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CQS, Al-Fajr Charity Foundation Sign Pre-MoU on Scholarship, Qur'anic Education

The Centre of Qur'anic Studies (CQS) and a Cairo of Egypt based Alfajr Charity Foundation have signed a pre-memorandum of understanding on scholarship and the promotion of Qur'anic Education.

The President of the Foundation, Abdulkhaliq El-Sayyid Mallah expressed the foundation's readiness and determination to partner with the CQS to promote Qur'anic education and reiterated that the foundation would sponsor staff of the centre for training and conferences.

He also emphasized that his foundation would explore all the possible avenues to help the CQS in its quest to improve the standard of Quranic recitation, memorization and scholarship.

Earlier, the Director of the Centre, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad, gave a brief history of the centre and told the visitor that the centre had a number of collaborators within and outside the country. He also informed him about the enormous contributions given to the centre by Sheikh Khalifa Isyaka Rabiu.

Senior Staff Recreation Centre Commences Operation

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has officially lead the opening ceremony of the University's multi-million Naira Senior Staff Recreation Centre which signified the full commencement of its operation with a pledge to continue to support staff

sporting activities as part of efforts to maintain physical fitness.

Speaking at the occasion on Monday 29th August, 2016, the Vice Chancellor said the centre was created for comfort and relaxation of the university's over 3,000 senior staff, adding that to ensure uninterrupted activities at the centre, the University management has approved the purchase of 100 KVA generator for use.

Although the caretaker committee management of the Centre had pegged 10,000 naira as membership registration fees, the Vice Chancellor in his magnanimous disposition paid the sum of ₦100,000 as registration fees for himself and three others (i.e. ₦25,000 each) – the Executive Secretary of National Universities Commission, Professor Abubakar Rasheed, the Kano State Deputy Governor, Professor Hafiz Abubakar and the Executive Secretary, TETFund, Dr. Baffa Bichi, for one year.

Professor Yahuza Bello while commending the caretaker committee for a job well done urged them to continue to work hard that way they would be able to attract senior staff of the University to register with the centre.

In his speech the Chairman Care Taker Committee of the Centre, Professor E. U. Essiet, commended the former Vice Chancellor Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, and the current Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, for their effort to make the Centre a reality one.

He called on senior staff of the University to patronize the centre, so that the huge resources

put in place would not be wasted. ‘As appetizer, all senior staff are free from today to 1st week of October to come and make use of the centre free of charge,’ Professor Essiet added.

Professor Essiet also said that the centre was made in such a way that it would be conducive/convenient for both male and memale staff of the University, adding that the centre had adequate provisions to ensure the separation of male and female in the centre.

Health & Hygiene Advices from University Health Services

Are you aware that there is high incidence rate of malaria among members of the University community?

- Medical statistics from medical records unit of the department have shown that malarial infection at this time triplicates that of the last three months.
- Malaria is among the sanitation related infections, which means when you sanitized your environment you minimized malaria infection.

- Environmental health inspection carried out by environmental health officers reveals that most of the houses in staff quarters are full of overgrown weeds and shrubs, which serve as a breeding sites for and hideouts for mosquitoes that transmit malaria.
- In line with above, all house occupants are strongly advised to clear their internal compound at least 10 meter away from fence/building.
- As when there are joint actions of clearing our environment/surrounding will help reduce malaria in the university community.
- Remember “prevention is better and cheaper than cure.

National Identity Management Commission: Notification for NIM Enrolment

The National Identity Management Commission (NIMC) was mandated by Act Number 23 of 2007 to among other things establish a National Identity Management System (NIMS). The process involves enrolment of Nigerians into the National Identity Database and the issuance of a National Identity Number (NIM).

The Mandatory use of NIM will soon be set for all transactions in Nigeria requiring identity verification. In essence, the NIM will soon be used for:

1. Obtaining National E-ID card
2. Agricultural Subsidy
3. Travelling
4. Opening of Bank Account
5. Getting our Drivers Licence
6. Obtaining your Voters Card
7. NHIS
8. Tax Payment and so on.

A letter signed by State Coordinator, Bilkisu Dalhatu Isma, urged BUK staff and their families to take advantage of the BUK NIMC Special Enrolment Centre in the Advancement Office to register.

GENERAL CIRCULAR: Appointment of Contract, Sabbatical & Visiting Staff

The University has been facing serious challenges with respect to the payment of salaries and allowances since December 2015. The challenges arise from the grossly inadequate provision for, and release of, funds for personnel costs from Abuja.

In view of these challenges, the Management has decided as follows until the situation improves:

- a) All fresh appointments either regular or contract have been suspended.
- b) Appointments and renewals of the appointment of retired staff on contract have been suspended.
- c) Sabbatical appointments of staff members from other universities to the University have been put on hold.
- d) There will be no appointments or renewals for visiting and part-time staff members.

Exemption will only be given in **very exceptional** cases (such as for new programmes/departments with inadequate full-time staff members).

In a circular dated 12th July, 2016, the Registrar, Fatima Binta Mohammed, advised all the affected staff members to take note accordingly.

Miscellaneous Problems in English Usage (4)

Cont'd from last week

It should be noted that *appreciate* may also be used as an *intransitive verb* (i.e. without requiring a *direct object*). Study the following example:

- a. *Their investments have appreciated.*
 'Appreciate' in this context means to increase in value.

Now let us go back to the original sentence ("I would **appreciate** if you **tell** her the truth.") and explain why 'tell' is incorrect. This is a good example of a *complex sentence* (a sentence containing one or more subordinate clauses). A *complex sentence* is made up of the MAIN CLAUSE ('I would appreciate') and the SUBORDINATE CLAUSE ('if you tell her the truth'). *If-clause* constructions are referred to as *subjunctive mood*. We shall discuss this in detail someday, God willing. Now study the following correct sentences:

- b. *I will be happy if she comes.* ('will be'...'comes')
 c. *I would be happy if she came.* ('would be'...'came')
 d. *I would fly if I were a bird.* ('would fly'...'were')

You will realize that when the tense of the verb in the main clause changes, the tense of the verb in the subordinate clause also changes. This is the rule. In other words the verbs in a complex sentence must have the same tense form. But they are not in "I would appreciate if you tell her the truth." Therefore, 'tell' must change to 'told' to rhyme with 'would appreciate'.

Correct: *I would appreciate it if you told her the truth.*

Correct: *I will appreciate it if you tell her the truth.*

Complex sentences of this kind are reversible. Note the following:

- e. *If you told her the truth, I would appreciate it.*
 f. *If you tell her the truth, I will appreciate it.*
 g. *If she comes, I will be happy.*
 h. *If she came, I would be happy.*
 i. *If I were a bird, I would fly.*
