.

Participants to the three-day training workshop included students and some selected lecturers.

Yoruba Community Council Drums Support for VC, Seeks Partnership with BUK

The Yoruba Community Council in Kano has thrown its weight behind the administration of Vice Chancellor Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello for a successful leadership that will entrench massive transformation and academic excellence.

Speaking during a courtesy call on Thursday, 26th May, 2016, the leader of the council, Alhaji Abdul'aziz Fa'izu said it became pertinent for Yoruba Council to partner with Bayero University because of the paramount importance of education in the socio-economic development of the country and assured the University management of its support and cooperation.

The leader eulogized the former Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, for transforming the University, praying that Professor Yahuza Bello would surpass that achievement.

He said Bayero University maintained cordial relationship with Yoruba because the first and second Chairmen of the Governing Council, Alhaji Saburi O. Biobaku, and Professor (Chief) R.A Akinola were Yoruba whose contributions and sacrifices contributed immensely towards building the University.

Prof. Bello added that the University has some prominent scholars who are recognized worldwide for their scholastic accomplishments, citing Professor Emmanuel Olofin and Professor J.A Falola, among others.

The Vice Chancellor said even though the University had been admitting Yoruba people irrespective of where they come from, he assured the Council that it would consider its request subject to passing admission criteria. He added that due to excessive competition in some courses, the University may not admit all the candidates but would ensure that a substantial number is admitted even if it means into other courses they did not apply.

8th Annual Late Cpt. Ismail Yadudu Liver Disease Workshop Holds on 4th June, 2016

The Capt. Ismail Yadudu Foundation, the AKTH Departments of Medicine and BUK Department of Community Medicine, have finalized arrangements to hold this year's workshop and community outreach on 4th June 2016 at Kofar Fada, Dawakin. Kudu, commencing at 9.00am, Professor A.H. Yadudu, Chairman, Board of Trustees has said in a statement. Members of the University Community and the general public are cordially invited.

The workshop will consist of a Lecture in Hausa aimed at public enlightenment to be delivered by Prof. M.M. Borodo, free screening for viral hepatitis B and C and a community outreach to provide free medical consultations and simple medications to the local community. This year children under the age of 5 years are the target. The AKTH management, in collaboration with above-mentioned partners, has agreed to provide a follow up referral visit to AKTH to all patients who have tested positive for the hepatitis B or C on a free registration. Similarly, the organizers have

increased the number of patients to be given free screening from the previous annual maximum of 250 to as many as 2000 depending on the turn out. The Main Theme of this year's workshop is: **HALTING THE SPREAD OF LIVER DISEASES** with two sub-themes (a) Improving the Survival of Under Five Children and (b) Early Detection as Key to Prevention of Liver Diseases.

To facilitate for wider dissemination of information and engender greater public awareness, some of the lectures will be given in Hausa. There will be interactive sessions via radio phone-in programmes to be hosted by professionals.

Within the past five years of commencing its activities and in furtherance of its other stated objectives, the Foundation has disbursed loans totaling over the sum of N2,500,900.00 (two million, five hundred thousand Naira) to about 120 needy women in Kano, Dawakin Kudu, Katsina and Funtua. It has also built, contributed towards the maintenance of and outsourced the management of the Capt. Ismail Yadudu Islamiyya School, Masanawa, Katsina. In addition, it has drilled and regularly maintained boreholes which serve various communities in Kano and Katsina. In partnership with AKTH, the Foundation makes financial contribution to facilitate the holding of the above-named annual workshops and the provision of free screening for HBV/HCV Viral Hepatitis.

Drivers Move Nigeria's Economy

The Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) has described the paramount importance of drivers as movers and shakers of Nigeria's economy.

The Deputy Commandant of FRSC, Kano State, A.T. Muhammad gave the hint at a one-day training for the University Drivers organized by the Management of Bayero University, Kano on Saturday, 28th May, 2016.

The Deputy Commandant said 90% of the country's economy was being transported by road, hence there was need to pay maximum attention to the driving profession.

He expressed dismay that despite the importance of the driving profession, Nigerian drivers were involved resulted in unfortunate frequent accidents.

