# Fight Against Corruption: CSOs Merely Echoing in the Dark

### ... Professor Habu Mohammed

University don and Professor of Political Economy, Professor Habu Mohammed, has advocated for the full involvement of all stakeholders in the fight against corruption, without which he said the Civil Society Organizations (CSO) crusade against the monster may be an effort in futility.

"By their nature of being urban-based, or rather FCT bound, CSOs capacity to provide the much expected and all-encompassing fight against corruption leaves much to be desired. In the absence of emboldened coalition with other professional associations, community-based development associations, women, youth and constructive religious organizations, CSO's fight against corruption represents a scenario analogous with an echo in the dark," he advanced.

Speaking on Thursday, 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2018 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, while delivering the 32<sup>nd</sup>

Professorial Inaugural Lecture titled Tug of War or Echo in the Dark: Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) and the Fight Against Corruption in the Era of Change Mantra in Nigeria, Professor Habu Mohammed argued that unless the CSOs get the representative organizations of all the victims of corruption in the country, they will perpetually remain fighters without inclusive allies.

While appreciating the efforts of the CSOs in neutralizing the spate of corruption in the country, Professor Mohammed, however, regretted that government's lukewarm attitude had contributed in aggravating the level of corruption in the society.

"Though they have achieved a great deal in the struggle, their efforts are retarded by the sluggishness of the government in the fight and by the mischief of predators determined to sabotage the anti-corruption crusade," said the University don.

Professor Habu Mohammed said as a panacea to sustaining the fight against corruption, CSOs need to partner with the state and other stakeholders including the media, academics, students, community development associations, labour unions and other professional associations to make Nigeria realize its noble goal of a corrupt-free society.

Earlier, the Chairman of the occasion and Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, expressed delight at the pace with which professorial lectures are delivered recently. "We shall be pleased to be taking such lectures every week," he said.



# BUK Management Warns Against Land Encroachment By Adamu Garba

The Management of Bayero University, Kano has said that it has paid full compensation to land owners and will not tolerate further encroachment, advising, however, those having grievances to file their cases before the University Land Implementation Committee.

Addressing a Press Conference on Monday, 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2018, the Deputy Vice Chancellor, (Admin.), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, who is also the Chairman

of the Implementation Committee on Council's Decision on University Land, reminded land agitators that the University had completed all payments in relations to compensation to affected persons in the area and consequently held the title to the land devoid of any encumbrance. He, therefore, called on members of the general public to desist from any transaction with any person concerning land, as the University would not hesitate to prosecute trespassers.



Prof. Tanko pointed out that the University Governing Council had decided to constitute the Implementation Committee, which comprised representatives from Kano State Bureau for Land Management, Kano Urban Planning and Development Agency (KNUPDA), Kano Emirate Council, Commissioner of Police, Director, State Service (DSS), Ungogo Local Government Council, the District Head of Ungogo and members of the University Community in order to relocate the settlements from their present locations to another on the University land reserved for re-settlement of the affected households.

The DVC (Admin.) clearly stated that the Federal Government had acquired the land to serve as the permanent site of the University. He stated that the land acquired was almost double the size of the entire Kano Walled City and the University had surveyed the land and followed all Due Process and obtained the Right of Occupancy No. KN2604 granted to it by Kano State Government. He said the land was acquired in ten (10) phases, namely Phases 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 and 10, which cut-across areas under the control of the ten village heads of Rimin Gata, Rijiyar Zaki, Rimin Zakara, Langen, Dausayi, Kududdufawa, Jajira, Katsinawa, Gadan and Chiromawa.

He maintained that the University was established in the early 1970s and began its activities at the present Old Campus of the University. But its founding fathers foresaw the current development and expansion and recommended that a large expanse of land be acquired in

> order to cater for the development they had envisaged.

> Speaking on land compensation, the Deputy Vice Chancellor explained that the University had paid for farmlands and economic trees to the owners under Phases 1,2,3,4,5 and 7 from the late 1970s to the early 1980s. He said, as time passed, the value of land increased tremendously, thereby making it difficult for the University to complete the payment of compensation for the farmlands under Phases 6,8,9 and 10. And considering the enormity of the amount required, which was not ordinarily within the reach of the University, the Governing Council of the University sometimes in 2007 decided to relinquish the farmlands acquired but not paid for under the phases.

The decision was necessary because the increase in the value of land brought about encroachment and false claims on University land and the need to secure the land duly paid for by the University. He said relinquishing the acquired but unpaid land provided a clear boundary demarcating the University land in Phases 1,2,3,4,5 and 7, which were bordered by the Kano-Dansudu Road to the north and the Watari River/Kano-Gwarzo Road to the west and south, respectively.

In his remarks, the Chairman, University Land Management Committee, Dr. Nasir Isa Fagge, pointed out that the task was a difficult one because people came to claim lands that did not belong to them. He said the University was ever ready to pay any genuine claim as long as there was evidence.

Speaking on the occasion, the Director Security, Muhammad Babba Dan'agundi, also made the assertion that during the committee's visits to the affected communities, the residents confirmed to them that the lands were fully compensated to the owners.
