## **NEPU** was Launched to Fight Against Oppression

he Northern Elements Progressive Union (NEPU) was launched as a political party in Northern Nigeria with the aim of emancipating the common man from the bandage of oppression from the ruling elites, Mal. Datti Malumfashi, has said.

Speaking at Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Research and Training, (Mambayya), to marked the 68th anniversary of the formation of the party, Mal. Malumfashi said the pitch of NEPU's ideological concerns was different from those of the other parties. "It was a legacy consistently unblinking in its focus on the need of a new social arrangement in which the poor and the downtrodden would have a dominant presence in the economic system."

He said NEPU had a beautiful way of playing internal democracy, which was also known as intra-party democracy, a situation whereby members of the party played a vital role in decision making and in deliberations within the party structure, which is not common at present political setting in which now a cabal few in the name of kingmakers or godfathers to make the decisions without recause to the feelings of

other members.

He also attributed the political logjam that were taking place currently to lack of internal democracy. "The best way to solve the problems for the parties was to strengthen their internal democracy, which would allow ordinary members to express their views on matters of policies and strategic planning of their parties to ensure transparent and good governance within them," he suggested

Also speaking, Mal. Audu Gadau expressed the wisdom in the idea of internal democracy in a political party, which, he said, was to create a level playing field for the active participation of every member in the party affairs and build a cohesive party that was vibrant enough to win election in order to produce economic and political development.

Earlier, the Director of the Centre, Professor Haruna Wakili, expressed his gratitude and appreciation to Allah for the hitch free 68th anniversary lecture.

It could be recalled that NEPU was funded in Kano on August 8th, 1950 by eight persons..

## Shun Political Intolerance, Choose Leaders of Integrity

### - BUK Imams Charge Muslims, Politicians

he *Imams* of Old and New Campuses of Bayero University, Kano, Dr. Sani Ayagi and Professor Auwal Abubakar respectively have

enjoined politicians in the country to shun political intolerance, also asking the electorates to vote for credible leaders that can move the country forward irrespective of political differences.

In their separate *Eid-El-Kabir* sermons that took place at the two campuses on Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2018, the *imams* called on Nigerians to pray for the nation, just as they enjoined leaders to eschew bias by paving way for the conduct of free and fair elections during the 2019 general elections.

They traced the history of Layyah (animal sacrifice) that originated from Prophet

Ibrahim and urged Muslims to emulate the all encompassing religious act through the slaughter of

healthy animals for their benefit and that of their

relations, neighbours and the needy in the society.

Dr. Ayagi enjoined politicians not to be exalted by their personal desires and want of leadership to seek election through ill-fated means. He urged politicians to stand by the truth and avoid the use of illicit drugs on youth and not to engage the services of soothsayers. Instead, they should use their integrity to canvass for votes.

He spoke on the need of the Muslim Ummah to be united as one entity and discard religious bigotry or differences, questioning "why shall we be divided even though we are followers of the same religion and are guided by Qur'an and Sunnah of the Holy Prophet (SAW)?" He expressed regret that Nigerian Muslims are not taking lessons from the incessant sabotage from some misguided people, who, he said, have united globally to see the downfall of all Muslims.

Dr. Ayagi charged Muslim community to help one another especially at this era when the world is undergoing series of crises and problems, socially, economically and otherwise.

He appealed to the Muslims to guide against unhealthy utterances and actions detrimental to causing injury on others, saying further Muslims should learn to have

patience on challenges that come their ways, as God has promised to test the faith of each and everyone.

The *Imam* reminded the wealthy individuals among us to remain resolute to sanitizing their wealth by way of giving zakkat, saying that Islam enjoins Muslims to pay visits to friends, relations, the sick persons and others with a view to making them happy.

The Imam of New Campus, Professor Auwal Abubakar, in particular, in his sermon urged Muslims to sacrifice their lives for religious sake and for the betterment of the society. He said changes are ongoing globally, which cannot be separated from religion.

He tasked Muslims to obtain their voter cards and elect people of integrity irrespective of their political parties. He charged our Muslim Community to abide by the lessons of *Ramadan* fasting as solutions to most of our problems which, amongst others, include assistance to the less privileged, love, total submission to God and many other lessons.

He said the entire Muslim life ought to be guided by the religion. As such, Muslims should ensure that whatever they do reflects the teachings of Qur'an and Sunnah of Prophet (PBUH).



he University of Jos, has conferred an honorary Doctorate Degree on Bayero University's Professor of Telecommunication Engineering, Professor Umar Garba Danbatta during the institution's combined 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> Convocation ceremonies, just as President Muhammadu Buhari has warned tertiary institutions across the country to stamp out all elements of corruption, social vices and sexual harassment or face disciplinary action.

The President who was speaking in a message he delivered at the Convocation ceremony held in Jos at the Jeremiah Timbuk Useni mini stadium at the Naraguta permanent site of the University, lamented that such vices have the tendency of tarnishing the

About 18,348 graduands were awarded degrees, while Professor Umar Garba Danbatta alongside former Inspector General of Police, Sir Mike Mbama Okiro and Engineer John G. Mallo were conferred honorary doctorate degrees.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Seddi Sebastian Maimako, in his speech, said in particular, Professor Umar Danbatta had initiated laudable changes in the telecommunication industry since his assumption of office as the Executive Vice Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Nigerian Communication Commission, describing him as an exceptional administrator and professional *per excellence*.
