



Monitor Lecturers' Performance for Effective Teaching

.... Prof. Ibrahim Yakasai

A university don in the Department of Pharmaceutical and Medicinal Chemistry of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Professor Ibrahim A. Yakasai, has advocated for the adoption of the monitoring and supervision of lecturers as a way of enthroning effective teaching and learning that would guarantee quality in students.

Presenting a paper titled *Effective Teaching, Learning and Assessment Methods in Higher Education* during a seminar organized by the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences on Thursday, August 9, 2018, Professor Yakasai explained that the adoption of such a policy would go a long way in making lecturers be more serious and responsible in the discharge of their responsibilities.

“Teaching is one such profession where the success of the teachers largely depends on the ability of the students to understand what is taught”, he posited. Professor Yakasai further said getting students to succeed was what the teachers had to focus on in order for them to equally succeed in their careers.

A situation whereby a teacher was without supervision by superior officers may be a great disservice to the system and, therefore defeat the intended purposes and goals set to be achieved by the institution, especially at the tertiary level.

Professor Yakasai was of the view that monitoring and effective supervision were the best ways to ensure quality and productivity, hence his quest to enthroning it, so as to pave the way for quality assurance in the system. He equally advised teachers to always developed teaching methods which include setting of goals, explaining key concepts and encouraging interactive environment to provide a friendly posture with their learners. This, he said, would give students a sense of belonging and serve as a motivating factor for effective learning.

“Great teachers are nimble, observant and responsive,” always keeping an open mind about how best to engage

their students and get them excited to learn. Teachers needed to be able to build trusting relationship with students in order to create a safe, positive and productive learning environment.

The pioneer dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Professor Lawan Alhassan Bichi, in his comment said for effective teaching and learning to take place, a university lecturer must be able to differentiate between a teacher and lecturer.

Earlier, in his remarks, the Dean of the Faculty, Dr. Basheer A.Z. Chedi, said the seminar was part of the efforts to engage on self-assessment as well as provide a platform for staff training and learning. He assured them of continued hosting of such seminars, which would allow for improvement and quality teaching.

In his comment, the Deputy Dean and the Quality Assurance Coordinator of the Faculty, Dr. Musa Aliyu, said the poor teaching method by some lecturers was the major cause of students' poor performance in many tertiary institutions. He buttressed the need to enthrone monitoring and supervision, as suggested by the other speaker. Dr. Aliyu was of the opinion that the University should devise a means of making Heads of Department visit classrooms and lecture halls so as to monitor and supervise the performance of their lecturers.

The Acting Head of Department of Pharmaceutical Microbiology and Biotechnology, Professor M. D. Mukhtar, suggested that the University Management should revisit the idea of enforcing the policy in which every lecturer who had no teaching qualification made to obtain a Post-graduate Diploma in Education. This, he said, would afford lecturers to learn some teaching methods for a positive impact.

He explained that, although the registration started by 9:00am and closed at 5:00pm daily, many students used to come as early as 7:00am to form queues.

When asked about the challenges they were facing, Mal.

Hashimu said there were not many, as BUK had already provided them with the enabling environment they required, which had made their operation successful. The only challenge they experienced was that of overcrowding.

Another INEC official, Mal. Aminu Bala Abubakar, A.E.O. Cluster, in charge of Gezawa Local Government, said the Voter Registration was scheduled for all the 44 local government areas of Kano State, with each local government being provided with a registration unit.

Some of the students who came for the Registration expressed their satisfaction with the exercise. Muhammad Y. Mustapha and Aliyu Abdurrahman from Biochemistry Department expressed their satisfaction with how the ongoing INEC Voter Registration was being handled.

Madinat Ahmed, a Level 400 student from the Department of Education, said she had come as early as 7am so as to register. She observed that it took less than 5 minutes for each client to do so. She, therefore, urged her colleagues who were yet to register to do so before 31st August, 2018, which is the closing date for the exercise.

Other students who came for the registration were patiently waiting to be registered. These included people like Bashir Nafiu, Ibrahim Umar Sani both from Arabic Department and Umar Yahaya Hamza from Economics Department.
