



Over 750 Gets Promotion in 2021, SSANU Chair now DR .VC Promises More Incentives . Dr. Bala Zakari, Monsura, 5 others now Professors, . Dr. Bunza, 17 others Promoted to Associate Professors

In line with the policy of staff motivation and improved welfare, the management of the University under the leadership of Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas has approved the promotion of about seven hundred and seventy two (772) teaching and non-teaching staff to various ranks across units and departments during the 2021 promotion exercise.

It could be recalled that during consultations with members of the University community, shortly after assumption of office, the VC, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas promised an improved staff welfare through training, timely promotion as well as initiate policies aimed at ensuring job motivation and satisfaction for efficient service delivery.

A breakdown of the figure indicated that seven persons were promoted to the rank of Professors, eighteen got promoted to Associate Professorship while seven hundred and forty seven (747) other staff across all cadres were

promoted to various ranks including three Deputy Registrars.

The University Governing Council at its meeting held between Monday, 11th and Friday 15th October, 2021 met and approved the submission by the Vice Chancellor in respect of the 2021 promotion exercise.

In a submission to the Council, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, said that the Appointment and Promotion Committee considered eight hundred and sixty three (863) applications for promotions, out of which, it recommended one hundred and two candidates for external assessment and subsequent promotion to Professorial cadre while the remaining 747 were both teaching and non-teaching staff.

"Upon consideration of the external assessors reports, the A & PC recommended to council the promotion of the following seven (7) candidates to the rank of Professors and eighteen (18) candidates to the rank of Associate Professors with effect from 2020, each having obtained a minimum of two positive reports," read the letter in parts.

The newly promoted professors include Dr. Bala Zakari, Professor of Adult Education and Community Service; Dr. Monsura AbdulAzeez, Professor of Biochemistry and Dr Moses Terlumun Alualgba, Professor of Political Economy and Development.

Others are: Dr Rabi Abdulsalam Ibrahim, Professor of English Language; Dr Shehu Saleh, Professor of Phychiatric; Dr Mohammed Kabir Saleh, Professor of Radiology and Dr Bashir Shehu Galadanci, Professor of Software Engineering.

Those promoted to Associate Professors include Dr. Mukhtar Ridwan Bunza, (Forestry and Wildlife); Dr Aisha Muhammad Gadanya, (Biochemistry) as well as Dr. Aisha Haruna, (Public Law) and Dr Murtala Umar, (Civil Engineering).

Also promoted to the rank of Deputy Registrars were Chairman of Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU), Comrade Mustapha Aminu and the University's Information and Publication Secretary, Lamara Garba as well as Mrs Halima O. Zubairu.

The promotion of the Professors and Associate Professors were effective October 2020, while the remaining are for 2021.

At 2nd Faculty of Education National Confab: Ganduje Reaffirms Commitment to Security, Education

Information sharing, intelligence gathering and community policing at ward, local government and state levels are responsible for the peaceful atmosphere Kano State is currently enjoying, Kano State Governor, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje, has disclosed.

The Governor was speaking at the 2nd Faculty of Education National Conference, with the theme: **“Education in the Midst of National Challenges”** which took place on Monday, 1st November, 2021 at the Convocation Arena.

He said the State Government has always considered the issue of insecurity a very serious menace which was why his administration teamed up with the security agencies to form a strong security network as well as interact with security and other relevant agencies to fast track any security breaches.

Falgore forest, according to the Governor had always served as a haven for criminals and bandits for their nefarious and other criminal activities, but stated that the decision of the State Government to turn the forest into a military training ground has helped not only to dislodge the bandits, but also turn the route adjacent to the forest safe for motorists plying the road through the area to neighbouring states.

He also said the government is very much committed to improving the standard of education in the state. This informed the decision to allocate about 25% of the 2022 budget to education sector.

Earlier in his address, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was

represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, said the theme of the conference was apt and timely. According to him all hands must be on deck in order to address the lingering problems facing the education sector. He said Nigeria is experiencing challenges such as kidnapping, banditry, robbery, environmental degradation and other untoward acts, hence the need for all and sundry to be more proactive so as to halt the negative drift currently impacting on our national psyche.

The Keynote Speaker, Prof. Mansur Usman Malumfashi, said although challenges are typical to developing countries, but the peculiar challenges Nigeria is facing is humongous and huge.

He said Nigerian educational system is facing challenges such as lack of quality education, politicization of education, poor parenting and poor funding by relevant agencies, as well as poor welfare for teachers among others.

Prof Malumfashi, who was a former Librarian at Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University (ATBU), Bauchi said no amount of investment is too much on education and that UNESCO’s 25% budgetary recommendation should be the bench mark for every state and federal government if we are to remedy the situation in the sector.

According to him, Nigeria educational sector needs partnership and not commercialization and that Science,

Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) should be adopted for Nigeria to develop. He also spoke on the need to embark on cutting edge research to solve societal problems.

Earlier, former NECO Registrar, Professor Abdulrashid Garba, who was the chairman of the occasion, in his remarks, commended the Kano State government for allocating 25% to education sector in the 2022 Fiscal Budget which he said was in line with UNESCO Provision.

Professor Garba noted that the challenges are not just restricted to wide and expanded insecurity, dwindling resources and out of school children, but is multi-faceted and should be handled as such. He said Faculty of Education is not only looking into all the challenges but also proffering solutions..

Earlier in his welcome speech, the Dean of the Faculty of Education, Dr. Ali Idris, while expressing concern over the dwindling fortunes of education sector, however, said it is not yet late in proffering solutions to remedy the situation.

