#### Fresh Crisis Looms in Varsities as SSANU Issues Ultimatum ... Staff Groan over Salary Delay, Massive Deductions By Lamara Garba

here has been palpable fear of a looming crisis in the Federal Universities following the enrolment \_ of staff into the Integrated Personnel Payroll Information System (IPPIS).

Initially, government had allayed the fears of university staff that IPPIS had captured all their peculiarities, but alas, the situation is far from the truth as members have been complaining of delay in the payment of their monthly salaries and unexplained deductions among others.

Federal public Universities and other tertiary institutions across the country were enrolled into the IPPIS sometimes in December 2019 while payment of salary through the system began in February 2020.

However, since the commencement of the IPPIS controlled salary, members have been experiencing delays in the payment of the monthly salary as well as massive deductions, a situation which they view as a deliberate policy aimed at further destroying the education system in the country.

Many of the conventional allowances in the university package such as the hazard, responsibility, sabbatical, visitation, overtime and other peculiar allowances were removed from the salary package thereby reducing the staff income by almost 30% in addition to the introduction of some deductions which are unknown to the staff.

In Bayero University, hundreds of staff across all cadres are yet to receive their salaries since February while those who got theirs have witnessed a massive cut ranging between 20% and 40%.

Some of those who spoke to our correspondent on the issue decried the ugly scenario which they said have already demoralized them.

Already, the National body of SSANU has given an ultimatum to the government to resolve all issues or face industrial dispute.

A letter sent to the Minister of Labour and Productivity dated 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 and signed by the National President of SSANU, Comrade Samson Ugwoke, has given up to 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 ultimatum to the government to resolve the issues or embark on indefinite, total and complete strike.

"After three installments of salary payment and going into the fourth month, the IPPIS has not met the expectations of our members," it stated.

It could be recalled that many members across universities have claimed that in February, March and April 2020 they observed shortage of over N80,000 in each of the month from their salaries and nobody could give any satisfactory explanation.

"As at today, Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 I am yet to receive my April Salary, although some of my colleagues who got theirs have told me that the deduction was even higher than the previous months," another respondent claimed.

Meanwhile, a University don, Professor Ibrahim Bello Kano has described IPPIS as a gateway to destroying the education sector at least at university level.

In an article published recently by Professor Ibrahim Bello Kano (IBK) who teaches in the Department of English and literary Studies lamented that government is implementing a wholesale set of neo-liberal economic policies "which is meant to transfer resources from the poor to the rich and from the improvished workforce to the government or the state."

Titled "My ASUU Colleagues and Doomsday Prepping," he alleged that Nigeria is changing for the worse and very rapidly. He pointed out that IPPIS is only the opening shot in the case of the lecturers negotiated agreements on pay allowances and other non-salary entitlements.

It could be recalled that there has been allegation of corruption, extortion and seeking of favour from management of Universities and other tertiary institutions by the officials of IPPIS.

# How I Survived Covid-19 Infection – Prof Abdulrazak Habib

The co-chairman of the Kano State Task Force and former Provost College of Health Sciences, Bayero University, Kano, Professor Abdulrazak Garba Habib, has revealed how he survived COVID-19 infection while on admission for 20 days.



The experience of the don, who has now tested negative to the virus, was posted via the Twitter handle of the Kano State Ministry of Health @KNSMOH.

Prof. Habib, who was discharged from a Kano isolation centre last week said he contracted the infection while serving as a member of the Kano State COVID-19 Task Force. "I suffered a moderately severe disease with high fever, cough, mild shortness of breath, loss of appetite, vomiting, diarrhea, hypokalemia (low level of potassium), severe weakness, and ultimately, mild shock. "I was sick for about one month and was on admission for 20 days," he said.

According to him, he was treated with many medications, intravenous fluids, oxygen by nasal cannulae as well as steam inhalation using black seed, clove oil, ginger tea, among other things. "Overall, I lost 7Kg in weight," he said.

The experienced medical practitioner reiterated the need for healthcare workers to adhere to the preventive measures of social distancing, lockdown, use of face masks and provision and utilisation of personal protective equipment.

"I am saddened to learn several colleagues have been infected and I pray none has a stormy course. I also pray they have a fast and full recovery. I would like to seize this opportunity to express my gratitude and thanks to God the Almighty, and to friends, well-wishers, colleagues within the healthcare industry who rallied around my care through consistent prayers and actual provision and facilitation of care.

"I believe we should not relent on all the measures, the preventive measures, curative measures, palliative measures, while praying to God Almighty to bring an end to the pandemic here in Nigeria and everywhere.

### Prof Jibrin's Tenure as Director CDA Extended up to End of ACE Impact Project

The University Principal Officers at their  $4^{th}$  (2020) meeting held on Wednesday,  $20^{th}$  May, 2020 upon submission of end of tenure report approved that the tenure of Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin has been extended as Director of Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) up to the end of the ACE Impact Project.

According to a statement signed by the Registrar, Fatima Binta Mohammed said the Principal Officers considered Prof Jibrin's extension in order to ensure continuity and to make sure that the University does not lose the ACE Impact Grant with him being a signatory.

Recall that the Centre for



Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University, Kano won a World Bank Africa Centres of Excellence (ACE) Impact Grant along with 43 other centres from 12 West and Central African countries. The Centres were competitively selected under a \$300 million World Bank and French Development Agency- funded project aimed at scaling up postgraduate education and applied research.

The Minister of Education, Malam Adamu Adamu, formally launched the CDA's Africa Centres of Excellence Impact Project on Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> December, 2019 in which he congratulated the Bayero University and specifically the CDA for winning the World Bank's \$5m ACE Impact grant.
