## **Examination Misconduct:** BUK Expels 33 Students, Rusticates 12 and Warns 70 others

The Senate of Bayero University, at its 365th Meeting held on Thursday, 26th July, 2018 had approved the expulsion of 33 students for allegedly involved in various forms of examination misconduct during the first semester examinations in the current 2017/2018 academic session.

A statement signed by the Acting Director, Directorate of Examinations, Admissions and Records (DEAR), Hajiya Amina Umar Abdullahi and made available to BUK Weekly Bulletin, also revealed that 12 students were rusticated to repeat a session, while 70 others were served with a warning. Equally, two students were exonerated from any offence and two cases were deferred for further investigation. ...see full lists on page 6.

## **BUK's Centre for Qur'anic Studies Graduates First Set** of Trained Alarammomi

he first set of over 200 Qur'anic memorizers (Alarammomi) that were trained by the Bayero University's Centre for Qur'anic Studies graduated on Saturday, 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. The grand occasion took place at the Mahmud Tukur Theatre, Old Campus.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello described the occasion as not only historic, but 'a dream come true.'

He said Bayero University Management decided to set up the Centre as part of its effort to correct the earlier mistakes made in which Qur'anic memorizers (Alarammomi), though intellectuals in their own callings, but due to lack of western education, were relegated to the background and could not be allowed into the nation's scheme of things.

Professor Bello stated that the alarammomi underwent trainings in General Science, English, Elementary Arithmetic and Computer science as well as Teaching Methods. He stated that at the end of the training, they were on that day being certificated by the University. This will enable them secure employment as teachers, contest elective positions and even further their education to higher level 'if they chose so,' he remarked.

Earlier, the Director of the Centre, Dr. Muhammad Babangida Muhammad, had traced the history of the

establishment of the centre and gave kudos to the pioneer Director of the Centre, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad, as well as commended the foresight of the university's management for establishing the centre.

He said a total of 219 alarammomi were trained by the centre, adding that the centre strengthened the Qur'anic recitation of the trainees as well as exposed them to training in other western education courses. Dr. Babangida said the certificates that would be issued to them on that day, would qualify them to secure employment as teachers and as imams of juma'at mosques all over the Islamic world.

Also speaking, the Deputy Governor of Kano State, Professor Hafiz Abubakar; represented by Dr. Bakari Abubakar commended BUK for introducing the programme which, he said, would go a long way to accord alarammomi recognition as well as their rightful place in the nation's scheme of things.

Others who spoke were; Gwani Yusuf Sheikh Khalifa Isiaka Rabi'u, the Chief Imam of Kano, Professor Muhammad Sani Zahrandeen as well as the representative of the Deputy Governor of Zamfara State, Alhaji Wakala Mohammed and the Senior Special Assistant to the President on National Assembly Matters, Hon. Suleiman Abdurrahman Kawu.

kyline University, Nigeria, the first private university in Kano State, has expressed its willingness to collaborate and enjoy mentorship from Bayero University, having admitted its first set of students to commence their undergraduate programmes in September, this year.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor P. K Biswas, while speaking during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, on 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2018 at the Council Chamber, said they were well prepared to become one of the best universities

in Nigeria and Africa.

Professor Biswas expressed delight that some staff of Bayaro University, including the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, had been helping the university's fruitful take-off. He explained that their second set of students would commence their lectures in January 2019.

He said Skyline University had developed its curriculum and wanted to have entrepreneurship skills as its main focus, having targeted establishing incubation centres to provide excellent entrepreneurial skills. He expressed satisfaction that Bayero University, one of the leading universities in Nigeria, would be mentoring them for some years to achieve their aspiration, saying they were out to provide quality education with no compromise.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Bello, expressed appreciation to the National Universities Commission (NUC) for the mentoring role given to Bayero University. He said with the experience of the management of Skyline University in its UAE campus, the mentorship would become smooth, because the major issue was the environment in which the university would now operate.

Professor Bello expressed optimism that the private universities coming up in Nigeria would accommodate more candidates seeking admission. He said this year about 54, 000 candidates applied for admission into Bayero University. However, only about 7,000 would be given admission. He said "our role is to mentor and guide you; we are not going to interfere or influence decision on you in staff recruitment and other related matters."

He assured the Visitor that with closer proximity, Bayero University would do a lot, including ensuring effective staff development for Skyline University as done to other Tertiary Institutions in the region.




She told the Vice Chancellor about the need for the University to partner with JAMB in an effort to curtail the challenges leading to encountering problems by the

students in trying to register for their mandatory NYSC participation.

She explained that most of the problems emanate from lack of placing the JAMB registration numbers of students, which, she said, is more common with transfer students, especially those who transfer from universities abroad. She, however, said JAMB had introduced a method of displaying students' registration numbers for schools and universities to check for verification of the registration numbers of their graduands.

Mrs. Rahila said students



coming on transfer from universities abroad do not have JAMB registration numbers. This she said, they had to register and secure such numbers before their graduation to be able to proceed for the NYSC scheme. She urged

students with such and similar problems to liaise with their respective NYSC Liaison Officers at Student Affairs Divisions of their respective universities in good time to avoid encountering problems.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed gratitude to the NYSC secretariat for their concern to help the University and its students in solving problems militating against early proceeding to partake in the scheme. He assured the secretariat that Bayero University would continue to liaise with JAMB and NYSC secretariat to avoid such and similar problems.

## Sokoto Caliphate Was Set Up on the Principle of Justice and Rule of Law - Prof. Bunza By Rabi'u M. Sagir

The Islamic Political Class Committee of the Muslim Student's Society of Nigeria (MSSN) organized a seminar on Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2018 at Mahmud Tukur Theatre on the topic: *Sokoto Caliphate and What It Represents for Nigerian Muslims*.

The Guest Lecturer, Professor Mukthar Umar Bunza, Commissioner for Higher Education, Kebbi State, said Sokoto Caliphate was set up on the principles of justice and rule of law. It evolved into a quasi-federal system of emirates and local juridisctions with balanced responsibilities. One of the central functions of the Caliphate leadership included emirs or their equivalents mediating conflicts and forestalling any before it undermined the integrity of the state.

Professor Bunza said lack of prudence and accountability in public office had been the major cog in the wheels of the development of Nigerian as nation. The agencies responsible for checking the excesses of public servants should be strengthened for good governance and development. He said in the Sokoto Caliphate, Abdullahi ibn Fodiyo was in charge of the western flank and directed all governors and officers, as contained in *Diya'ul Hukkam*, that all public officers must declare their assets and interests before they assumed public responsibility and must do the same when they left office. For anyone found to have wealth above what he earned from his work, the ruler should confiscate and restore it to the treasury. The watch word of Sokoto Caliphate was Justice in theory and in practice.

Another speaker, Dr. Saidu Ahmad Dukawa from the Political Science Department urged Nigerian leaders to ensure good governance in the country through accountability and probity, transparency and equity, social security and welfare to alleviate poverty and encourage developmental skills in the populace.

The *Ameer* of the Association, Zubair A. Usman, in his welcome address called on Nigerian Muslims to abide by the rules and regulations of Islam, so as to apply the positive values of our religion in the practical activities in the society.
