



Digital Technology Key to Nigeria's Development ...Professor Ajiya

The President and Chief Executive Officer of the Digital Bridge Institute (DBI), a subsidiary of the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC), Professor Muhammad Ajiya, has said that Information and Communication Technology has been the key to opening Nigeria's growth and sustainable development.

He spoke in a special programme on Channels Television to commemorate Nigeria's Democracy day on Friday, June 12th, 2020, saying that with the global pandemic of COVID-19, the best way to launch country's path to economic growth and sustainable development was to diversify and adopt digital economy through the application of information and technology in every aspect of our endeavour.

“There is no doubt that the economic prosperity and sustainable development of any country nowadays, lies on the application and the use of Information and Communication Technology and Nigeria cannot be an exception,” declared, Prof. Ajiya.

Professor Ajiya who was the a former university's Director of CIT explained that the COVID-19 pandemic had exposed the weakness of many nations in the information technology. “There is the scarcity of the infrastructure; there is also lack of skills among our teeming populace particularly now that bulks of our civil servants are working from home as a result of the pandemic.”

The DBI boss, while appreciating the contribution of CIT in global economy however said this poor infrastructure and the lack of skills would undoubtedly slow down our quest for development.

According to him, globally ICT contributed immensely in the GDP far more than other sectors, pointing out that even here in Nigeria despite challenges, yet, it contributes more than 14% of the country's GDP.

He commended President Muhammadu Buhari for his foresight in the introduction of digital economy through harnessing the potentiality in the new technology.

However, he advised that for effective impact there was the urgent need for the provision of the infrastructure in the ICT sector, saying that already the NCC had taken a giant step in that direction with the success recorded in its broadband penetration programme.

“I must say that our economy is going to be strong, given the securing of presidential approval for the digital economy by the amiable Minister of Communication and Digital Economy, Dr. Isa Ali Pantami which was the resultant effect of the huge successes recorded in the broadband penetration by the NCC under the leadership of Professor Umar Garba Danbatta.”

The roads are: Gidan Liman/Ladan road to ABC road to Tafawa Balewa road to extend and terminate at
