



BUK to Introduce New Concepts in Medical Studies - VC

The management of Bayero University is making some elaborate efforts to bring new concepts and innovations in the teaching modules of medical programmes with the view to improving the existing system for a qualitative medical personnel, the Vice Chancellor Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello has disclosed.

Speaking on Wednesday, 18th July, 2018 at the Council Chamber when he received delegations from the Nebraska University in the United States of America, Professor Bello said already a team of academics to be led by the Provost of the College of Health Sciences would embark on a study tour in the United States and other developed countries.

Professor Bello, in particular, said it was high time to be using simulation in medical training, explaining that the rate of maternal mortality in Nigeria was very high, particularly in the Northern region, which therefore called for a concerted efforts towards addressing the situation.

“We shall modernize our medical teaching process by making use of simulation in medical training. It was on this note that the management was sending a team of academics to some countries with the view of getting more inputs as well as of studying how best we can actualize our goal,” said the Vice Chancellor.

Professor Bello assured the visitors that Bayero University would be ever ready to collaborate with Nebraska University in this respect and many other ways towards improving the quality of medical training, which would translate into providing qualitative health care delivery.

Earlier, the Provost of the College of Health Sciences,

Professor Ibrahim Yakasai, told the Vice Chancellor that the delegation, who were a team of investigators and researchers on medical field, particularly on pediatrics and infant mortality, were in Nigeria for quite some time conducting their research at AKTH.

According to him, the University in general and the College of Health Sciences would benefit a lot from the team, being experts in children and other related health problems, pointing out that BUK and Nebraska University shared many things in common and, therefore, working with them would go a long way in making Bayero University excel in the global ranking in research and training.

In his address, the Team leader, Professor Richard G. Azizkhan, who is also the President and Chief Executive of the Children Hospital and Medical Centre, Omaha, of the University of Nebraska in the United States, said they were in Nigeria to study the prevalent cases of pediatric medical problems and to find out how best to collaborate with relevant agencies in tackling the menace.

“We are passionate about working with academics in the health services in order to improve the quality of health care delivery. That was why we came here. We are free standing and independent health facility in the United States with over 2000 trainees that come to us from all over the world every year. In this respect, we hope to find a good collaborator in BUK so that together, we shall save our children by improving on their health status,” he declared. Other members of the team included Professor Kathy English, who is the Chief Operating Officer of the Children Hospital and Medical Centre, and Professor Stephen Obaro.

31st Professorial Inaugural Lecture: Nigeria Loses 80b Naira Yearly on Road Accidents - Professor Alhassan

Professor Hashim Mohammed Alhassan of the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering, said that every year Nigeria lost property worth eighty billion naira as a result of road accidents and that many people also lost their lives.

Professor Alhassan disclosed this while presenting

31st Professorial Inaugural Lecture titled, **Easing the Burden of Travel: Can Roadway Capacity Modelling Help?** held at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium on Thursday, 19th July, 2018.

He said federal roads, carry 70% of freight and services

and 90% of the socio-economic activities in the country, regrettably were often beset by poor maintenance, inadequate or non-existent pavement markings and poor control of access to abutting property.

Another problem of roads in Nigeria, according to Professor Alhassan, was, in urban areas where proper control was not established on them, causing long distance travelers to be interfered by local traffic.

Professor Mohammed Alhassan maintained that the road and highway system was an important asset for the circulation of people and goods for sustaining the economic and social life of a city or region. "The convenient, comfort and the ease of travel on our road network is largely dependent on managing capacity and access to our arterial network. Our road network, our convenience" Professor Alhassan added.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was also the Chairman of the occasion, in his speech thanked the professorial inaugural lecture committee for organizing the lecture regularly. He said the University was ready to host this kind of lecture even on a weekly basis.

Professor Bello congratulated Professor Hashim Alhassan for delivering the professorial lecture, which he described as the second of its kind from the Faculty of Engineering. He called on the other professors from the Faculty and the University in general to emulate him.

Professor Riskuwa during a courtesy visit on Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, on Monday, 23rd July, 2018 at the Council Chamber, urged members of the University community to come out to register for their voters' card just as the Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, assured INEC of the University's willingness to partner with the team in terms of support even beyond expectations.

