



Experts Suggest Ways to Improve Animal Welfare in Nigeria

Experts on Animal and veterinary field from across the country have converged in Bayero University Kano for five days in which they suggested the urgent need to promulgate laws and policies that would guarantee the welfare and rights of animals in the country.

Speaking at the first training workshop on Animal Experimentation and the 3Rs jointly organized by the Bayero University and the University of Leeds in the United Kingdom on Monday, 4th October, 2021 at CDA Conference Hall, a Veterinarian Dr Josiah Tagwai Kantiyok, Agwam Zikpak II, Chairman Zikpak Traditional Council, Zikpak kingdom, Kafanchan in Kaduna State, opined that there is an increasing need for the development, passage and enforcement of strong animal welfare laws in the country as a way of ensuring improved animal welfare.

According to him these laws should equally be followed by aggressive public enlightenment/education of the general populace, explaining that many people are not aware of any rights by the animals, hence the poor treatment meted out on them for both domestic and wild.

To this end, he said without regulations and enforcement animal owners tend to neglect their basic responsibilities towards these creatures. The traditional ruler lamented that in Nigeria there hasn't enough legislation to cater for well being of the animals unlike in other developed nations in which animals have guaranteed rights and privileges.

In a paper titled "Animal Research Legislation," Dr. Kantiyok explained that several factors were responsible for the poor animal welfare and the protection of their rights in Nigeria which among them include the level of poverty among the populace, culture, beliefs, tradition, education and resource scarcity.

"In developing countries such as Nigeria, factors such as poverty, culture, beliefs/tradition, education and resource scarcity contribute to how people regard and treat animals. In some cultures, for instance certain animals may be considered as sacred status while other animals are subjected to extreme insignificance and disregard," he revealed.

According to the traditional ruler, there is an increasing need for the development, passage and enforcement of strong animal welfare laws followed by aggressive public enlightenment/education of the people.

In his paper captioned "The 3Rs", Dr. Lewis David from the University of Leeds in the United Kingdom highlighted the concepts and importance of 3Rs in animal experimentation.

Also in a joint presentation by Professor Abdussamad Muhammad Abdussamad, Acting Dean Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and Dr. O.O Aina on Humane Endpoint Analysis, they enumerated the different types of

animals as well as explained their relevance in research, education and testing.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas commended the collaborating units (Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Centre for Bio-Technology Research and DRIP) for this laudable initiatives. Researchers in Bayero University under the HEPSSA 2021-114 project have collaborated with industry practitioners and the government to provide an innovative solution to the developmental challenges facing the tannery industry.

A training workshop on research uptake in Tannery Wastes Management was organized in collaboration with Royal Academy of Engineering, U.K, GB Tannery and Kano University of Science and Technology, Wudil which took place between 20th and 21st October, 2021 at BUK.

Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Research and Development, Professor Abdullahi Sule-Kano, said the workshop was another evidence of the capacity building initiative of Bayero University, Kano to address local development challenges through collaborative effort of various stakeholders.

The Vice Chancellor explained that the workshop signified that academia and industry had started thinking outside the box in search of solutions to the local and national problems.

The Project Team Leader, Professor Ibrahim Ahmad Rufa'i said the workshop was intended to, among other things, appraise the sustainability of the current practices as well the contribution of industrial growth to national competitiveness and develop demand-driven innovative strategies capable of enhancing industrial competitiveness and national development.

Professor Rufa'i, who is the Director, Directorate of Research, Innovation and Partnership of Bayero University, Kano, said the key objectives of the project were to develop environmentally-friendly laboratory scale anaerobic digester for treating tannery effluent in GB Tannery and develop the capacity for the generation and up-take of research and development outputs by the leather processing industries.

A Round Table Discussion was conducted with the title: University-Industry Collaboration in the Period of Economic Recession, which was chaired by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research and Development), Professor Sule-Kano.

Their presentations were conducted under the two modules. Module One was titled: Research and Development for Industrial Growth, while Module two was Environmental Sustainability for Industrial Growth.

BUK Celebrates 2021 World Food Day

Bayero University's Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) in collaboration with a UK based LINKS Program and Silvex International has commemorated the 2021 World Food Day with a Symposium, titled: *Food Security in the Face of a Changing Climate: Northern Nigeria in Perspective*.

World Food Day is celebrated every year on October 16 to commemorate the date of the founding of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization in 1945. The day is also observed by organizations like the World Food Programme and International Fund for Agricultural Development. Since 1981, World Food Day has celebrated various themes to highlight the importance of food security, with most of them revolving around agriculture.

The Director of CDA, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, in his remarks, said the centre joined the rest of the world to commemorate the day by organizing a symposium to discuss topical issues related to food security in Nigeria. He said the symposium would create awareness on the challenges being faced, especially on food security and climate change.

The Director explained that key stakeholders were invited to brainstorm and come up with solutions that would be useful to policy makers and private sectors to address the challenges.

In his presentation, titled: *2021 Growing Season: Forecast, Reality and the Role of NIMET*, the Director General of Nigeria Meteorological Agency (NIMET), Professor Mansur Bako, said the seasonal climate prediction was being produced by NIMET in fulfillment of one of its core mandates. He said NIMET monitors weather and climate in Nigeria and provides authoritative meteorological information for sustainable development and safety of life and property.

The NIMET DG, who spoke virtually, stated that the wide range of applications of NIMET's products and services made weather and climate information a relevant input in agriculture and almost all the sustainable development goals, including education.

The DG said most states in the country had experienced below normal rainfall this year, which he said had

already been predicted by NIMET for farmers to take appropriate measures.

Presenting an Overview of LINKS/FCDO Climate Smart Agriculture Projects, the Team Lead Links Project, Andrew Thorburn, said the project aimed to transform strategic value chains to improve resilience and reduce climate impact through systems of rice intensification, regenerative agriculture platform and sustainable fibre alternatives for cotton.

According to the Managing Director, Silvex International, Abubakar Usman Adam, the company was investing in farm estate for its newly introduced farm estate program in Jigawa and Nasarawa states

with the aim of bridging gaps in food production efficiency amidst climate change challenges.

During the Symposium, all the partners admitted that their collaboration with the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) would boost food production and address the challenges of climate change.

DRIP: Award Of Year 2020 Institution Based Research Grant
