he Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has challenged researchers, intellectuals, religious clerics and other stakeholders to use their vast knowledge and experience to inculcate the spirit of waqf endowment in the minds of the people and institutions.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking on Tuesday, 15th November, 2016 at the opening ceremony of the 1st Kano Waqf International Conference held at the Mahmud Tukur Theatre B, Old Campus with the theme: philanthropic individuals and organizations.

"The University's pursuit of knowledge has shown that Islamic support and upliftment of human development transcends religious and spiritual spheres to cover other aspects of human temporal and mundane life, including intellectual, social, economic and political endeavors. The institution of Waqf is an eloquent and clear testimony to Islam's concern for human development and welfare rooted in benevolence, compassion and humanity," the Vice Chancellor said.

Waqf Based Philanthropy in Northern Nigeria Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow organized by Islamic Law Department, Faculty of Law in collaboration with the Khairat Islamic Trust and the Sa'adiyya Waqf Foundation. He said the conference was being held at the right time when emphasis was being placed on the development of the person and the society.

The Vice Chancellor explained that human and societal developments could not be achieved through the efforts of government alone, saying that support was required from all the segments of the society, including

a q f institutions with all the necessary means in terms of recognition, development, security, legal protection and regulation to ensure their s m o o t h management operations for the benefit of the people. The keynote

speaker, Dr. Yahaya Ibrahim, from the Islamic University, Medina, who was represented by Dr. Na'if Ibn Yusuf, traced the history of waqf to the ancient Islamic era when Muslims of poor background relied heavily on wagf for their livelihood. He said wagf was done for the sake of Allah and that it was given to recognized persons, group of persons and institutions.

In his remark, the Dean of Faculty of Law, Dr. Mamman Lawan Yusufari, said the conference touched the lives of people, particularly Muslims, saying that, according to the United Nations, Nigeria was one of the poorest countries in the world despite being endowed with abundant human and natural resources. He added that statistics had shown that the poverty level was higher in the Northern part of the country than of its Southern counterpart.

The Dean explained that Islam encourages social services through the institutionalization of zakat, *waqf* and alms giving. He frowned at the situation in the north where poverty had remained high despite the abundance of rich people.

Three-Day Retreat Organized by Bayero Business School

Academic Planning, Professor Bala S. Aliyu and Mr. Andrew Thorburn, a consultant with DFID in Nigeria.

Highlights of the activities at the retreat included two (2) interactive sessions, three (3) paper presentations, one work station on curriculum/course outlines review and outdoor activities at Murtala Muhammed Square. The two interactive sessions dealt with an overview and renewal of the learning process at BBS and a break-out brainstorming session, while the three (3) paper presentations were on re-energizing BBS research capability through functional research team; fostering functional research in business/investment environment-the imperative of triple helix; and the changing dynamics of learning, research and knowledge exchange in business schools.

Resolutions

At the end of the retreat, the following resolutions, among many others, were reached:

1. The University Management and the Management of BBS should ensure that the environment around the BBS is made very attractive through good landscaping, planting flowers and regular good

environmental cleanliness.

- Workshops, symposia, seminars and round-table discussions should be organized fortnightly with a view to keeping students abreast of new developments in their areas of specialization.
- 3. Program Coordinators should ensure that the



venues assigned for lectures are adequate to accommodate students in each course, so as to provide a conducive atmosphere for effective teaching and learning and the cross-fertilization of ideas.

- 4. The University Management and the Management of BBS should liaise with the Dangote Foundation on the need to provide state of the art teaching and learning facilities, including computers, interactive boards, multi-media projectors, comprehensive elearning facilities, teleconference facilities, electronic bill boards, an alternative source of power (solar, inverters or standby generators) and other audio-visual aids teaching facilities at the Business School, so as to make BBS one of the World Class business schools in Africa and beyond.
- 5. The University should provide a functional website and uninterrupted internet services, which will permit the online real time interaction between lecturers and their students, as well as permit easy uploading and downloading of lecture materials, assignments, tutorials and other relevant information with the ultimate aim of enhancing the virtual image and ranking of the University.

Guideline for Maternity Leave: Reminder

his is to remind all female staff in the University who are eligible for maternity leave that applications must be submitted not less than two months to their Expected Date of Delivery (EDD). According to a statement signed by Hadiza M. Shehu, Assistant Registrar, for the Director Establishment Matters, the affected females should note that all maternity leaves must begin not later than four weeks to their EDD.

The statement added that a medical certificate fully endorsed by the Director of the University Health Services must be presented along with the application. This, according to it, is in strict compliance with the Federal Civil Service Provision on Maternity Leave for Female Public Servants.



- ◆ Take plenty of water/fluid to keep yourself fully hydrated, as this helps greatly to moisten your skin.
- ♦ If you have a sensitive teeth, during the cold season use (sensitive teethpaste, e.g. Sensodyne) toothpaste or chew one or two pieces of clove twice daily, as this
