# CHS Inducts 49 Doctors, 8 Dentists

## -Aminu Ado Wakili Emerges Overall Best Graduand

he College of Health Science of Bayero University has inducted 49 medical Doctors and 8 Dentists during which Aminu Ado Wakili has emerged the as overall best graduand as well as the best in Paediatrics, Community Medicine, Surgery and Pathology.

At the 17<sup>th</sup> induction ceremony of Doctors and the 2<sup>nd</sup> induction of Dentists conducted on Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 at the Convocation Arena, New Campus, also Rahilat Lami Abdulkadir emerged best in Internal Medicine and best in Pharmacology while Bilkisu Yakubu Yusif emerged best in Obstetrics and Gynaecology.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, at the occasion expressed his happiness on the gender distribution of doctors among the MBBS celebrants with almost equal proportion among the male and female graduands.

He reiterated the importance of having female doctors in the society and noted, however, that only one female Dentist was among the eight who graduated this time. The balance was reflected more in the subsequent set of dentists.

The Provost of the College of Health Science, Professor Sani Alhasan, expressed delight over the support of the University Management to the College. He also commended the efforts of other stakeholders, particularly agencies and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, for working hand-in-hand with the College.

The Chief Medical Director of Aminu Kano Teaching

Hospital (AKTH) at the occasion assured the graduates that, despite the difficulty in employing House Officers, AKTH had delayed their interview until the current Doctors and Dentists had graduated. He assured them of available slots for Housemanship in the hospital.

The Head of Kano State Civil Service and Commissioner for Health both assured the Kano state indigenes who were inducted of automatic recruitment as House Officers in the state Specialists Hospital and chronicled some progress made by the current state government in the renovation of various healthcare facilities as well as the completion of the two hospitals at Giginyu and Zoo Road, which were commissioned by President Muhammadu Buhari on his recent visit to the state.

The commissioner also stated that the state government was in the process of signing a MoU with a reputable healthcare firm that would manage the affairs of the two hospitals under a board constituted by the state Governor.

The peak of the event was the induction conducted by the Registrar of the Medical and Dentist Council of

Nigeria (MDCN) during which the Registrar encourage the University to expand the College of Health Sciences by establishing a Faculty of Basic Clinical Sciences, as obtained in other colleges of medicine across the country.

The Chairman of the Nigerian Medical Association in his goodwill message welcomed the celebrants to the Profession. He advised the inductees of the importance of the task ahead of them. He reminded them to regard always the internship period as a learning process and learn from all the members of the healthcare team. He urged them to know their limits without inflicting harm on anybody and that they should refer and call for the help of their seniors when they were unsure about something.

The Deputy Dean of Dentistry, Dr Kelvin Omeje, commended the efforts of the University and other stakeholders toward the performance of the College of Health Science. He also noted the efforts of the organizing committee that worked tirelessly to ensure that the induction programme was hitch free.
