

Prof. Riskuwa Acknowledges the Role of Universities on Elections

-Wonders How Elections Could be Without Universities

(REC), Professor Riskuwa Adamu Shehu, has extolled the virtues of Nigerian universities in playing a critical role in the democratic processes, including the contributions they render during the conduct of the general elections.

Professor Riskuwa said during a courtesy visit on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello,

"I wonder how the elections will be without the contribution of the Nigerian universities." He said his visit to the Vice Chancellor was to seek support for making the 2019 general elections a better one.

He assured the Vice Chancellor that under his leadership, INEC in Kano state would look at the national interest. He reaffirmed that the oath of office on which he was sworn was very much closer to his bed as a constant reminder and, as such, he said, every blessing

> He told the Vice Chancellor that his door was very much open for pieces of advice as he relied heavily on the contributions of Bayero University, Kano. He said the INEC would fine-tune the processes right from the selection of the ad-hock staff that will be recruited to partake in the elections.

> > Professor Riskuwa said the job in INEC was not for the staff of the INEC only. Other important stakeholders including members of the university community have greater role to play towards achieving the desired goal. He assured that INEC would only consider people who will not compromise good for evil.

> > Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Bello, assured his willingness to support INEC toward conducting a hitch-free election. He said in 2015 Bayero University submitted to INEC a list of people who had no inclination to any political party.

Professor Bello urged the current INEC on Tuesday 20th February, 2018 in the letter's office that leadership to improve on the legacies of the former INEC Chairman, Professor Attahiru Jega, instituted at the commission, adding that the free Convocation Lecture he delivered at Bayero University ahead of the last general elections testified his willingness to revolutionalise INEC and elections in the country.

> He congratulated the Kano REC and challenged him to come up with the ideas that could make a difference in the conduct of the 2019 general elections.

BUK Seeks PTDF's Solace to Rescue its Dept. of Electrical Engineering

Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has appealed to the Petroleum Technology Development Fund (PTDF) to come to the aid of the Department of Electrical Engineering, saying the defects resulting from the soil-foundation failure threatened the Department as inhabitable.

Speaking on Wednesday, 14th February, 2018 when he visited the Executive Secretary of the PTDF in his Abuja office, the Vice Chancellor said the multi-million Naira

he Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Electrical Engineering Departmental complex was constructed and donated to the University by the PTDF as part of its intervention to education.

> Professor Bello said the intervention had enabled the Department to grow in terms of the number of programmes it ran, student enrolment and the number of its academic staff. He said six of the laboratories in the building had been abandoned due to the danger they pose.

The Vice Chancellor expressed appreciation to the Fund and continued to benefit from the PTDF's Overseas and Management for its intervention in some areas, including capacity building in petroleum technology

Local Scholarship Schemes for its staff and students.

Responding, the Executive Secretary, PTDF, Alhaji

Bello Aliyu Gusau, congratulated the Bayero University for being the first institution in Nigeria to respond to the intervention of the Fund. He assured that PTDF would look at the possibility of coming to the rescue of the Department.

Alhaji Gusau said the expansion of the Electrical Engineering Department and intervention in other institutions would go a long way in training Nigerians within the Fund's mandate and with minimum amount of funds compared to the amount being spent in foreign countries for similar purposes.

Committee on Repositioning Universities Lauds BUK's Unity, Transformation - Challenges Other Varsities to Emulate

The Chairman of the National Universities Commission (NUC) on Repositioning University Education in Nigeria, Professor Peter Okebukola, said he was amazed by the huge transformation Bayero University had recorded that enabled it to serve as an island of successes to tell others and even the world to know the cracking record.

The Chairman, who was the former NUC Executive Secretary, disclosed that they were in Kano to study BUK as an example of how to run a modern university with a view to fuse the document into the system for others to emulate.

Professor Okebukola said as part of the mandate given to the Committee by the NUC, Bayero University was among the institutions selected as a case study. He said the Federal Government set-up the Committee in order to have a befitting system that could finetune education across Nigerian universities. He mentioned that some four years back when his research group decided to use a report of committees to revitalise

education in Nigeria; he extracted all the resolutions of the summits on education by stakeholders and found that 85 percent of the conclusions were the same.

He narrated his experience on the conference of UNESCO Global Universities Network for Education in 1989 that set-up the artwork on how universities could keep to innovations. He said currently there were 1902





universities across the African Continent under the leadership of Vice Chancellors, Rectors, Presidents, etc as applicable to different countries.

He said the mandate was also to look at unique angles and grasp to show examples on how people were able to make a difference. Bayero University, he said, had done it.

He expressed delight that, on arrival at the airport, members of the Committee were served with a document in which for every term of reference of their assignment, Bayero University had put its input to it. The document contained all the units in the University and answered the questions they proposed to ask. He said this singular attribute BUK had should be enjoyed by other universities.

The Chairman expressed delight that the impasses experienced in other universities, including misunderstanding between Vice Chancellors and their Deputies or between the Management and Unions or Management and University Councils, were not experienced in Bayero University.

He disclosed the composition of the Committee as follows: the former Minister of Education, Professor Rukayya Ahmad Rufa'i and former Vice Chancellors, including Professor Attahiru Jega, and some Directors from the NUC.

Bello, congratulated NUC for including people in the Committee, acknowledging that if anybody could make a difference, there was no better committee than this one with this composition.

He said, "We are overwhelmed, we are apprehensive, BUK acted on the terms of reference to see if there is any gap". He added, "We want to see if we can build a system that can stand time, the one that can be sustained".

Professor Bello said, "Let us learn the good practices from each other here in Nigeria, learning in Nigeria will be good due to environmental reason but the global one is also relevant if we are to make headway".

The Vice Chancellor disclosed the cordial relationship that exists between the Management and unions and between Council and Management and also between the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as between the University Management and students.

BUK Bulletin reports that after extensive discussion of about four hours on how BUK was being run, the Committee went for a tour of all the campuses. In the New Campus, they inspected CDA, Faculty of Agriculture, the Moot Court in Faculty of Law, Faculty of Education and some other places, including some new projects. The members overwhelmingly commended the University management and expressed the hope that other universities would achieve similar development.

Moreover, the programme is jointly sponsored by the Department and the Nigerian Government. In essence, six states, including Kano State, were selected to benefit from the intervention through the ESSIPIN office in each State, while the ESSPIN main office operates within the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) Office, Abuja.
