

# BUK's Prof. UG Danbatta re-appointed Executive Vice Chairman NCC

President Muhammadu Buhari has approved the reappointment of Bayero University Kano's Professor Umar Garba Danbatta as the Executive Vice Chairman of the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC).

A statement on Friday, 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 from the office of the Minister of Communication and Digital Economy, Dr. Isa Pantami and signed by the spokesperson to the Minister, Mr. Uwa Suleiman, said that the reappointment is on recognition of the excellent performance by Professor Danbatta during the first tenure and the need to consolidate the gains made in the telecommunications sector in line with the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy.

"In an effort to consolidate the gains made in the telecommunications sector in line with the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy, President Muhammadu Buhari approved the reappointment of Professor Umar Garba Danbatta as the Executive Vice Chairman, Nigerian Communications Commission for additional five year tenure," said the statement. It could be recalled that Professor Danbatta was first appointed in August 2015 by President Muhammadu Buhari and within the five years he had achieved tremendously to revolutionize the telecommunication industry.

Prof Danbatta tremendously transformed the Telecom Sector in the areas of staff welfare, infrastructural development, consumers' empowerment and satisfaction, job creation, standard information and communication technology revolution, research and development, re-branding of the telecoms sector, cordial relationship with stakeholders, increase in active mobile broadband penetration, efficient monitoring and value driven usage for the provision of different types of services.

As the EVC/CEO, Professor Danbatta declared 2017 as **the Year of the Consumer**. This is to underscore the importance he attaches to the consumer.

Professor Danbatta began his work career in Bayero University as an Assistant Lecturer in the Department of Electrical Engineering, Faculty of Technology (now Faculty of Engineering) in 1985 and rose to become a Professor in 2003.

In the course of his career he held various academic positions of Dean, Faculty of Technology (now Engineering) and Head of Department at different times.

Meanwhile, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has congratulated Professor Danbatta on his re-appointment, saying that he had really represented Bayero University well in his capacity as Executive Vice Chairman of NCC. He said the University is proud of Prof Danbatta's achievements which led to his reappointment by President Muhammadu Buhari.

On why he recommended his re-appointment to President Muhammadu Buhari, the Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Dr. Ali Isa Pantami, said it was predicated on the achievements recorded by Professor Danbatta in his first five years and to allow continuity on his revolutionary agenda in the telecommunication industry.

From August 2015 till date, the industry has recorded impressive growth statistics, pointing to the effective regulatory environment created by the Commission. Today, telecoms contribution to gross domestic product (GDP) increased from 8.50 percent in August 2015 to 14.07 percent as at First Quarter, 2020.

Active mobile voice subscribers increased from 151,018,624 in 2015 to 189,282,796 million as at March 2020 while teledensity increased to 99.65 percent.

Internet subscribers increased from 90 million in 2015 to 135,832,142 by March, 2020 while broadband penetration jumped from 8 percent to its current 39.9 percent, indicating a total of 76,163,674 Nigerian access data services on 3G and 4G networks.

### IPPIS May Disrupt University System – SSANU-BUK Chairman

The Integrated Payroll Personnel Information System (IPPIS) introduced by the Federal Government may jeopardize the University system and consequently cause chaos and perpetual industrial crisis. The system may also put students at danger of paying exorbitant tuition fees if the situation is not addressed.

This was part of the remarks of the Chairman, Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU), BUK Branch, Comrade Haruna Aliyu on Monday, 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 when he featured in a Weekly programme (*Abin Fadi*) at Guarantee Radio.

The Chairman, who spoke on a wide range of issues concerning the university administration, said the nonteaching staff members of the Nigerian universities were surprised with the IPPIS Office on its conduct over the payment of monthly salary having earlier convinced the unions that all university peculiarities had been captured by the new system.

SSANU Chairman, equally gave reasons as to why the union is planning an industrial action in the wake of covid-19 pandemic. He explained that the struggle did not start now; rather, it was an extension of continuous emancipation of staff welfare and betterment of education system in the country.

"We were convinced to join the IPPIS hoping that it would improve efficiency and effectiveness in the system, but what we are witnessing is totally divorced from what we were told. Staff members are not certain of their salary as discrepancies, over- deduction and omission in the payment of salary become the order of the day," said the Chairman.

He emphasized that the union had issued a notice to the federal government on its planned industrial action if the problems are not addressed as soon as the universities resume, saying that the staff in IPPIS Office are not competent enough to handle this issue.
