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n Date for 2021/2022 Session to November 1st **Senate Extends Resumn**

The senate of Bayero University, Kano at its 392nd candidates for admission. It was also observed that about meeting held on Wednesday, 22nd September, 2021 approved the extension of the resumption date for the 2021/2022 new academic session to 1st November, 2021.

According to a statement signed by the Acting Registrar, Malam Jamil Ahmad Salim, the decision to extend the resumption date by one month was to accommodate many candidates whose 2021 SSCE results were yet to be released.

"The Senate at its 392nd meeting held on Wednesday, 22nd September, 2021 while reviewing the admission process noted the JAMB Policy which made download of all candidates ordinary level results (WAEC, NECO and others) mandatory before any institution could propose

90% of the candidates who have qualified for admissions by scoring 180 points and above are awaiting O' level results," said the Registrar.

Consequently, the statement added, "In view of the fact that the NECO results would be officially released in the first week of October and the hope to give many candidates the chance to qualify for the admission, Senate decided to extend the resumption date by one month in order to accommodate as many candidates as possible to reduce the number of dropouts."

The Registrar said the new session (2021/2022) would now commence on 1st November, 2021 while lectures are to start by 8th November, 2021.

Mambayya Commences 2nd Phase of MacArthur Project Worth \$800,000

project (2018-2020) funded by John D. and Catherine T. Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and students MacArthur Foundation, Mambayya House was granted a second phase of the project (2021-2024) worth \$800,000.

As grantee, the Centre will implement the project with four sub-grantees namely: The Interfaith Network Against Corruption (INAC), Kano; The Interfaith Mediation Centre (IMC), Kaduna; The Inter-religious Coalition Against Corruption in Nigeria (ICAC), Lagos; and The University of Nigeria Nsukka Muslim Community (UNNMC), Nsukka. The project will run from July 1st, 2021 to June 30th, 2024.

All preliminary preparations to flag-off the project have been on top gear for the last few months. Thus, on Wednesday, September 11, 2021, Mambayya House held a One-Day Project Planning Meeting and Capacity Building Workshop on Development of M&E Framework which was attended by all the sub-grantees.

While declaring the workshop open, Prof. Ismaila M. Zango, the Director Mambayya House, said that the project titled: Promoting Accountability and Anti-Corruption Using Behavioral Approach was aimed at mobilizing and educating citizens to actively engage in activities that strengthen social accountability and improve service delivery at grassroots.

After successful completion of the 3-year anti-corruption religious leaders, Faith-Based Organizations (FBOs), associations/clubs as "voice actors" of behavioral change for citizens, to be able to recognize, speak out, resist and report any corrupt behaviour that comes their way.

> "The project also provides religious/community-based approaches to change the nonchalant and indifferent attitudes of citizens and encourage them to imbibe a culture of close monitoring, constant demand of services they are entitled to and use of redress mechanisms available to them". He reiterated.

> In his presentation at the workshop, Dr. Moses T. Aluaigba, who is the Program Officer of the project, explained that strategies of engagement with target actors designed to serve as "touch-points" include training programs for FBOs, CBOs and Student clubs to have skills and knowledge they need to carry out anti-corruption activities. This will also address their specific weaknesses in the areas of reporting and documentation, evidence collection and internal accountability mechanisms (i.e. financial and audit reports) already identified during the first phase of the On Nigeria Project 1.0,2018-2020.

> Dr. Aluaigba added that, civil society networks, radio programs, inter-schools debates and social media messaging will be utilised to apply "levers of change" available through provision of information and incentives of changing the narrative of corruption in Nigeria. This concerted awareness campaign, according to him, would make citizens understand the negative impacts of corruption on their lives and livelihoods. Thus, they will be eager to own and sustain the anti-corruption fight with expected positive outcomes at the end of the project in 2024.