The Deputy Commandant urged drivers to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations guiding the profession in order to minimize the rate of accidents to the barest minimum.

On his part, the Public Relations Officer of FRSC, Kabir Ibrahim Daura, advised drivers to be effective and defensive so as to protect the lives and property of the country.

He further cautioned them to respect traffic related laws and regulations and apply to journey management risk assessment, and avoid using intoxicating drugs and expired tyres.

The Registrar, Fatima Binta Mohammed, who was represented by the Director, General Administration, Alhaji Sabo Mijinyawa, commended the University Management for organizing the capacity building training for drivers which he said would further promote the reputation of Bayero University.

The Deputy Registrar, Human Resource, Hajiya Anisatu Uwais, who was the coordinator of the exercise, said it was part of the policy of the new Management towards motivating the workers as well as building their career.

GUIDE TO BETTER GRAMMAR

Common Mistakes in Subject-Verb Agreement (4)

Our lesson this week is a continuation from where we stopped last week. Study the following and try to identify the agreement blunders in the sentences:

- “In the last couple of months, the myriad of reform policies initiated by the Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), have been somewhat unfriendly to the average Nigerian.”

There is a problem of agreement here. In other words, there is no *agreement* between the subject (‘the myriad of reform policies’) and the verb (‘have been’). Yes, this has flouted one of the rules of grammatical *concord* (agreement of subject and verb) as we discussed in our previous lessons. The *headword* in the subject of the sentence is ‘myriad’, a singular noun; the phrase ‘of reform policies’ does not affect it.

Note also that the comma after ‘CBN’ is uncalled for and should be deleted. This is simply because a comma must not be used between a *subject* and its *predicate*.

Correct: *In the last two years, the myriad of reform policies initiated by the Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) **has been** somewhat unfriendly to the average Nigerian.*

- “Sir, a large number of policemen has encircled Femi Fani-Kayode’s residence.”

The sentence is incorrect because there is no agreement between the *subject* (‘a large number of’) and the *auxiliary verb* (‘has’). We discussed this extensively last week, didn’t we?

Correct: *Sir, a large number of policemen **have encircled** Femi Fani-Kayode’s residence.*

- “He said the president together with his cabinet were responsible for the ongoing spate of violence across the Niger Delta.”

This sentence seems right, but it isn’t. It is incorrect because it violates *subject-verb* agreement. This kind of sentence may be tricky even to good writers. Note that the *subject* of the sentence is ‘president’. The phrase ‘together with his cabinet’ does not in any way affect the number of the subject.

Correct: *He said the president together with his cabinet **was** responsible for the ongoing spate of violence across the Niger Delta.*

Correct: *He said the president and his cabinet **were** responsible for the ongoing spate of violence across the Niger Delta.*

- “I would like to thank **every** Nigerian man, woman and child who have worked with me.”

The plural verb ‘have’ is incorrect in the context. It defies the *rule of agreement* between *subject* and *verb*. It should be noted that the word ‘every’ is used with a singular *verb*. In other words, **every**, like **each**, is always used with a *singular noun form* and a *singular verb form*. This is because we are counting the things or people that we are talking about **separately**, one by one. Study the following sentences:

1. *Every child in the class **plays** a musical instrument.*
2. *Every instrument belonging to the school **is tuned** regularly.*
3. *I would like to thank every Nigerian man, woman and child who **has** worked with me.*

- “The legal profession is traditionally conservative and many of the early lawyers, became allies of the colonial administration.”

This is a good example of a *compound sentence* (a sentence containing two or more clauses that can stand independently; the clauses are often linked by a conjunction, which is sometimes preceded by a comma). My only concern is the comma after ‘lawyers’. Let’s break the *compound sentence* into two *simple sentences*:

The legal profession **is** traditionally conservative.

Many of the early lawyers, **became** allies of the colonial administration.

It is incorrect to place a comma between a *subject* and its *predicate*, as shown in the second sentence. Simply delete the comma.

Correct: *The legal profession is traditionally conservative, and many of the early lawyers became allies of the colonial administration.* (Note the comma after ‘conservative’.)
