wo renowned oral and maxillofacial surgeons from Indrapratha University (India) and Glasgow University (United Kingdom) have shown interest to serve as visiting fellows in Bayero University's Faculty of Dentistry.

Professor Dhirendra Srivastava from Indraprastha University of Delhi, India and Professor Ashraf Ayoub from Glasgow University in the United Kingdom have committed themselves to come to BUK as visiting lecturers with the view of contributing to strengthen the Dentistry programme.

The duo spoke separately during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello by the Executive Board of the National Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons on Friday, 23rd November, 2018. They were overwhelmed by the management of BUK's enthusiasm, focus, zeal and commitment to become a model centre of learning especially in the medical profession.

They were in Kano as resource persons for the association's national conference. As soon as the agreement is finalized, they will be visiting the university in earnest.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed happiness over the fellows' desire to join the university as visiting lecturers and revealed that effort was intensified to strengthen the Dentistry discipline in the university with the recruitment of 6 new staff recently. "Our aim is to make medical training a centre of excellence," he enthused.

The Vice Chancellor tasked the Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry to fast track the negotiation process in order to create a veritable environment for the visiting lecturers. He expressed the university's full readiness to accommodate them and provide all the necessary logistics.

Nigeria Ranked High in Maternal Mortality ... Dr. Fatima By Rabi'u M. Sagir

igeria has been ranked high in maternal mortality in sub-saharan Africa. The situation is even more severe in northern Nigeria, where up till now, many women deliver their babies without skilled birth attendants, the national team leader of Women for Health Nigeria Project (W4H), Dr. Fatima Adam has said.

Speaking on Tuesday, 27th November, 2018 during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello in his committee room, Dr Fatima said Women for Health had increased the number of capacity of female health workers in Kano, Katsina, Jigawa, Zamfara and Yobe and Borno through School of Midwifery, Nursing and Community Health. It had at the same time contributed to women's empowerment and gender equality in some communities and institutions in the North.

Dr. Adam said through their intervention, the numbers of female Health workers in the region had increased, and that the increase in female health workers will lead to the improvement in women's access to and use of health services in northern Nigeria.

Dr. Fatima said their project was pleased to work with Bayero University through Centre for Gender Studies through providing efficient and sufficient ways that will encourage Northern community in advocacy programmes as well as in providing ways for enhancing health workers with higher certificates.

While responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello promised to support the initiative of Women for Health programme so as to upgrade the standard of Living of women in the country.

Professor Bello lamented that basic health care were now inaccessible to millions of poor women due to insufficient availability of health facilities in our society.

Professor Bello said in its desire to address the problem, the University had established a part-time degree in B.Sc Nursing and other related courses with the aim of providing effective, quality education that may give many willing workers to be admitted into part time programmes.

The Vice Chancellor said the University would provide good avenue for enhancing and sustaining the relationship with Women for Health project as well as provide internet services and personnel that will be running the programme.

Professor Bello advised the initiative to conduct a research on why women prefer to deliver their babies in their homes and refuse to go to hospitals for safe and trusted service that may secure their lives.



BUK Model for Nigerian Universities ... Says SAFE Deputy Regional Director By Nura Garba

Bayero University, Kano, has been described as a model for Nigerian Universities, Deputy Regional Director of Sasakawa Fund for Extension Education (SAFE), Dr. Deola Naibakelawo, has said.

Speaking on 23rd November, 2018, when he paid a



courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, Dr. Naibakelawo insisted that SAFE was particularly extremely happy with the laid down foundation of the project by the management of BUK, which will ensure its sustainability, thereby appealing to other universities in the country to emulate these gigantic steps.

He expressed happiness with the level of commitment, enthusiasm and exuberance put by the university and staff in handling the project.

The Deputy Regional Director told the Vice Chancellor

that they were in the university to assess the level of progress made in the project as well as to find out the challenges being encountered in order to address them. He said that they equally visited Mali and Ghana with the same mission.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello reaffirmed the university's commitment to ensuring sustainability of SAFE Project in

Bayero University even after the expiration of the period of the grant.

The SAFE Team was accompanied by the Country Director, Professor Sani Miko and some staff of the Faculty of Agriculture.

Imo Traditional Ruler, Emetumah III, Visits BUK

A traditional ruler from Imo State, Eze Abdul-Fattah Chimaeze, the Emetumah III, visited Bayero University, on Monday 26th November, 2018 as part of preparation for the 2nd Kano WAQF International Conference tagged: Global Development of WAQF Institutions: Achievements and Challenges.

The Emetumah III, who is also the chief *Imam* of Ofor Mosque in Umuofor Kingdom of Oguta Local Government Area, Imo State, stated that Islam has been in Igboland long before the coming of Christian missionaries.

According to him, Muslims are mercantilists and they move along with their religion, which is Islam, pointing out that Igboland has been in contact with Hausas even

before the advent of colonialism in Nigeria.

He said the first mosque in Imo State was built about 1800's arguing, "people who perceived Islam as religion of Hausas are doing that out of ignorance because Muslims around the globe cannot be all Hausas". Eze, who was accompanied by his wife Hajiya Fatima further explained that they were in Kano for the conference and also to spend their wealth for the sake of Allah.

Receiving the visitors, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, thanked the royal father for the visit and for accepting to be the Chairman of the Conference amidst his tight schedules, which portrays his sacrifices for the propagation of Islam.



Professor Yahuza, however, said that there were a lot of misconceptions about Islam. He said in view of that, the

university recently organized an International Conference on *Boko Haram*. The Vice Chancellor pointed out that the University has also established some centres which include: The Centre for Islamic Civilization and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID) and the Centre for Qur'anic Studies, which have been doing well in addressing some of these problems.

The Vice Chancellor urged the organizers of the WAQF International Conference to fashion out ways that will ensure working with the University. He said
