



51st AGM/Scientific Confab: Paediatricians Revolutionary Group ... VC Says

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has described paediatricians as a revolutionary group in terms of fighting for social justice for the child.

Professor Bello spoke at the opening ceremony of the 51st Annual General Meeting and Scientific Conference of Paediatric Association of Nigeria (PAN) tagged PANCONF Kano 2020 at Aficent event centre on Wednesday, 22nd January, 2020. He was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko.

He said paediatricians, who championed the protection of the health of children, have contributed immensely towards fighting the scourge of child killer diseases and ensuring not only the improvement of the health of the

In his address shortly before he declared the AGM/Conference open, the Minister of Health, Dr. Osagie Ohanere, represented by the Chief Medical Director of Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, Professor Abdulrahman Sheshe, commended the association for devoting a lot of time and energy to address the problem of child health care, hoping that the solution the association would suggest at the end of the Scientific conference should be more of preventive nature than curative.

Also speaking, the Governor of Kano State, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje, represented by the Secretary to the State Government, Alhaji Usman Alhaji, took time to enumerate the modest achievements of the state government in the health sector.

child but also the sustenance of the fight against the menace of child mortality and morbidity.

Professor Yahuza Bello stated that in appreciation of the important role played by paediatricians in the society, the University happily accepted the request of the body for the hosting of its AGM and the conference, saying that 'it is important to give PAN all the necessary support it needs to enable them to succeed in the promotion and improvement of the health of the child. The health of the child is the health of the society.'

He described the theme of the conference: "The Impact of Rapid Population Growth on the Child" as apt and hoped that the outcome of the cross fertilization of ideas among the conferees would be beneficial to humanity.

He mentioned the completion of the Ginginyu and Zoo Road hospitals started by his predecessors and the introduction of the state health insurance scheme, the construction of 400 bed capacity hospital each in the 4 new emirate councils and the introduction of new regulations to ensure that private hospital operating in the state observe the highest ethical medical standards, among many others.

Speaking earlier, the National President of PAN, Professor Augustine Omoigberale said it was not by accident that the association decided to give Bayero University, Kano the hosting right of its 51st AGM and Scientific conference, saying that Kano state happened to be the most populous state in the country and that holding the conference here would give the association the opportunity of taking its campaigns of improvement of child health to the larger

audience.

He said the association would assemble professionals from across the globe with the intent of coming together to cross fertilize ideas with a view to helping to improve health care especially child health.

Professor Omoigberale added that the theme of the conference: The Impact of Rapid population growth on the child and the three sub-themes; **Childhood Nutrition: Role of the health care and policy makers, Critical Care for the Sick Child: bridging the gaps and lastly addressing the challenges of childhood immunizations** accurately apply to the current situation in the country, where, he said, perinatal morbidity and mortality rates were abysmally high.

He said the conference, therefore, would afford all stakeholders to look inwards, strategize and produce rational and implementable solutions to some of the problems. Professor Omoigberale also announced that

the pioneer President of the association, Professor A. Bolaji, would be honoured with an award while about 40 new members would be inducted as fellows of the association.

CDA Completes Training of 1400 Youth, Women on Agric Value Chains

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) on Saturday, 18th January, 2020, completed the training of 1400 youth and women from Kano, Kaduna and Kogi states under the World Bank's assisted project of Agro-Processing Productivity Enhancement and Livelihood Improvement Support Project (APPEALS).

The participants were trained on rice farming, fisheries and poultry value chains through intensive skills acquisition, practical and field trips that exposed them to learn the various chains. It was aimed at creating job opportunities, providing employment and eradicating poverty among youth and women.

In his remarks the Kano State Governor, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje who was represented by Dr. Mustapha Yusuf Abubakar, the Special Adviser on Administration to the office of the Deputy Governor, urged beneficiaries to make good use of the opportunity.

Dr. Mustapha Yusuf Abubakar congratulated the beneficiaries for being trained by CDA, a renowned Africa centre of excellence in dryland agriculture. According to Ganduje, the World Bank in partnership with the Federal Government and state governments, earmarked \$200m to empower 60,000 beneficiaries, who are expected to employ about 360, 000 people through various agricultural value-chains. The National Coordinator of APPEALS Project, Dr. Aminu Babande, who was represented by Dr Salisu Garba, explained that the project allowed the beneficiaries to merge, in maximum of five, as a group, to start a

particular business.

He told them that “CDA did not fail you. You have acquired a lot of knowledge. Use the knowledge to build good businesses that would be profitable and sustainable. Be reminded that your business development plan will surely pass through the World Bank test for approval. So, build a business plan that can be funded and sustained. Start up a business that will give other people the opportunity to get employments and become self-reliant.”

The Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin, urged the beneficiaries to maximally use the opportunity of the training to develop themselves, hoping that in the next three years there would be success stories. “Each of you was selected among various people. If you scale through, you will be given support to start-up a business. Whatever you are given is to develop the business you are going to set up and use it for the benefit of yourselves and others,” he said.

The Coordinator of the training and the Deputy Director (Outreach and Publication) of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Professor Amina Mustapha, said APPEALS project was implemented in 6 states of the country and CDA was selected by three states to train its beneficiaries. She expressed gratitude over the opportunity given to the centre and urged the beneficiaries to make judicious use of the resources that would be given to them in order to become employers of labour in the country.

Public Enlightenment/Advisory on Lassa Fever

1. Lassa Fever is an acute viral haemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by the lassa virus. The natural reservoir for the virus is multimammate rat. Other rodents have also been identified to carry the virus.
2. Lassa Fever occurs throughout the year but more cases are recorded during the dry season i.e. November through May.
3. Lassa Fever is spread through:
 - Direct contact with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
 - Contact with objects, household items and surfaces or eating food, contaminated with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
 - Person to Person transmission by contact with blood, urine, faeces, vomitus, semen, vaginal secretions, breast milk or other body fluids of an infected person.
4. Sign and Symptoms of Lassa Fever:
Lassa Fever presents initially like any other febrile illness such as malaria but accompanied with unexplainable bleeding from ears, eyes, nose, mouth and other body openings.
The time between an infection and appearance of symptoms of the disease is 2 to 21 days. Early treatment and diagnosis increase the chances of survival.
5. People most at risk are:
 - People of all age groups who come in contact with the urine, faeces, saliva or blood of rats.
 - People living in rat-infested environments, which increases their chances of coming in contact with rats.
 - People who consume potentially contaminated food stuff especially those left open over-night or dried outside in the open.
 - People who handle or process rodents for consumption.
 - People who do not observe hand hygiene when appropriate.
 - Relatives who take care of sick person with Lassa Fever at home.
6. How to prevent yourself from Lassa Fever
 - Maintain personal hygiene by, among others, frequent hand washing with soap and water or use of hand sanitizers.
 - Store food in containers with lids and discard any food remnants.
 - Keep your home and surrounding clean and tidy to discourage rats and other rodents from entering.
 - Ensure proper sanitation by, among others, proper waste disposal.
 - Cook all food thoroughly.
 - Wash fruits thoroughly, vegetables and other food items before consumption.
