

2017 RETREAT VC Unveils Score Card...

- Says Senate Building to be Put to Use This Year

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has disclosed the intention of the University Management to complete the first three floors of Abubakar Rasheed Senate Building and put them to use, including making it possible for Senate meetings and some offices to be moved there before the end of this year.

Speaking on Wednesday, 10th January, 2018, during the 2017 Management Retreat at Asaa Pyramid Hotel, Kaduna, Prof. Bello said the management was working tirelessly to ensure the completion of other projects, including the

International Conference Centre.

He also disclosed that the University Council had approved the Implementation Plans and Strategies developed by the Strategic Plan Committee, which would be printed and distributed during this quarter.

Professor Bello said work for the largest solar energy plant in the country to give 1,000-kilowatt at the Old Campus was expected to be completed this month. He also expressed delight that the University had secured the NUC full accreditation of its 25 programmes, which were

assessed by accreditation teams in 680 teaching and non-teaching staff across cadres November/December, 2016.

Following the Industrial Court's ruling that favoured Universities' unions on the status of staff primary schools, he said a committee had been set up on how best to implement the ruling, including reviewing activities of the school to improve the quality.

The Vice Chancellor said more PG Resource Centres would be established in the effort to improve the quality of research and postgraduate studies; he appreciated the University's securing of various competitive grants from international bodies and agencies.

Professor Bello expressed delight with other achievements recorded in 2017, and disclosed that even though the Federal Government had stopped providing funds for the DTLC, the University had sustained provision of the funds from IDF.

The University, he said, had in 2017 promoted teaching.

and promised to continue encouraging staff through promotions. He noted that during the year, over 156 million naira was expended on teaching staff for conference attendance and study fellowships while the non-teaching staff had benefitted from over 13 million naira on fellowship, conference attendance and workshops.

The Vice Chancellor said 143 staff had benefitted from research grants to the tune of 50, 185, 786 naira. The University, he said, gave priority to those pursuing higher degrees in addition to various scholarships offered to students.

He thanked the Chancellor, Pro-Chancellor, the Principal Officers, Unions, Staff, Donor Agencies, Students and other Stake Holders for their enamours cooperation with the University. He assured of his continuous efforts to strengthen the University's administration, research and

Restriction on Indiscriminate Bush Burning In Campus

Due to the current dry (Hamattan) season, members of the University Community are hereby reminded to clear the surroundings of their office blocks and houses from dry grasses/weeds to guard against fire incidence. There were several reports of fire incidents from both offices and residential quarters premises most from unknown cause. Those residing in the Campuses and Zoo Road staff quarters are required to caution their children/wards and house-helps against indiscriminate setting of fire either within the surrounding premises of their houses or surrounding bush. Parents should ensure that matches/lighters are kept out of the reach of children.

Members of the University Community are to please note that it is not permissible to use bush-burning as a means of clearing surrounding premises of houses or Office blocks. However, small heaps of trimmed dry grass can be burn within house premises when necessary but under strict supervision and must be ensured that it burns off completely under someone's careful supervision. Lighting fire and abandoning the site is not allowed. Any person that uses fire deliberately as a means of bush clearing, thereby causing damage or loss to University or an individual's property as a result of careless handling of fire, in addition to any penalty that may be imposed by the University Authority, shall be held liable and surcharged for the repairs of the damage or loss of the property, as the case may be.
