VC Commends ASUU's Formation of Cooperative Society By: Fausat A. Opayomi

he Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad outcome was the formation of a Cooperative Society for Yahuza Bello, has congratulated the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), BUK branch for their innovation and foresight to form a Cooperative Society.

He said this during a courtesy visit by the interim board of the cooperative society, on Monday, 11th December, 2017 at the VC's Committee room. According to him, it was not surprising that ASUU had come up with such an amazing welfare package, because they have been supporting the families of their deceased members and that their intervention in alleviating the sufferings of the Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) in Maiduguri was worth emulating.

Earlier, the Interim Board Members of the Cooperative Society, headed by Dr. Ahmad Ali Yakasai, informed the Vice Chancellor and the Principal Officers present that ASUU at the National Delegate Conference had urged all branches to form a Cooperative Society each. The Bayero University, with the name BUKASCO, which, according to him, had been registered with the Kano State Ministry of Commerce.

Dr. Yakasai explained that the cooperative society was meant for all staff, including non-teaching staff, their spouses, next of kin and former staff, provided they met the stipulated criteria.

The requirement he disclosed consisted the registration fee of N500, payment of N20,000 for the procurement of shares and N5000 monthly contribution as individual savings.

He also said, the Federal Mortgage Bank has been contacted for members to benefit from the housing scheme programme of the Bank. The Bank pledged to make available 100 units of various housing types out of the 300 units being constructed in Kano to the Cooperative Society of BUK to benefit from.

global warming. He equally emphasized on the need to explore energy sources with low carbon emission.

The lead paper presenter, Engineer Bukar Abdullahi, in his lecture defined green energy as any energy that could be harnessed and consumed with minimal effects on the environment to reduce pollution. According to him, green energy encompasses all forms of renewable energy sources, such as the anaerobic digestion of biomass or waste, hydro power, and tidal solar system, among others.

DRIP Organizes Research Ethics Training Workshop By: Rabi'u M. Sagir

The Directorate of Research Innovation and Partnership (DRIP) and the Centre for Infectious Diseases Research (CIDR), College of Health Sciences have organized a workshop on Research Ethics for members of Bayero University Research Ethics Committee on Monday, 5th December, 2017 at the lecture theatre of Faculty of Clinical Sciences.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, declared the workshop open and advised the participants to pay attention and learn the modern ways of carrying out researches in an ethical way that would make it standard and acceptable worldwide.

The Chairman, National Health Research Ethics Committee, Professor Zubairu Iliyasu, traced the history of the Committee, which he said was formed in 1980 but had become dormant due to lack of funds. The Committee was later revived in 2005 and collaborated with a West African Bioethics training programme to

provide technical assistance in carrying out efficient and effective researches in an ethical manner that would minimize the degree of risks in any research taken.

Dr. A.O. Adejumo explained the reason why research ethics and regulations were necessary, considering the past history of unethical researches carried out externally and in Nigeria from pre-Second World War through the Second World War and to modern times, he said.

Dr. Adejumo urged researchers to abide by the set of principles or standards by which human conduct was regulated in order to match up with the valued principles and beliefs that would guide the behavior of specified group

of people that were involved in research and also to protect the image of people and animals involved in research work, so as to provide power balance between interacting groups that would help in deriving benefit to the society, as well as reducing risks in research work.

BUK May Commence B.Sc Environmental Health Programme By: Lamara Garba

The Registrar/Chief Executive Officer of the Environmental Health Officers Registration Council of Nigeria (EHORCN), Dr. Abonyi Dominic, has made a passionate appeal to the Management of Bayero University to consider the mounting of BSc Environmental Health Programme with a view to developing the profession.

Speaking when he visited the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, in his office on Wednesday, 6th December, 2017, the Registrar charged that Environmental Health workers, otherwise referred to as "Duba gari", had been neglected by tertiary institutions, especially Universities.

According to him, the concept of "Duba gari" started in the early 1920's, however, access to further their studies had been a great source of worry to them. He said "Duba gari" is very critical for societal health but the professionals in this field had no advanced training.



"Sir, I have been calling, talking and appealing over the years on the need to have a degree programme on Environmental Health. Now, it is time for you to kindly

consider our request and start such a programme for the concern and proposed to take up the matter to the benefit of our teeming members across the country", he appealed.

Dr. Dominic proposed that, since there had been absence of manpower in the field to start the programme, it would, however, be ideal if the management could consider inter-disciplinary professionals to come together and start the degree programme until such a time when the real professionals in the field could be available. To this end, he said academics from the Biological Sciences, Medicine and Environmental Management as well as Civil Engineering and other fields could be of great help to start the programme.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, thanked the Registrar for his

relevant bodies for the commencement of a degree programme in the area.

Professor Bello disclosed that already arrangements had gone far in that direction, pointing out that the Senate had approved the programme, but the management was scared by the guidelines and other requirements stipulated by the NUC for the commencement of such a programme.

However, he said with a clue from the Council on the need to pull experts from different disciplines, certainly the University would revisit the matter and hopely by next academic session, all things being equal, it would commence with the programme.

Communiqué of the International Conference on Green Energy for Sustainable Development (IC-GESD 2017)

On Tuesday, the 5th of December, 2017, the conference started with a plenary session and then five technical sessions were conducted concurrently. At the end of the conference, the following conclusions were arrived at as 5. Bio-composites are good engineering the communiqué:

- 1. The abundant rice husk wastes we have in Nigeria are a good source of environmentally friendly fuel. Selection of appropriate rice husk gives good quality pellets of high calorific values.
- 2. The conference identifies that the extension of the shelf life of a biodiesel can be achieved using extracts from common plants, such as eucalyptus. It was recommended that Government should sponsor further researches along this direction.
- 3. Human capacity should be developed to enhance productivity in Green Energy Sector.
- The conference identifies the need to set up

- additional air quality monitoring centres as only one Aerosol Detection Centre currently exists in Nigeria.
- biodegradable materials with excellent physical and mechanical properties. Further work is needed in this direction.
- 6. Production of platinum anode electrocatalysts using local waste materials could be used for direct methanol fuel cell application.
- Innovation in the design and optimization of three phase gravity separators could be applied to reduce excessive gas flaring in the oil and gas industry.
- Artificial Intelligence-inspired methodologies could be used to reduce losses in Electrical Power distribution networks.
