

BUK Inducts First Graduates of Dental Surgery

he pioneer set of the Bayero University's Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) were inaugurated with a passionate appeal by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello to the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria on the need to consider increasing the university's admission quota for Dental Surgery.

Speaking at a colourful induction ceremony on Thursday, 13th October, 2016, held at Mahmud Tukur Theater at the Old Campus, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, while expressing delight at overseeing the graduation of the pioneer dentists, he paid a glowing tribute to his predecessors for their commitment and determination whose efforts are being reaped today.

Professor Bello who reaffirmed the determination of the university management to provide excellent and modern teaching facilities, said that the University had expended huge amount of money in the purchase of equipment for the Faculty of Dentistry, pointing out that on each and every one of the newly qualified Doctors, the University had spent several millions of Naira worth of equipment.

Morever, the Vice Chancellor appealed to the regulatory body to consider upward review of the admission quota taking into consideration the high demand being the only University offering the programme in the North West Region as well as the excellent facilities put in place. He said about 1,500 candidates applied for the Dental Surgery while the admission quota was just 10 slots describing the allocation as grossly inadequate.

Earlier, the Registrar of the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN), Dr. Abdulmumini Ibrahim, while

congratulating the University for the feat, also disclosed that since the commencement of medical programme in the university almost two decades now, none of the product of Bayero University was ever sanctioned and or disciplined by the Council for whatever offence.

"Mr. Vice Chancellor, your University has cause to celebrate and rejoice today. In addition to inducting the pioneer set of Bachelor of Dental Surgeons, I also take bold to say that the Council has never found any product of this institution wanted in the discharge of their professional calling. Indeed, this is a great source of

pride", he said.

In his remarks, the Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, who was represented by the Director of Research and Innovation, Dr. Ramon Yusuf, commended the management of Bayero University for maintaining standards, saying the Commission is very much proud of BUK assuring that it would do everything possible to support Universities to grow and prosper with a view to competing in the global arena.

Speaking on Thursday, 11th October, 2016 at the occasion of the dissemination of survey findings on performance monitoring and accountability (PMA 2020 round 1 held at College of Health Sciences at the Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, the Vice Chancellor said the university attached greater premium on how to contribute meaningfully to the socio-economic development of the society.

Towards the effective medication of malaria!!
