#### At 34<sup>th</sup> Professorial Inaugural Lecture: Prof. Ajiya Unveils the Secret Behind Global Connectivity By Bala G. Abdullahi

Professor of Electrical Engineering from Bayero University, Mohammed Ajiya, was the cynosure of the audience, who gathered in their hundreds at the famous Musa Abdullahi Auditorium at the New Campus of the University to listen to his inaugural lecture. His presentation was on a complex, but knowledgeable, laden topic, the secret behind the highly complex networks that transmit enormous information from one place to another at an incredible speed, excited the mammoth crowd.

Delivering the 34<sup>th</sup> Professorial Inaugural Lecture titled: 'Seamless Global Connectivity at the Speed of Light: Converting Intrinsic Undesirable Phenomenon in Optical Fibres to Capacity Increase,' on Thursday, 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 at the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, Professor Ajiya stated that, by the time he was done, the audience would get to know why it was possible to communicate between any two parts of the world within a fraction of a minute.

Professor Ajiya, who is also the Director of the Centre

for Information Technology, explained in detail the generic communication system that made the transmission of enormous information from one place

to another at an incredible speed possible. He said the information to be transmitted was first converted to electrical signals and thereafter fed into the transmitter that transmitted the electrical signals over a channel to a receiver at the receiving end. At the receiving end, Professor Ajiya said the message signal is then converted back to its original form. He said this is done through a channel, which is a physical pathway that connects computers, other devices and people on a communication network.

He said that traditionally there were three main categories of the channel: Copper Cable, Wireless and Fibre Optics. According to the guest lecturer, the Copper Cable (wire) existed in different forms, such as unshielded twisted pairs, to shielded (bandwidth of 1Mhz) and coaxial cables (bandwidth of 1Ghz). He said it might be cheap and easy to work with, but its limited bandwidth meant it could not handle advanced applications, such as video conferencing, multimedia and virtual reality.

The second medium, Wireless media, which included radio frequencies, microwave, satellite and infrared, were faster and less costly to deploy than cable. Wireless was also useful where environment circumstances made it impossible or cost-prohibitive to use cable. Some of its disadvantages included susceptibility to environmental interference, ranging from noise, to buildings and weather, as well as security concerns.

The third medium was the fibre optic cable, a glass strand with the width of a human hair that transmitted light; therefore, information was converted into light for it to be transmitted through it. It was transmitted at the speed of light (300 million metres per second in a vacuum and 200,000 m/s in a glass fibre due to refractive index of the glass material). Its immunity from noise and other interferences as well as its enormous bandwidth of 750 Ghz or 75Thz made it a clear leader of choice in modern bandwidth "hungry" applications. Its main disadvantages were the high cost of acquisition as well as its inherent undesirable characteristic to weaken signals every 100 kilometres.

Professor Ajiya went deep into several developments, such as Erbium Doped Fiber Amplifier (EDFA) discovered in 1987 and other techniques used by international research teams to further boost the capacity of fibre optic transmission, including his team's several ground breaking research that was able to reverse the dampening inherent characteristics of the total internal reflection during the amplification of the optic signal into a boost for the signal. This feat earned Professor Ajiya an afternoon tea invitation from the then US President Barak Obama in 2009 and a number of patents followed.

In conclusion, Professor Ajiya appreciated all those that assisted him, especially his elder brother, Alhaji Danjuma Mohammed, who had been generous to him with car and cash gifts to date.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Prof Muhammad Yahuza Bello, commended members of the Professorial Inaugural Lecture Committee for their ability to hold the inaugural lecture twice a month, adding that there was still the need for improvement, looking at the large number of Professors who were yet to deliver their inaugural lectures.

He, however, said that if the current tempo was maintained and improved upon, the backlog would be removed.

# VC Sets Up Security Appraisal Committee

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, inaugurated a Security Appraisal Committee on Thursday, 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 at the VC's Conference Room.

Speaking at the occasion, the Vice Chancellor challenged the committee to come up with a modern method that would help the university to overcome its security challenges. Professor Bello stated that he had confidence in the members because of the careful selection that had been done in relation to their work. The chairman of the Committee was somebody that had experience in the Security Department of the University for more than 20 years and the other members were people with versatile experience in security matters, especially the representatives of the police and DSS.

Professor Bello challenged members of the committee to expand their knowledge in gathering important information that would help the university to overcome the security challenges. He stated that, "no matter how many personnel one had, it was not possible for them to cover each and every kilometer. That was why CCTV was used in the Old Campus in order to reduce the challenges of security.

Recently, the management awarded technologyassisted security solutions. The committee may wish to look into the possibilities of using it. There was information about a new highly efficient camera that covers a wide range of kilometers such that what-soever happens in that area will be easily traced to get results from it," he added.

Professor Bello challenged the committee to provide the University Management with a new security policy as the university is ready to change its security framework like the Housing Committee did by coming up with new guidelines that will force the university staff residents to abide by them.

Professor Bello advised members of the university staff to shun the habit of protecting their children or relatives that commit any offence in the university, as that bad habit was among the key factors that was making the security situation erratic. He pleaded with the committee to work hard and finish their assignment before the next retreat.

Earlier, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, commended the foresight of the University Management in setting up this powerful committee.

The Chairman of the Committee, Prof. Salisu Adamu Abdullahi assured the VC of working hard with the other members in order to justify the confidence reposed on them. He pleaded with the VC to implement the recommendations of the committee when it finally submits its reports.






# **BUK Student Emerges** Best at ICAN Competition By Lamara Garba
