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Nigeria Needs to Reform Its Education Curriculum ...Kano State Deputy Governor

or Nigeria to witness accelerated growth and development, it must review its educational curriculum to be in conformity with the global best practices, especially in science and technology, the Deputy Governor of Kano State and Commissioner of Education, Professor Hafiz Abubakar, has advocated.

Speaking exclusively to the members of the BUK Media Team during an interview in his office on Monday, 28th May, 2018, Professor Abubakar suggested that the country stood to benefit more if the teaching modules in our tertiary institutions could be reviewed to include 50-50 between teaching and industrial attachment.

According to him, our world nowadays was living on a premium of skills. As such, we, as a nation, must equally adopt this policy for us to prosper and develop. A four-year degree program should be divided into two for students. While two years would be in school learning the theoretical aspects of the program, the other half should be at industrial attachments to gain practical knowledge and experience.

"I am of the opinion that we need to reform our educational curriculum to adopt the policy of sharing the training period equally between classroom teaching and industrial attachment for our students of


tertiary institutions. By so doing, we shall achieve maximum result in both theoretical and practical aspect in all the areas of learning," he opined.

According to him, while already some courses, such as Medicine in particular, had for a very long time adopted such a policy of mixing teaching and practical experience in hospitals, so also our technologists, scientists, administrators and all aspects of our education should have equal periods of attending lectures as well as participating in practical work in

industries and organizations.

Meanwhile, the Deputy Governor had revealed that the foreign scholarship policy adopted by the previous administrations had yielded positive dividends, as a great number of the beneficiaries were among the pioneer teaching staff of the Yusuf Maitama Sule University and other new tertiary institutions established across the country.

He said that the policy, which had positively impacted on the lives of the people of the State, was maintained by the present administration even as it secured a number of partnerships and collaborations with many countries.



Already, the Government of France had entered into partnership with the Kano State Government on the provision of fellowship for Postgraduate studies in top French Universities.

Also, the Government of Cyprus had given 15 P.hD fellowships to Kano state every year for which they gave priority to teaching staff from tertiary institutions, including Bayero University. Currently, over 50 staff from various institutions in the state have been undergoing their postgraduate programmes in those countries under the program.

NDLEA Refutes Consumption of 3 Million Bottles of Codeine in Kano

he Commander of National Drugs Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) in Kano, Hamza Umar, has refuted the story being circulated that three million bottles of codeine are consumed daily in Kano. He said the command was yet to see who conducted the research, the methodology used and how he arrived at the figure.

Mr. Umar was speaking on Saturday, 2nd June, 2018 at annual Ramadan lecture organized by Islamic Forum of Nigeria held at Bayero University, Kano.

"I challenge any person who has any evidence of the consumption of three million bottles of codeine in Kano to make it public. I made this challenge at NTA programme, but up to now, nobody dares to justify the claim," Mr. Umar argued. He attributed the widespread of drug abuse to people's non-challant attitude towards the menace.

"Some quarters in Kano city have made a tremendous

effort through community based organizations in checkmating drugs supply and consumption in their domain," Mr. Umar said.

In his address, the Acting Governor of Kano State, Professor Hafiz Abubakar, said Kano State government is planning to establish an agency on fighting drugs.

Prof Abubakar said the government had approved organizing a retreat for the staff of the state's Ministry of Justice along with members of State House of Assembly to develop a draft law that will facilitate the establishment of the agency. He, therefore, appealed to Islamic Forum of Nigeria and other associations fighting drug abuse in Kano to submit their memorandum to Kano State Ministry of Justice.

The Deputy Governor explained that Kano State government is constructing the women wing at Kiru Reformatory Institute for drug addicts to accommodate female addicts.

The Acting Governor commended the Emir of Kano, Malam Muhammad Sanusi II, for initiating social reform programme in Kano, which, he said, would go a long way in addressing social vices including drug abuse.

In a paper titled The Dangers of Drug Abuse and Ways of Combating it, a lecturer in the Faculty of Communication, Bayero University, Kano, Malam Bala Muhammad, cited a statistic which identified Benin Republic as the second largest importer of Tramadol in the world beside United States of America.

He observed that Benin Republic became a smuggling hub in West Africa, where most of the imported drugs find their way into Nigeria.

> Malam Muhammad, therefore, advocated a stiff penalty to drug suppliers and marketers, as is done in Malaysia, Singapore and China, and called for the review of the existing laws on drug abuse to capture contemporary challenges.

> Also speaking, a Presidential candidate in the annulled June 12 election, Alhaji Bashir Othman Tofa, lamented poor remuneration and lack of necessary tools as factors affecting the fight against drugs in Kano. Mr. Tofa appealed to federal and state governments to allocate enough resources in fighting the menace.

> In his address, the Chairman of Islamic Forum of Nigeria, Ahmad Daku, said the topic of the lecture was selected based on the prevalence of

substance abuse especially among youth and women.

Mr. Daku, a retired General in the Nigerian Army, who served as a military governor in Kano and Sokoto states, said the forum had found that almost each family was being affected by the menace.

The Executive Secretary of the Forum, Professor Salisu Shehu, said a stakeholders' meeting would be convened after *Eid-el Fitr* festival to develop an action plan in the crusade against drug abuse.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Sagir Abbas urged the security agencies in the state to take necessary measures to address this challenge of drug abuse.

Health Tips on Cholera!!!

Cholera is a water-borne, acute gastrointestinal infection caused by the *Vibrio cholerae* bacterium.

- ✓ **Signs and symptoms:** Cholera causes profuse, watery diarrhoea and vomiting. Most people suffer only a mild infection, but serious cases can lead to severe dehydration and, without rapid treatment, death.
- ✓ **Transmission:** A person becomes infected by ingesting the bacteria in contaminated water or food or direct contact with contaminated surfaces.

Cholera outbreaks occur when there is a breakdown of sanitary conditions and food hygiene procedures in a community. This can occur when:

- ✓ There are overflowing drainages, which then contaminate sources of drinking water and are eventually consumed by individuals in a community
- ✓ Poor food hygiene practices are employed during the stages of food handling, preparation and storage

Preventive Measures include:

- ✓ Improved environmental hygiene practicesproper handling and disposal of waste, clearing drainages.
- ✓ Protection of sources of drinking water-water chlorination
- ✓ Improved food hygiene practices-ensuring all foods are properly cooked and well preserved, washing fruits and vegetables before consumption and properly washing hands before meals
- ✓ Increased hand hygiene practices-particularly before and after handling or preparing food and after using sanitary facilities; after cleaning your child's bottom; after taking care of someone affected with diarrhea; before feeding your children.
- ✓ Use only water that has been boiled and water that has been chemically disinfected or bottled water.

NB: If you develop severe, watery diarrhea and vomiting, seek medical help immediately. If left untreated, cholera can be fatal in a matter of hours.
