Disconnection Between Academia and Industries Bane of Innovative Research

The disconnection between members of the academia and the industries, on one hand, and with the wider society, on the other, has been identified as the greatest impediment to providing innovative thinking as well as to conducting researches that would create avenues for economic buoyancy and growth with a view to launching Nigeria into the comity of advanced economies.

Delivering a keynote paper, titled *Bridging the Academia, Industrial and Societal Gaps: The Nigerian Case* at the first International Science Conference organized by the Faculty of Physical Sciences of Bayero University, which took place at the Conference Hall of Yusuf Maitama Sule University, City Campus, Kofar Nassarawa, on Monday, 28th August, 2017, Dr. Y.Y Deeni, the Director, School of Science, Engineering and Technology, Abertay University, Dundee, Scotland, UK, noted that, sadly Nigeria is far behind in terms of innovation and research, which, he said, are the key elements that stimulate growth and development of any society.

“We are really far behind in terms of research and innovation for development. However, as a way out of this bondage, we need a fundamental restructuring, repositioning and refocusing. We must also reform our

learning process in order to strengthen our ability beyond the elastic limit so that we can transform and then bring about the needed change,” he suggested.

Earlier, while declaring the conference open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the timing of the gathering was apt, in view of the desire of Nigerians to proffer solutions out of the current predicament.

He said it “is my hope and prayer that the proceedings of this an all-important conference would translate into a blueprint that would facilitate the bridging of this gap.”

In his opening remarks, the Chairman of the occasion and Vice Chancellor of Yusuf Maitama Sule University, Professor Mustapha Ahmad Isah, disclosed that academics and the larger society should work hand in hand to provide the needed development strategies by supporting research.

The Dean of the Faculty of Physical Sciences, Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, in his welcome address, explained that the conference aimed at identifying the causes as well as proffering solutions towards the disconnection among research institutes, industries and society.

Emir Sanusi II Commends BUK, Promises More Linkages and Support By: Lamara Garba




FG Appoints Adamu Wangara Member, Dental Therapists Registration Board of Nigeria By: Nura Garba

Bayero University College of Health Sciences in conjunction with Transplant Association of Nigeria (TAN) has conducted its 1st international conference themed: **Organ Transplantation in Developing Countries: Challenges and Prospects**. The conference, which took place between 27th and 30th August, 2017, was held at

Also speaking at the opening ceremony, the President of TAN, Dr. E. L. Bamgboye, lamented the insufficient number of Nigerian hospitals capable of carrying out transplants. He further stated that “this is the rationale behind establishing Transplant Association of Nigeria (TAN)”

In his speech, the Chairman of the International Conference, Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said that it would be cheaper to have organ transplants at home than abroad. Professor Bello suggested that it is “possible to pool resources together to build centres here in Nigeria to provide transplant services.” The Vice Chancellor equally suggested that TAN could have its own journal, despite the fact that it is not an old association. “We will provide our little contribution towards the realization of such a journal,” the Vice Chancellor promised.

In his address, the Chief Medical Director, Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, Kano (AKTH), Professor A. Zakari Mohammed, said that transplantation in Nigeria is still at its infancy stage. For this reason, Professor Zakari called for the right legislations so that transplants could be carried out without much fuss.

Malaria is a life-threatening disease caused by parasites that are transmitted to people through the bites of infected female *Anopheles* mosquitoes. Symptoms may include:

(1) Fever (2) Chills (3) Headache (4) Sweat (5) Fatigue (6) Nausea and Vomiting

Therefore, protect yourself from MALARIA by:

- Sleeping under mosquito impregnated bed net even during the day
- Wearing long-sleeved and light-coloured clothes
- Using screens on windows and doors to avoid exposure to mosquitoes
- Using Mosquito repellents
- Covering stored water with tightly fitted lids
- Removing stagnant water from surroundings to avoid mosquito breeding
- Clearing overgrown weeds and shrubs from surroundings
- Seeking early treatment if symptoms of high fever, nausea and body ache manifest.