INEC is partnering with the European Union, ECOWAS, European Centre for Electoral Support (ECES) and the Youth Initiative for Advocacy Growth and Advancement (YIAGA) for the voter education in the zone. The maiden programme was held at the University of Abuja and

10,785 Candidates Write BUKAT

About ten thousand seven hundred and eighty five prospective candidates sat for the Bayero University Aptitude Test (BUKAT) seeking for admission into various undergraduate programmes for the 2018/2019 academic session.

The examination, which commenced at 8:00am in the morning of Thursday, 26th July 2018 was conducted at both Old and New Campuses of the University and was

Speaking shortly after going round the examination halls, Professor Sagir Abbas, expressed delight at the peaceful and orderly conduct of the candidates. He said this year the University did not encounter any form of malpractice and commended the staff who participated in the exercise for

The Deanery felt that it was necessary to invite the stakeholders and intimate them about the importance of the election.

The Dean enjoined the BUKIECO officials to live up to the expectation accorded to them and carry out all their assignments throughly with a sense of fairness and fair

play and exercise their constitutional rights as being truly independent. He also called on the aspirants to know that mainstream politics starts here; therefore, they should accept defeat and victory in good faith.

Dr. Umar further charged them to desist from hiring mercenaries from outside capable of causing violence and failure, as this will attract stiff penalties.

The Deputy Deans of Old and New Campus, Dr. Umar Sani and Dr. Dahiru Sani Shuaibu, as well as the Deputy Registrar in charge of Student Affairs, Hajiya Anisatu Uwais, advised the students to play the rule by the game and work as a team to conduct free, fair and unbiased elections.

The BUKIECO was also advised to try as much as possible to rebuild confidence in the minds of the students by sanitizing all forms of electoral processes, ranging from cautioning aspirants against pasting posters on university walls and organizing healthy presidential debates.

BUK's Students of Banking and Finance, Others to Get Dual Certificates Upon Graduation

Preparations are underway to provide a platform in which students from the Department of Banking and Finance and other relevant departments of the University will get dual certificates issued by both the academic degree department and a professional body upon graduation, the Dean of the newly rebranded Faculty of Management Sciences, Professor Kabir Tahir Hamid, has revealed.

Speaking on Saturday, June 30th, 2018 at the Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages, Translation and Folklore during the opening ceremony of a workshop on Credit Risk Management and Debt Recovery Strategies in Micro-Finance Banks, organized by the Department in collaboration with the Chattered Institute of Bankers of Nigeria (CIBN), Professor Hamid, who also doubled as the Head of Department of Banking and Finance, said the desire was to ease the process of joining the membership of professional bodies, such as CIBN and others.

“It is worthy to mention that, presently, the Department is exploring additional areas of collaboration with CIBN, which include, but not restricted to, the following:

Student membership, where undergraduate students in the Department and other sister Departments in the University will write the qualifying examinations of the Institute while pursuing their studies, so that upon graduation, they will be awarded with two certificates both by the University and the Institute,” he disclosed.

According to him, the workshop, which was the first of its kind, was meant to develop the capacity and competence of staff of microfinance banks, in particular, CIBN members and other interested members of the general public, in general, in effective and strategic handling of credit risks and debt recovery issues in their organizations.

Professor Hamid also disclosed that he was making some efforts with a view to rebranding the Masters in Banking and Finance (MBF) program with MBF/ACIB, thereby enabling the award of two certificates in one programme.

Three presentations were made by reputable seasoned academics and professional bankers, on “Fundamentals of Qualitative Risk Management by Kabir Tahir Hamid, “Contemporary Challenges in Microfinance Banks' Credit Risk Management and Debt Recovery” by Yusuf Ahmed Gyallesu, *FCNA, MCIB, ACITN*, Managing Director/CEO NUT Endwell Microfinance Bank Ltd. Kaduna and “Debt Recovery Strategies and Procedures” by Nasir Mansur Mohammed.

The Dean said in view of the importance of such workshop, they were mulling the idea of making it a quarterly event. He, however, expressed appreciation to the management of the University for their Unrelenting Support and encouragement, promising to justify the confidence reposed in them.
