Governor Ganduje Inspects Newly Donated Centre for Qur'anic Studies, Says BUK Custodian of Knowledge

Governor Abdullahi Umar Ganduje of Kano state has said his government would continue to respect and give special attention to Bayero University, describing it “as a wonder University” that is always in tune with contemporary realities.

Speaking on Tuesday, 18th October, 2016 during an inspection visit to the newly donated Centre for Qur'anic Studies, the Governor, while commending the management of the University for their foresight and commitment to the socio-economic development of the state, in particular, and the country, in general, said his administration held BUK in high esteem.

“It is my submission that Bayero University is not just a place of learning but indeed it personifies knowledge in both western and Islamic education,

therefore I hereby nickname it as the *Khadimul Ilmu* (custodian of knowledge) not only here in Nigeria but in the entire African continent,” he said. He explained that this was so, because of its unique approach and rapid response to finding solutions to contemporary issues bedeviling the society.

Dr. Ganduje, who expressed confidence that the university would undoubtedly make proper utilization of the gigantic edifice donated to it, pointed out that the donor, Khalifa Ishaq Rabi'u had donated the building to a most deserving institution and would go a long way in making his dream turn to reality.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said Nigerian society had abandoned the product of local Qur'anic Schools, which, he said

had been one of the major obstacles to the socio-economic development of the country.

He said it was on discovering the existing lacuna, that the management of the university came up with the idea of establishing the Centre for Qur'anic Studies with a view to according recognition to the product of *tsangaya* schools through the introduction of some short courses in order to certify them for eventual integration into the mainstream.

The Vice Chancellor, who was accompanied to the venue by the Director of the Centre, Professor

Ibrahim Muhammad, commended Khalifah Ishaq Rabi'u for the donation of the multi-billion Naira building and said the University would forever remain indebted and do everything possible to ensure that the building was properly utilized in line with the waqf for the donation.

The building comprises seven hostel blocks with 57 rooms each an auditorium, a dining hall, about 50 classrooms, an administrative block as well it has about 150 toilets and bathrooms at the student hostels in addition to a laundry and a kitchen.

New Interfaith Anti-Corruption Platform Supports Buhari's Anti-Corruption Campaign

Religious leaders from across the 19 Northern States have strongly endorsed the war on corruption being waged by President Muhammadu Buhari. They said the campaign requires the support of all Nigerians and religious leaders should become its torch bearers to make sure that the foundation he lays through all his years in power “doesn't not get demolished” in the distant future.

The leaders spoke through a newly created **Interfaith Anti-Corruption Platform** Co-Chaired by Bishop John Ninyiring, of the Catholic Diocese of Kano and Dr. Bashir Umar Aliyu, Imam of the Al Furqan Masjid Kano & Director Centre for Islamic Civilization and Interfaith dialogue (CICID), Bayero University Kano.

Support for the Federal Government's war on corruption was one of the key resolutions adopted by Christian and Muslim religious leaders at the end of a one-day workshop with the theme *The Role of Religious Leaders in Combatting Corruption in Nigeria*. It was held on Tuesday 18th October, 2016, co-hosted by the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Research And Training (AKCDRT), Mambayya House, Bayero University, Kano and the United States Diplomatic Mission, Nigeria.

Other members of the Central Committee of the Interfaith Anti-Corruption Platform (IAP) from the three zones of the north were: *NW*: Archbishop Akanya; Dr. Bashir Isyaku; Fatima Mohammad Nata'alah; *NC*: Pastor E.A. Ibitayo; Samuel Dali;

Hajiya Fatima Ishaq; and *NE*: Alhaji Kadi A. Imam; Muhammad Shettima Ibrahim; Rev. Fika A. Jen. Barrister Bulama Bukarti is at act as Legal Counselor.

Some of the conference recommendations include: one, religious leaders need to be models for “lawful and uncorrupt behavior” including being accountable to their followers; two, they have responsibility to educate a broad swath of the public to uphold moral values of their faith; three, they are stronger together, to amplify good actions and publicly hold officials accountable; as well as reward good behavior while shunning corrupt officials especially proceeds of corruption donated at religious functions and projects.

Earlier the Special Representative to Muslim Communities (SRMC) from the US State Department, Mr. Shaarik Zafar told the workshop “it is a top priority of the US government to see corruption eradicated in the world and Nigeria in particular” with the assistance of all critical stakeholders, such as religious communities and their leaders. Similarly, the Senior Advisor in the Office of Religious and Global matters, US State Department, Ms. Amy Lillis had explained that having collaborated with Muslim and Christian leaders in the Southern States to set up an Ani-Corruption Alliance earlier in the year, they were in the North “to hear the voices of religious leaders on what can be done to fight corruption and promote accountability and quest for transparency not just for public officials but also within the Nigerian communities.”
