Proffer Workable Solutions to the Nation's Food Insecurity - VC Challenges Varsity Agric Deans By Bala G. Abdullahi

he Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has challenged Deans of Agriculture in Nigerian University to come up with not only a workable solution but also a practical breakthrough that would address the issue of food insecurity, which remains a major stumbling block to the much desired development of the country.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, was speaking at the opening ceremony of a 4-Day Annual General Meeting/Conference of the Association of Deans of Agriculture in Nigeria University (ADAN), which opened on Tuesday, 3rd July, 2018 at the Faculty of Agriculture's Auditorium.

Professor Bello was worried that, despite the

abundance of arable land in the country coupled with the fact that a lot of people had responded to the present administration's call to return to farm, yet people were still hungry. 'Why should this be so?' he queried.

He said the above scenario called for concerted efforts on the part of experts in the field of agriculture to team up with the government to find solutions to these food challenges facing the country. 'This is the more reason why the theme of the Conference; Stimulating Local Agricultural Production towards Food Security in Nigeria became apt. 'I urge you to take the bull by its horns and put heads together to come up with a possible way out,' he appealed.

The Vice Chancellor told the participants of the successes recorded by the University in the area of infrastructural development, research and scholarship, particularly on dryland agriculture through the

university's Centre for Dryland Agriculture, and stated that 'BUK's door is open for collaboration with universities and all research centres in the country'.

He thanked the Association for choosing BUK to host the AGM/Conference and advised the participants to spare time and go round the campuses of the University to see things for themselves.

In her welcome address, the National President of the Association of Deans of Agriculture in Nigerian University (ADAN), Professor Folusho M. David-Abraham, had told the participants that this AGM/Conference was the 62nd in the series of AGM's being held by the association. She said initially only AGM's were being held and because of the realization that young academics in the field of Agriculture needed to be groomed, the association decided to arrange for the Conference to be held simultaneously with the AGM.

Professor David-Abraham stated that this year's AGM/Conference would focus on the ways to improve the participation of Faculties/Colleges of Agriculture in addressing the problem of food availability, accessibility, stability and adequacy.

She also said the struggle of professionalism of Agriculture would form a major part of their

deliberations, while the problems of unemployment and underemployment of the graduates from Universities would be extensively discussed. She thanked the management of BUK for not only accepting to host the programme, but also for their hospitality.

In his address, the Chairman of the occasion, Ado Abdullahi, represented by Alhaji Umar Mohammed Kura, observed with satisfaction that the gathering was the engine room of agricultural development, adding that it was his hope that participants would brainstorm with a view to finding solutions to key problems of agriculture in the country. He then wished the participants a happy and hitch-free AGM/Conference.

Earlier, the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Bayero University, Professor Ahmed Bakori Mohammed, had traced the history of BUK's Faculty of Agriculture to 2002, which, he said, started with only three Departments and today had matured with about eight Departments. He commended the management of the university under the leadership of Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello for all the supports in ensuring that all their undergraduate and postgraduate programmes maintain excellent academic records and secure full accreditation status from the NUC.

Training:<u>By Mustapha M. Gide</u> DG ITF Eulogises BUK's Management

Director General and Chief Executive Officer of Industrial Training Fund (ITF), Sir Joseph N. Ari, has eulogised the foresight of Bayero University Management for training its 166 drivers on driving and automobile mechanic repairs that exposed them to driving skills and technical knowhow, saying

that they were acquainted with the techniques of life saving and first aid to impaired vehicles before being moved to the automobile mechanic workshop in event of electrical or mechanical challenges.

Speaking at the closing of a 5-week training for the University's drivers on Friday, 29th June, 2018 at the ITF office in Kano, he charged other universities and organisations to emulate Bayero University. He said,

for the first time in ten years, ITF had witnessed unique encouragement by the University, which no other organisation had demonstrated.

The Director General, who was represented by Alhaji Hashim bn Umar, on behalf of the ITF Training Manager, Kano, Alhaji Umar Auta Ibrahim, described Bayero University drivers as a disciplined contingent, which needed to be emulated by others, adding that the training was conducted in 7 batches from 14th May to 29th June, 2018.

He said ITF would continue to monitor the drivers for some time through visits to the University, having also handed over training packages and

modules to all the beneficiaries. In addition, he called on the University Management to extend such patronage to other staff of the University.

The Head of Automobile Mechanic and Workshop Coordinator, Alhaji Salisu Muhammad Jinjiri, said the drivers were engaged in practical and theoretical aspects of auto-mechanic repairs and driving skills that exposed them to distinct learning. He added that "ITF has been training drivers from different parts of the country; however, we have seen what we were expecting of a University during this particular training."

The Registrar, Hajiya Fatima Binta Mohammed, expressed gratitude to the Vice Chancellor, Professor

Muhammad Yahuza Bello, for facilitating the training. She confessed that there was no distinction between all the categories of staff in the University, hence its rapid development. She also commended ITF for the extensive training that would go a long way in saving lives and property.

One of the beneficiaries, Sabi'u Baba, said the training changed their perceptions about driving. He added "we were acquainted with the prerequisites of a real professional driver, having taught driving skills and maintenance, including solving brain box problem and many challenges of auto electricity and mechanics."

> According to her, health care in Nigeria was prone to so many problems, which were attributed to the fact that health services were in great demand but accessibility to the facilities was low.

> Earlier, Professor Sunusi Abubakar of the Department of

Community Health, in his key note address, defined health as a complete state of physical, mental and social wellbeing and Physical and Health Education as the study, practices and appreciation of the art and science of human movement. He added that ill-health was on the increase because of global financial meltdown, weak health system and low budget for health.
