Second Semester Exams Extended by Two Weeks, as Exams Now Commence September 19

he University Senate at its 366th Meeting held on Wednesday, 29th August, 2018 approved the extension of Second Semester Examinations for the undergraduate students by two weeks.

A statement signed by the Registrar, Fatima Binta Mohammed, indicates that the Senate has adjusted the calendar of academic activities for the remaining part

of the 2017/2018 academic session.

According to the statement, the undergraduate students will now take their GSP examinations from Wednesday, 19th to Saturday, 22nd September, 2018; while the examinations proper are to hold from Monday, 24th September to Saturday, 13th October, 2018.

BUK, Maryam Abacha University to Partner on Biomedical Research and Engineering By Mustapha Gide

American University of Niger (MAAUN) are working towards establishing a partnership on Biomedical

Research and Engineering (BREN) through carrying out joint researches and other academic activities beneficial to especially Nigeria and other African

countries.

The Vice Chacnellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, while receiving officials of MAAUN in his

office on Thursday, 30th August, 2018, said that the boundary between Nigeria and Niger should not be a barrier as there are a lot of things the two universities could do on research, teaching and collaboration. He said Bayero University would assist MAAUN in staff training, capacity building and many other areas the latter university wanted.

The Vice Chancellor said the National Universities Commission welcomed such and similar proposals for partnership. He said Bayero University would use its Centre for Biotechnology Research's state of arts facilities as the basis for the proposed biomedical research partnership.

Prof. Bello said BUK had gone a long way in establishing centres of excellence that are globally recognised, citing Centre for Dryland Agriculture as

one of the only 18 centres of excellence of its kind in the African continent. He expressed delight that BUK is encouraging the coming up of more private universities, MAAUN inclusive, to facilitate opportunity for admitting the bulk of applicants applying for enrolment into various degree programmes annually.

Earlier, the Director, Linkages and Collaboration, MAAUN, Dr. Bala Mohammed Tukur, appreciated the partnership with BUK. He added that MAAUN would also emulate Bayero University in achieving milestone through establishing centres of excellence.

Dr Tukur said MAAUN was ready to fulfil its own part

of the agreement, including committing its resources at any stage of the partnership.

He expressed MAAUN's confidence in the leadership of Bayero University. He said, going by the initial discussions between the two universities, the partnership would go a long way to benefit the two parties and humanity in general.

Others in the entourage included Professor Mohammed S. Magaji, Dean, Postgraduate Studies; Dr. Rayyan M. Garba, Director, Operational Research and Musa Abdullahi of MAAUN Foundation.

Faculty of Law Launches Maiden Pre-Law School Conference for 500 Level Students By Adamu Garba

The Dean, Faculty of Law, Prof. M.L. Yusufari, has initiated a "Pre-Law School Conference" for the first time to Level 500 students of the Faculty to accord them with first-hand experience at Law School. The Maiden Conference was held at the Faculty of Law, Bayero University, Kano, on the 23rd August, 2018.

"The rationale behind the Conference is to avail students with the challenges ahead of them at the Law School", said Prof. Yusufari. He charged the law students to use the opportunity as the event was unprecedented in the history of the faculty.

Barr. Ibrahim Sule, a lecturer from the Nigerian Law School, Kano Campus, delivered a lecture on the challenges at Law School. He gave a panoramic view on the number of courses being taught there and how they differed from those at the University level. He observed, among other things, that the emphasis at Law School was on the practical aspects of law as opposed to the black letter law. He also prepared the minds of the students on the tough battle ahead of them and urged them to fully prepare for the challenges.

Earlier, the Chairman of the session, Dr. Nasiruddeen Usman Lere, a former Dean, Faculty of Law, BUK and former Deputy Director General of the Nigerian Law School, shed more light on the challenges at Law School. He remarked further that what was offered there within one year is equivalent to the entire 5 years of the undergraduate program, which made it no longer an easy task.

According to him, "The hard way is the only way" as there is no alternative or short cut path to success. He appealed to the students to be good ambassadors of Bayero University, Kano, and distinguish themselves by studying hard and passing out with flying colours.

Among the participants were two former outstanding students of the Law School, Barr. Aisha Abdullahi and Barr. Habeeb, who also shared their experiences with the students. They charged them to shun all forms of distraction, bad friends and vices. According to them, the priority was to maintain a balanced life, which meant to study hard and have enough rest and, above all, live within their means.

Other academic staff of the faculty also enjoined the students to be thoroughly prepared for the journey ahead of them and face their studies diligently and squarely.

Meet BUK's Iconic Penalty Kick Saver, Saifullahi Lawan

.. Emerges Best BUK Goalkeeper Back to Back

In recent times, Bayero University, Kano has never produced special and iconic penalty kick saver than the young diminutive goalkeeper, Saifullahi M. Lawan.

A Level 400 student of Political Science Department, young Lawan rose to prominence at the 14th Inter-Faculty games played last year, where he made ferocious saves in the football category to help his then Faculty of Social and Management Sciences reach the final after beating the Faculty of Communication 3-2 in the semi-final.

Of the three matches played by the Faculty of SMS last year, only one was won during the 90 minutes mark. Others were won through penalty shootouts. And the man behind winning those shootouts was Saifullahi Lawan.

At the 14th Interfaculty Games last year, the Faculty of Education might have won the football trophy but the outstanding player that shone like a million stars in the final match was Saifullahi Lawan, the goalkeeper of SMS. His impeccable timing and devastating mix of punching and logic defining saves singled him out as the best goalkeeper in the tournament. He was highly praised by most of the spectators that watched the final game between the Faculty of Education (the winner) and the Faculty of Social and Management Sciences.

At the just concluded 15th Inter-Faculty Games, where he represented Faculty of Social Science since the SMS was split into two, the popular goalkeeper continued from where he had stopped last year. His magic penalty saves manifested once again to the admiration of fans, football pundits and sports journalists.

In the quarter final, where the Faculty of Social Science and Faculty of Engineering competed, the inspirational goalkeeper saved two penalties to help his faculty to advance to the semi-final, where he would meet the same faculty that had defeated SMS at the 14th Inter-Faculty games football final, when he was in the faculty before its split.

At the semi-final, he once again helped the Faculty of Social Science to reach to the final through his heroism. He made outstanding saves that denied the Faculty of Education from winning out-rightly during an open play. He saved one in one situation for almost five times. The match ended 0-0 and during the penalty shootout,. Saifullahi Lawan saved two penalties in the semi-final to take his faculty to the historic final.

The final match, which took place on Saturday, 11th August, 2018 at Ahmed Adamu Mu'azu Stadium, BUK New Campus, saw the Faculty of Social Science compete with the Faculty of Computer Science and

Information Technology for the first time. Saifullahi Lawan proved to be the vital cog in his team by making incredible saves upon saves. At the end, the Faculty of Social Science won the final with a slim 1-0 victory. The impressive goalkeeper was rewarded as the man of the match.

When he was asked by *BUK Bulletin* on what his secrets were in terms of his magic saves and penalty shoot-out wonders, Saifullahi Lawan said his talent was from God Almighty. He also said that he used to train regularly and practise penalty saves.

According to him, he had a coach, who gave him an idea that if any player took a penalty kick, "I should closely monitor the direction of his eyes. Once we come in contact with his eyes, we will meet at the same direction where I will save his penalty. Indeed, penalty saves have become part and parcel of my football activities".

One thing is certain, Saifullahi Lawan will soon graduate, and the prospect of continuing his career as a footballer with a bright future remains widely open.


BUK Microfinance Bank Donates Water Dispenser to Drivers' Lounge