Dr. Idris noted that conferences such as this one are deliberately organized with a view to bringing experts to brainstorm and bring possible way out of the quagmire.

The conference was attended by the First Lady and Wife of the Executive Governor of Kano State, Dr. Hafsat Abdullahi Umar Ganduje as well as participants from across the country.

Professor Ibrahim Njodi former VC, University of Maiduguri presented the 1st lead paper while Professor Shehu Abdullahi Ma'aji from Kano University of Science and Technology (KUST), Wudil presented the 2nd Lead Paper.

Nigeria Needs Visionary, Responsive Leaders to Prosper – Dr. Malumfashi

For Nigeria to move away from its present state of quagmire, it needs leaders who are inspirational, transformational, responsive and educated on global affairs. This was disclosed by the former head of Department of Political Science, Bayero University, Dr. Sani Lawal Malumfashi.

He was speaking as a lead paper presenter at the 2nd Social Science Public Lecture titled **“X-Raying Nigeria's Insecurity: Causes, Implications and Solutions”** on Tuesday 26th October, 2021 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium.

Speaking further, Dr. Malumfashi said corruption in Nigeria is so corrosive hence the reason the country lacked quality health care system, good education, social security, and food security among many other negative trends affecting the nation.

According to him, despite the number of worshipping centers in the country, corruption still strives in Nigeria. He lamented that money meant to purchase arms and ammunitions to prosecute the war against insecurity ended up in private pockets of some individuals.

Dr. Malumfashi said Nigeria could be described as a 'political mistake,' which he said are the reasons for poverty of leadership, unemployment and lack of development.

He also listed some of the factors which he believed were responsible for the nation's insecurity to include; proliferation of small arms, online recruitment and training, collaboration and linking up with other franchise within and outside the country, depletion of ozone layers that causes climate change which in turn has affected occupations such as grazing, farming and fishing.

Dr. Lawal Malumfashi categorized the solutions to all these myriad of problems into three; (1) preventive; alleviating poverty through provision of employments, (2)

curative; which is the military option that can only be possible through provision of military hard ware to prosecute the fight against insurgency; and (3) palliative; which is in the form of compensation, rebuilding community, transitional justice and social inclusion.

In his submission, the first discussant, Dr. Y.Z. Yau said there was need to know how insecurity affects every class in the society. He said Nigeria is blessed with fertile land, but presently undergoing decline because climate change has wreaked havoc on the fertility of the land.

He said corruption which undermines a country's capacity to reach its full potential is not unique to Nigeria and that almost every society has level of corruption it is battling with.

He, therefore, advised Nigerians to focus more on what unites them rather than what divides them.

The second discussant, ACP (RTD.) Mohammad Lawal Daura opined that crimes such as kidnapping for ransom, banditry and insurgency have become lucrative business in Nigeria.

He said proliferation of small arms as a result of Nigeria's porous borders and ineffective criminal justice system among others are some of the reasons that made insecurity to thrive.

Barr. Awwal Ilyas Magashi, who was the third discussant said lamentation will not solve Nigerian's problems but collective affirmative action, collective responsibility and love for one another will go a long way in proffering solutions

to the myriads of problem currently confronting Nigeria as a Nation.

In his remarks, former INEC Chairman, Professor Attahiru Muhammadu Jega, said, insecurity in Nigeria is as a result of multiplicity of factors and opined that states that are saddled with the responsibility of protecting citizens life and property have a major role to play.

He said Nigerian leaders are self-serving, greedy and lack vision. He said the Armed Forces are not meant to tackle internal security but to protect the territorial integrity of the country. He said there was no serious intention to revive the Nigeria Police Force. He said a reformed police that is well trained and with the right orientation is required to solve Nigeria's security challenges.

He said the country is on a slippery slope because young people are withdrawing from politics and some are engaged in negative activities.

BUK Academics Get Certified Global Accreditors of Higher Education Institutions

The National Universities Commission (NUC), in collaboration with Global University Network of Innovation-Africa, National Open University and AfriQAN organised a six-weeks intensive program on Program and Institutional Accreditation.

The program which had over 600 participants from across the globe was organised for professors, directors of quality assurance units, NUC directors and managers of higher education institutions among others.

About five members of academics from Bayero University, Kano participated in the program. They include: Prof. Yakubu Magaji Azare, Professor Aliyu Suleiman Kantudu, Prof. Babatunde Bamgbose, Professor Dije Suleiman and Professor Abdulwahab Lawan after exhaustive lectures and examinations.

They all made it to the final stage and were duly certified as International accreditors

Participants came from Nigeria, Botswana, Malawi, Philippines, Japan, UAE, Egypt, South Africa and many other countries from Africa, Europe and Asia.

There were about 63 Vice Chancellors among the participants who enrolled in the program in its initial stage.

After the six weeks rigorous and intensive training, a total of 445 made it to the final with only about 35 vice chancellors making it to the last lap.

Those who passed with distinction were awarded two certificates, one as a global certified Accreditor of Programs and Institutions across the globe and the other certificate as performance result during the program.

The certification therefore, has given the holder the privilege to be included in the global data base of accreditors of higher education institutions.

This is the first time Nigerian academics broke the jinx to join global accreditors list. From Bayero University, the following made it to the Data base:

Prof. Yakubu Magaji Azare from the Department of Nigerian Languages got 777 points.

Prof. Bamgbose Babatunde of the Faculty of Dentistry scored 776 points

Prof. Aliyu Sulaiman Kantudu of Accounting with 670 points as well

Prof. Abdulwahab Lawan got 652 points while Prof. Dije Muhammad Sulaiman got 635 points.
