## NIGCOMSAT Committed to Serving Nigerian

he Executive Director, Marketing and Business Development of Nigeria Communication Satellite (NIGCOMSAT), Mr. Samson R. Osagie, has assured Nigerian Universities of NIGCOMSAT's commitment towards the provision of satellite services and solutions to all Nigerian Universities, other tertiary institutions as well as organs of government and for commercial usage.

Speaking on Wednesday, 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2018, when he led a delegation on a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, Mr osagie disclosed that NIGCOMSAT had commenced operation eight years ago with NIGCOMSAT -1 as the first Communication Satellite in Sub-Saharan Africa.

He said Bayero University, research institutes and other Nigerian Universities could utilize opportunities offered by NIGCOMSAT to tremendously perform their activities. He added that the company was with the vision to make Nigeria not just maintain its position as the giant of Africa, but also to technologically hit every facet of the economy.

Dr. Osagie, who represented his Managing Director/Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Abimbola Alale, pointed out that NIGCOMSAT would provide decent satellite and broadband services to enable the Federal and State Government Agencies to possess accessible services that could move research and other activities forward, assuring that both teachers and students could have easier way to learn with its services.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor M.Y. Bello, said Bayero University was committed to the use of satellite and broadband services as their services could help tremendously the University's Centre for Information Technology, which has been transformed since 2001. He added that the Centre for Information Technology (CIT) provided a lot of services, including connectivity and the development of software used in the provision of many services, including student's registration.

Professor Bello suggested that the management of NIGCOMSAT should use the forum of the Committee of Vice Chancellors to put across its proposals for them to collectively utilize the services through the National Universities Commission (NUC).

#### World Bank Supervision Team Visits CDA

World Bank Team undertook a supervision mission to the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) from 6<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 to gain first-hand information on the progress recorded by the Centre



towards meeting the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for the ACE project, since the last supervision mission.

Professor Jonathan Mba of the Association of African Universities (AAU) led Professor Raphael Wahome and Mr. Carl Larsen to conduct the mission to review the implementation progress of the CDA and other operational issues.

"The essence is to ensure that ACE being visited is delivering results in accordance with the objectives contained in the implementation plan. The Centres are visited every six months to track their progress and discuss challenges, as well as proffer suggestions. We use subject matter experts in the disciplinary field to use their expertise to make recommendations to the Centre

being visited," said Prof Mba.

The visit also featured a tour of the Centre's facilities that included the Tissue Culture Laboratory, Multi-Purpose

Laboratory, Geographical Information Laboratory and CDA Farm for deep and sprinkler irrigation, which in the nearest future would commence commercial production. "Part of the 15 hectre farm, we will have assorted crops like banana, grapes and soon and will have different types of vegetables with different cycles. In a few years the farm will sustain the centre," the CDA Director said.

At the Tissue Culture, the Team commended the CDA for putting the state of the art facilities capable of generating appreciable revenue that would sustain the centre even after the expiration of the ACE project.

The World Bank Team also had an interaction with the Centre's national and regional students to gain some insight into the impact of the ACE project as well as the challenges encountered.

Students of the Centre expressed satisfaction with the quality of education to which the ACE project exposed them.

The World Bank Team had earlier paid a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, where the leader of the delegation, Professor Jonathan Mba, told him that their visit was to review the implementation progress of CDA and make possible suggestions in line with the ACE project implementation plan.

The Vice Chancellor expressed gratitude with their visit and assured them that the University was ready and committed to support the CDA to achieve its set objectives.

### CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CAMPUS CENTRAL MOSQUE COMPLEX

The Bayero University Committee on the construction of the of New Campus Central Mosque Complex was formed in February, 2015 by the University's Muslim Community. The Committee was charged with the responsibility of sourcing funds and supervising the construction and furnishing of the long planned Central Mosque Complex which comprises of a mosque, an Islamic centre, a library and residence of Imam. The Committee has since its formation gone around the country to garner material and monetary support from philanthropic personalities. Direct monetary contributions of over 100 million Naira was collectively provided by Alh. Isha'q Rabiu, Alh. Aminu Dantata, Alh. Abdussamad Isha'q Rabiu, and others. This was in addition to pledge for the provision of tiles by Alh. A. A. Rano, and carpets by Alh. Abdulmanaf, Azman. The committee has succeeded in utilising the contributed fund in the construction of the mosque (located at the premises of the main entrance of the New Campus) to its present level.

The Committee resolves to solicit the contribution of the BUK Muslim Community in raising fund towards completion of the project complex. Indeed, some members of the Community have persistently requested for the chance to contribute. We recommend deduction from the salaries of allMuslim StaffMembersin the payroll of Bayero University for one year, starting from May 2018. We hope to get the mosque opened in Ramadhan, In Sha Allah. Therefore members would need their "P" or Staff Number to register. In case they have not memorised it, then, they should come with their official ID cards or appointment letters.

According to BUK Statute (Law 79 of 28th September, 1979) section 9 (3), part (4) Congregation: (1) The Congregation shall consist of (a) The Vice Chancellor (b) the full time members of the academic staff (c) The Registrar (d) The Bursar; and (e) every member of the administrative staff who holds a degree of any university recognised for the purpose of this statute by the Vice Chancellor not being an honorary degree.
