

he Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has said the current predicament facing the country necessitated the need for a shift in thinking and a change in ideology and modalities in order to get out of the problems and prosper as a nation.

He spoke on Thursday, 11th November, 2021 at the harmonized induction ceremony of the Graduands of Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Science, Bachelor of Radiography, Bachelor of Nursing Science and the Bachelor of Physiotheraphy, which took place at the Convocation Arena and noted that the only way out was for the adoption of new strategy and approach.

"Our country is on trial now, and we face economic predicaments as well as many social problems that necessitate a shift in thinking and a change in ideologies and modalities," said Professor Abbas. He charged the newly inducted health professionals to consider the current societal problems of paramount concern to them.

"You should know that all of you as health care professionals are needed more than ever. Societal problems and solutions should be your concern. The country, Nigeria should be your sole interest and your energy should be expended in helping your societies, towns and cities," he charged.

The Vice Chancellor reaffirmed the determination of the University Management towards providing an enabling environment that would ease teaching and learning, disclosing that a substantial amount of money had been expended in the provision of modern equipment in the University.

Professor Abbas charged the inductees to remain as good ambassadors of the university by showing good conduct and professionalism wherever they find themselves. He equally commended the respective Boards and Council of the Professional bodies for their support and understanding.

"Sir, with due respect, we wish to appeal and request for a special consideration from the Board, to increase our admission quota for the

Bachelor of Physiotherapy. I assure you that we have adequate facilities and personnel to accommodate the additional students, but sincerely, 50 candidates per session is too inadequate for us", he passionately appealed.


