



## BUK's Governing Council Approves Appointment of DVC's, Promotion of 2 Professors, 5 Associate Professors

The 13<sup>th</sup> Governing Council of Bayero University, Kano, at its 5<sup>th</sup> meeting held on Wednesday, 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2018 approved the appointment of Professor Adamu Idris Tanko as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) and Professor Haruna Wakili as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), with effect from 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 each for a period of two years.

Their appointments were approved upon the outcome of

the selection exercise carried out by the Senate at its 365<sup>th</sup> meeting held on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. Professor Adamu Tanko and Professor Haruna Wakili are currently serving their terms as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration) and Director, Centre for Democratic Research and Training, Mambayya House, respectively.

The new appointments were disclosed in separate statements signed by the Registrar, Hajiya Fatima Binta Isiaku Mohammed that also indicated the Council's approval of the promotion of Dr. Yahaya Imam Sulaiman of Department of Arabic as Professor of Arabic Literature and Dr. Fatima Salmanu Koki, of the Department of Physics, as Professor of Theoretical Physics effective from 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2017.

Also, Dr. Bello Gambo of Department of Geography, Dr. Ibrahim Badamasi Lambu from the same Department of Geography, Dr. Muhammad Yusha'u of the Department of Microbiology, Dr. Shehu Usman Ahmad of Department of Arabic and Dr. Umar Sani of Department of Pure and Industrial Chemistry were promoted to the ranks of Associate Professors effective from 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2017.

## INEC Launches Voter Education Volunteer Program in BUK

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) has launched a Voter Education Volunteer Programme in Bayero University as part of its

campus outreach programme of Youth Votes Count.

The INEC Chairman, Professor Mahmood Yakubu, led his commissioners, the European Union delegation, the

Ambassador of Germany to Nigeria and other stakeholders, including student representatives from tertiary institutions of the North-West and artists to launch the campaign on Tuesday, 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2018 ahead of the 2019 general election. It was the third in the series of the campaign earlier launched in University of Abuja and University of Lagos, respectively. Bayero University was selected to represent the North West in the youth voter education exercise.

A significant number of students were chosen to act as volunteers in sensitizing Bayero University students to get their permanent voters cards ready and ensure that their votes counted during the forthcoming 2019 general elections.

The INEC Chairman, Professor Yakubu, who inducted the volunteers, urged them to work assiduously to ensure the effective sensitization and mobilization of students on campus and beyond, as well as create awareness on the importance of participation in election.

A Commissioner in INEC, Hajiya Amina Zakari, who represented the Chairman in inducting the volunteers, said that henceforth they were INEC volunteer ambassadors, calling on them to be non-partisan and guided by the rules and regulations of the commission.

The Chairman, Youth Voter Count Committee, Professor Adedeji Soyibi, who represented the INEC Chairman, Professor Yakubu, expressed delight about the huge turnout of students at the North West zone's voter education programme, saying that the youth had the right to vote for change by using their votes. He said INEC would make sure that votes counted during the elections, urging the youth not to engage in the snatching ballot boxes or anything that could mar the system.

The German Ambassador to Nigeria, Dr. Bernhard Schlagheck, said Nigerian youth played a critical role in the economy by excelling in ICT, agriculture, business and other fields of the economy, expressing displeasure that of his 20 months in Nigeria, youth participation in democracy was nothing to write home about. He said only

a negligible number of youth was in the parliament, a scenario which totally deviated from what was obtained in the first and second republics.

Also speaking, the Deputy Ambassador of the European Union Delegation to Nigeria, Mr. Richard Young, said the youth had constituted about half of the 200 million Nigerian population, but a greater percentage of them were not registered. He charged them to take the challenge of taking over power through voting like their counterparts in some countries.

Mr. Young urged the students and entire Nigerian youth to stay away from religious intolerance and other biases that were not doing well to democracy and advocated for a perfect democratic system that would give them the opportunity to better their future.

In his remark, the Pro-Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Ibrahim Gambari, expressed gratitude to the EU's involvement in Nigerian democratization and the role the German Ambassador played in supporting INEC towards conducting a free and fair election, including the massive participation of youth.

The Kano State INEC Resident Electoral Commissioner, Professor Riskuwa Shehu, said at the end of the exercise INEC would need to have more students, who will go out to sensitize eligible voters and participate actively in all the processes and elect credible leaders for good governance.

Earlier during a courtesy call, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed the University's readiness to support INEC in its quest for free and fair elections. He urged all the stakeholders to join hands in helping the campaign to sensitize Nigerian youth.

The highlight of the occasion was a panel session on Enhancing Youth Participation in the Electoral Process by Nafisa Abdullahi (actress), Korede Bello (award winning music artiste and song-writer) and Yakub Mohammed (actor) and moderated by Gimba Umar of Channels Television.

## Only Non-Partisan Staff Will Serve as INEC Ad-hoc Staff for the 2019 Elections – VC, Prof. M. Y. Bello

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has assured the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) that the Management of the university would ensure that the staff of the university to serve as INEC ad-hoc staff for the 2019 general elections will not have any trace of political affiliations.

Professor Yahuza Bello was speaking when he received the Chairman of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Professor Mahmoud Yakubu, who paid him a courtesy call on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2018.

The Vice Chancellor recalled that during the 2015 general

elections, the university conducted thorough screening before it released the names of the university staff that served as INEC ad-hoc staff, saying that "I am happy our staff did a good a job as none was found to have compromised during and after the elections."

He said this time around more stringent screening processes would be carried out by the university with a view to ensuring that only staff that did not have any iota of political affiliations were selected and released to serve as INEC ad-hoc staff.

Professor Bello stated that considering the records of successes and achievements Professor Yakubu recorded

during his tenure as the Executive Secretary of Tertiary Education Trust Fund coupled with his scholarly exploit as an academic, 'I have no doubt that Professor Yakubu is up to the task,' he noted.

## CBE will Indicate Spirit of Student Positive Value to the Society

The Faculty of Management Sciences has introduced a Character Building Exercise (CBE) programme that will inculcate the spirit of student ability towards supporting positive values that will change the ills of the society through mentoring.

According to him, it also aimed at increasing the level of youth participation and boost citizens' trust and confidence in the electoral process. He said the programme was also part of the commission's Continuous Voter Registration (CVR) exercise and collection of the Permanent Voter Card (PVC).
