he Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has expressed special commendation to members of the University Community for the kind support and cooperation he enjoyed from them and appealed for the extension of similar gesture to whosoever will succeed him after the expiration of his tenure in August, this year.

"This is the last retreat I will have the opportunity to chair as the Vice-Chancellor of our great university. As you are aware, my tenure is ending in the next seven and a half months. The Governing Council is expected to commence the process of appointing my successor in the first quarter of this year. Whoever takes over from me may wish to continue with this tradition of annual retreat. If s/he does so, I want to appeal to all those who may be around to extend same support and cooperation to him/her," the Vice Chancellor declared.

Speaking in Kaduna on Thursday,  $9^{\text{th}}$  January, 2020 at Bafra International Hotel at the opening ceremony of the 2019 University Management retreat, Professor Bello said the yearly meeting had been very helpful to him where he got to know much about the various units and the plans ahead for the future.

According to him, the annual retreat was started by his predecessor, Professor Abubakar Rasheed, that he had benefited a lot from it, and that it had immensely assisted him in steering the affairs of the University. "Working as a team is exciting and beneficial. As a Management, we were able to collectively work an taking our University to greater heights."

The Vice Chancellor reminded the participants that the

essence of holding the annual retreat was to allow for self evaluation to identify loopholes and make plans for the future. "The four days that we would be spending away from our families will provide us with the opportunities to; critically evaluate our performance, as leaders of this university, to discuss the major issues and challenges as units, as an institution and higher education in general and to develop action plans for the coming year and beyond."

Professor Bello explained further that such a meeting was expected to increase understanding and cross functional cooperation amongst the Management, strengthening our team and organizational spirit, increasing our enthusiasm and energy, developing strategies that will reposition Bayero University as one of the leading universities in Africa, among others.

He also enumerated some of the achievements recorded during the period under review to include among others, payment of all staff salaries as at when due and without any shortfall, reorganization of staff primary school, improvement in the area of teaching and research as well as improved staff welfare.

According to him, a total of 609 staff in both teaching and non-teaching cadres had been promoted during the year under review including 28 professors, 50 Associate Professors and 114 Administrative staff among others. Equally, an estimated 200 million was expended on sponsoring members of staff to attend conferences and workshops within and outside the country, as part of the deliberate policy aimed at staff development and capacity building.

Professor Bello extended special encomiums on the students of the university for what he described as their maturity, peacefulness, civility and for the serious commitment they invest in their studies. During the retreat, four papers were presented by experts on the topics: fight against corruption, Public Procurement and Open, Distance and E-Learning as well as on investment opportunities.

About 70 University Management Committee members


comprising of Principal Officers, Provosts, Deans and Directors attended the retreat and presented their reports which included achievements, challenges and future plans among others. Also in attendance were the representatives of the University Congregation and the various staff unions; the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU), National Association of Academic Technologists (NAAT) and Non-Academic Staff Union (NASU).

## Faculty of Education Holds Maiden National Conference

Stakeholders have advocated the need for Public-Private Partnership and equal access to quality education as a way towards ensuring educational development in Nigeria.

The call was made during the first National Conference organized by the Faculty of Education Bayero University, Kano on Monday, 13<sup>th</sup> January, 2020 at Convocation Arena, New Campus.



Delivering a Keynote address, Professor Danjuma A. Maiwada titled: **Development Partnership and Private Sector Participation in Nigerian Education** highlighted a long historical collaboration between the public and private organizations in supporting education in Nigeria.

The theme of the conference was **Economic Instability**, **Public-Private Partnership and Equal Access to Quality Education in Nigeria** and was aimed at exploring ways of reducing out-of-school children and improving quality education in Nigeria.

According to him, Nigerian education has, for a very long time, experienced three types of partnership, namely; Community participation, Collaborative partnership, and Private sector participation.

While declaring the conference open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello urged participants to come up with concrete principles, strategies and commitments for providing quality education to all despite the economic difficulties.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, described the conference as not only apt and timely but also as an impressive gathering of erudite scholars, educationists and other experts in economics and civil society leaders representing Nigerian interests in education and the private sector.

In his welcome address, the Dean, Faculty of Education, Professor Ali Tijjani Abdullahi described the conference as part of the faculty's initiatives aimed at developing the education sector within the country particularly, in view of the economic predicaments experienced in Nigeria. He welcomed all the participants and commended the wife of the Kano State Governor, Dr. Hafsat Umar Ganduje for supporting the faculty to host the conference for the first time.

Other presenters were Professor Owoicho Akpa from University of Jos and Professor Fabunmi Martins from Modibbo Adama University, Yola as second keynote presenter and first lead paper presenter respectively. The second lead paper presenter was Professor Afolabi Popoola.

Highlight of the conference was the presentation of an award to the wife of Kano State Governor, Dr. Hafsat Umar Abdullahi Ganduje for her support and contributions to humanity and education in particular.

# BUK's Undergraduate Registration Extended by One Week —VC

Bayero University's undergraduate registration period for this session (2019/2020) has been extended by one week. This was disclosed by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Muhammad Yahuza Bello, during an event organized to honour different categories of students who either served in various leadership capacities of the Student Union Government or represented the university in external events and made the university proud.

The event took place at the Conference Hall of the Students Affairs Division on Wednesday, 15<sup>th</sup> January, 2020. The registration exercise which supposed to end on Saturday, 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2020, will now end on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2020.

Speaking at the ceremony, Prof. Bello reiterated that the extension of the registration time was final. He also admonished students not to frequent internet cafes for the sake of their registrations. They should instead carry out the registration by themselves, to avoid mistakes or giving room for some dubious practices by the café owners.

According to the VC, this year's winners of either indigent scholarship or merit scholarship will as well get their funds accessible before the expiration of the extended registration period. This will enable them to register within the stipulated period, which will have no further extension.


