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Education System in Nigeria Suffering Neglect ... Says Professor Adamu I. Tanko

Inless there is urgent intervention from the government to ensure better investment in the education sector at all levels, the system is suffering neglect whose consequences should better be imagined, a former Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, has prophesied.

He said in his office in an exclusive interview with members of the BUK's media team on Monday, 16th November, 2020 that the sector had suffered serious neglect over the years, which, he said, was responsible for the prolonged crisis especially between academic staff and the government.

The two times DVC regretted that looking at the way things are going now, Nigeria is reverting to the old bad days of brain drain in the Nigerian Universities. The decay in the system is too monumental and unless it is checked, the condition will be worse and the end result could be too catastrophic for the society to contain.

"We are reverting to the old bad days in Nigerian universities in which the take home cannot take one anywhere. The decay is too monumental, certainly, massive brain drain is in the offing," he declared.

The one time Chairman of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), Bayero University branch, passionately appealed to well meaning Nigerians to intervene and save the situation, which, he said, was posing a bleak future.

Professor Tanko also was of the opinion that the only way to end the lingering crises between the government and university staff unions and to succeed in the struggle for good investment and better condition of service is for all university workers to come together and form a common front to talk with one voice.

"If we can have harmony among the University staff and talk with one voice, it would have been better for all of us. There is strength in unity; the earlier we adopt this strategy, the better for the system. But lack of harmony and unity among the various union, I think, is our major problem," he declared. Professor Tanko, who is also the National President of the Association of Nigerian Geographers (ANG) noted that there is no harm in operating as individual unions but whenever there is an issue at stake we should confront it collectively. "It is evidently glaring, for example, as far as IPPIS is concerned no university staff is happy, whether teaching or administrative staff," he argued.

According to him, given his way, he would loved to see a situation where all the unions will come together and talk with one voice when ever there is an issue at stake that effect members of staff irrespective of the union they belong to. "There is the need to form a joint team in the struggle for the emancipation of Nigerian education from total collapse."

The Professor of Geography also suggested that the revitalization should cut across all the levels of education, from the grassroots to the secondary schools and up to the tertiary institutions.
