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BUK to Get Centre for Public Procurement Research

he National Assembly will initiate a proposal for the establishment of a new Research Centre on Public Procurements with the view to enlightening members of the public on adhering to the principles of proper accountability and due process in public expenditure, the Chairman, House of Representatives Committee on Public Procurement, Honourable Wole Oke, has disclosed.

Speaking when he led other members of the Committee on a courtesy call to the Vice Chancellor at the VC's Committee Room on Monday, 10th December, 2018, Honourable Oke revealed that the establishment of the Centre would be part of the National Assembly's commitment to fighting corruption and its initiative of instilling the habit of the judicious utilization of public funds.

The Centre will be situated in Bayero University, Kano and the committee would make provision for it in the 2019 fiscal allocation. When fully operational, it would afford researchers to find other ways of minimizing corruption in the society. He said the Centre would cost about N250 million.

Speaking on their mission, Mr. Oke said his Committee was in Kano to interact with heads of the Procurement

Units of MDAs and tertiary institutions in Kano, Katsina and Jigawa states. He said his Committee was seriously disturbed by the growing incidence of corruption in Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs), particularly on the aspect of public procurement, hence the decision to embark on the visitation and interaction session.

Hon. Oke equally alerted public servants on the activities of some fraudsters, who formed a cartel by writing fictitious petitions with the view to extorting money from chief executives of parastatals through threats and intimidations. He, however, commended the management of Bayero University for its openness and prudent spendings.

While welcoming the legislative members, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed his delight over the visit and assured that the University would do everything humanly possible to support the Committee in the discharge of its responsibilities.

He appreciated its proposal to establish the new centre, explaining that, in view of its importance, the University Management had upgraded the Procurement Unit to a full-fledged directorate with a director heading it.

Emulate ANG Leadership Succession Bid, **VC Counsels**

Associations, Organizations and institutions have been advised to emulate the rancour-free and sustained leadership succession plan practised by the Association of Nigerian Geographers (ANG).

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. M. Y. Bello who gave the advice when he received the Council members of the Association, who paid him a courtesy call in his office on Saturday 8th December, 2018.

He said lack of appropriate planning was one of the major clogs in the wheel of the nation's development efforts, adding that 'planning remains one of the surest way of ensuring not only development, but also peace, stability and continuity of leadership, 'he counselled.

Professor Bello stated that "Bayero University had since realized the importance of planning. That is why before establishing any new Faculty or Department, we plan ahead and make sure that all the necessary

requirements are on ground. This has been the secret of our peace and stability," he remarked.

When he learnt from the President of the Association of Nigerian Geographers (ANG) that their leadership succession had always been rancour-free due to a sustained long term plan, Professor Bello was not surprised, because, according to him, 'it is always a two-way affair; you either plan to succeed or plan to fail, but in the case of the Geographers, they chose the former, which is highly commendable, 'he stated.

The Vice Chancellor told the Association that Geography as a course laid the foundation for the establishment of the University's new Faculty of Earth and

Environmental Sciences (FEES), adding that the President of their Association, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, was the pioneer Dean of the Faculty, who did his best to give the new Faculty direction and stability.

He said BUK had a culture of naming edifices after former Vice Chancellors, Chairmen of the Governing Council and such other prominent individuals for their contributions to the development of the University, but stated that because of the importance BUK attached to Geography, a theatre was named after Professor Olofin, who had been regarded as the father of Geography in Bayero University.

Professor Bello commended the association for its efforts to produce the association's journal regularly, saying that it showed how serious and determined the executive members were in running the affairs of the Association.

He thanked the Association for electing the University's Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, as their President and assured them that the University would do everything humanly possible to support him to succeed.

Earlier, the President of the Association, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, had told the Vice Chancellor that they were in BUK to hold their Council meeting, which was part of the Association's activities heralding the 60th conference of the Association, which would be hosted by Kaduna State University (KASU).

He said the BUK meeting would consider the proposal for the next Conference in Kaduna and discuss other issues that have something to do with the development of the Association and the nation in general.



Professor Tanko further revealed that one of the secrets behind the success, stability and peace within the association was their sustained planned succession in leadership. He explained that at the expiration of the tenure of the President of the Association, the 1st Vice President automatically became the new President, while the 2nd Vice President assumed the office of the 1st Vice President and the 3rd Vice President was elevated to be the 2nd Vice President. Lastly, a new 3rd Vice President was then elected. This system, according to Professor Tanko, had succeeded in giving the Association peace, stability and a sense of belonging.

The President thanked the Vice Chancellor for his support to the Association and assured him that, as the President of the Association, he would be a good ambassador of the University.



Sarkin Kano Muhammad Sanusi II Suggests Teaching in Nigerian Vernacular Languages By Lamara Garba

Sarkin Kano, Malam Muhammadu Sanusi II has reiterated the need for Nigerian government to adopt the use of mother tongues for teaching in our conventional institutions of learning at all levels across the country.

Speaking while declaring open the second edition of the Kano Literary Week on Thursday, 6th December, 2018 at Murtala Muhammad Library Complex, he said, if adopted, the policy would go a long way in promoting our culture in addition to making students understand their programmes of study more. The Theme of the conference was **Creative Writing As A Tool for Enhancing Democracy.**

He said even advanced countries in the world had been practising the same policy. "If one is to study in Japan, one must learn the Japanese language, so also in China, Malaysia, Germany, France, Italy, Portugal, Saudi Arabia, Iran, Russia and Greece, among others, so, why can't we also here in Nigeria adopt the same policy," he advised.

According to him, the initial books written in Science, Medicine, Mathematics and others were all in Arabics, but they were translated into English for our own understanding. He pointed out that our academics could as well translate the English books into our major languages for use in our schools.

The Royal father said that it is only through education that Nigeria could get out of its present socio-economic and political predicament. Malam Sanusi reiterated that any society that relegated education to the background was bound to continue to be backward in global affairs.


He commended the organizers of the programme, explaining that education was too important to be allowed for government alone to handle. He suggested that every person in the society should have a role to play in the development of the sector.

Earlier, in his welcome address, the Chairman of the Association of Nigerian Authors (ANA), Kano State Chapter, Malam Zaharaddeen Ibrahim Kallah, said ANA was very much concerned about the issue of poverty, dwindling standards of education, corruption, inequality and bad governance.

According to him, however, as a group of writers, they were determined to look at these problems and raise a massive campaign towards addressing them.

In his paper, Professor Habu Muhammad charged that organizations, such as ANA, have a crucial role to play in creating awareness among the teeming youth, especially in relation to mobilizing the public towards improving and salvaging education from imminent collapse.

At the end of the conference, about 25 eminent personalities were presented with awards of honour, including the DVC (Academics), Prof. Adamu idris Tanko, VC NOUN, Prof. Abdalla Uba Adamu, VC, Yusuf Maitama Sule University, Prof. Mustapha Isa, Professor Aliyu Kamal, the ANA Chairman, Zaharaddeen Ibrahim Kallah, Alhaji Bashir Tofa, Engineer Y. Z. Ya'u and former ANA Secretary, Abdulkadir Badsha Mukhtar, among others.
