CDA, YAS-HortiNigeria Empower Youth to Launch Careers in Agripreneurship

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University Kano, in collaboration with the YAS-HortiNigeria programme has concluded a one-week capacity-building workshop aimed at equipping young people with practical skills to thrive as agripreneurs in the horticulture sector.

The training, held from Monday, 8th to Friday, 12th December 2025, brought together over 60 selected youth who were eager to turn their interest in agriculture into sustainable business opportunities.

In his opening remarks, the Director of CDA, Professor Sanusi Gaya Mohammed, charged the participants to make

Professor Musa assured the delegation that their observations and request regarding the extension of worship centres at the new campus would receive due attention at the appropriate level. the best use of the knowledge gained, stressing that the initiative was designed to open doors for them in modern horticulture.

He explained that the programme was beyond theory and was structured to take them through every stage of horticultural production, from land preparation to planting and harvesting at the CDA Training and Research Farm, adding that the CDA remained committed to supporting youth who demonstrated competence and resilience and congratulated them for being selected to benefit from the YAS-HortiNigeria programme.

Also speaking, the Deputy Director, Research and Innovation at the CDA, Dr. Mustapha Mohammed Bello, explained that the YAS-HortiNigeria programme is simultaneously training youth in four locations across Nigeria. He noted that with the completion of the training session, the start-up phase would begin, where the trainees would be supported to establish and manage their horticultural plots at the CDA Farm.

The trainees would be grouped into clusters, each cultivating its chosen vegetable(s), adopting the best agronomic practices learned during the training. He urged them to put in their utmost effort, as the success of this phase could create more opportunities for them in future

agribusiness ventures.

In a remarks, the Youth in Agribusiness (YAS) Training Coordinator at International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA, Muniratu Jibrin, revealed that the programme had already exceeded its national target of training 10,000 youth, reaching 10,606 as of September 2025.

She expressed delight that the CDA trainees had joined the programme, emphasizing that its purpose was not just to provide theoretical knowledge but to ignite entrepreneurship among youth. She added that the partnership was designed to ensure that the skills acquired would empower them to support themselves and impact their households and communities.

A number of participants expressed appreciation, describing the experience as transformative. They explained that the programme changed their perception of agriculture, noting that the training was enlightening and had shifted their mindset positively toward agribusiness.

Trio of Mohammed Idris Salasi, Programme Director, HortiNigeria, Oprah Fasgbon, YAS-HortiNigeria Lead Administrator, and Olabisi Ilebami, Innovation and Regional Diversification Lead, HortiNigeria in their separate introductory speeches informed the participants that the partnership with CDA was designed to equip youth with the best agronomic practices and agribusiness skills, and support them with resources that would enable them to establish themselves as agricultural entrepreneurs.

BUK- MBA Class Renovates School Building in Gwale

The Master of Business Administration (MBA) students of Bayero University, Kano (BUK) have renovated a classroom block and provided new chairs and tables in Warure Primary School in Gwale Local Government Area of Kano State.

The intervention, carried out by the MBA Part-Time Regular III Class of 2023, was part of a group assignment under the course - Global Economic Environment. The course explored key global and development issues such as globalization, international trade, poverty, foreign aid, foreign direct investment (FDI), imperialism and neo-colonialism.

Focusing on the theme of "Development," students were guided by the Theory of Change and tasked with forming groups of 20–25 to identify real societal problems and address them through self-driven initiatives aimed at emphasizing reduced dependence on government and increased citizen responsibility.

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As their chosen project, the group undertook the renovation of a classroom block and supplied chairs and tables to improve the learning environment at Warure Primary School, Sani Buhari Daura Street, Aisami, in Gwale LGA. The project was officially commissioned on Saturday, 14th December 2025.

Speaking on behalf of the group, the students described the initiative as a modest but impactful contribution to national development. "Our project is a small but significant step towards addressing development challenges in Nigeria. By working together, we can create positive changes and contribute to the country's growth and development," they stated.

The project highlights the importance of human capital development and community engagement, demonstrating how

academic learning can translate into tangible social impact. According to the course coordinator, the assignment was designed to push students beyond theory and encourage problem-solving rooted in local realities.

DRIP Hosts Workshop on High-Impact Research, Publications, Grant Acquisition and Technology Transfer

The Directorate of Research Innovation and Partnerships in collaboration with Gamji Educational and Mentorship Forum (GEMF) has organized a two-day workshop aimed at enhancing the capacity of Research Fellows across BUK's research centers through equipping them with essential skills in research methodology, grant acquisition, academic publishing, innovation and commercialization.

The workshop took place on Monday, 8th and Tuesday 9th December, 2025 at CDA Conference Room, BUK New Campus.

Declaring the Workshop open, the Chairperson and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Research and Development, Prof. Amina Mustapha, noted that the collaborative training was designed to equip research fellows and academic staff in the University with cutting-edge research according to global perspectives.

Prof. Mustapha pointed out that mentorship in research and development is regarded as power catalyst for improving and motivating researchers with knowledge and skills. She urged the participants to make use of the two-day training to make connections, curiosity and impact-able researches, in order to move BUK further.

In his welcome remarks, the Director of DRIP, Prof. Abdullahi Suleiman Arabi, appreciated the organizers particularly GEMF and the University through the office of DVC R&D for supporting the programme. He was delighted for the immense contribution of the facilitators and participants for their presence and active participation in the workshop.

In his address, the President of the GEMF, Dr. Buhari Lawan Muhammad, of the Sangmyung University, Seoul, South Korea, expressed delight for collaborating with Bayero University, Kano on the workshop. He described the workshop as an avenue that strengthened High-impact researches with global academic partnerships as well as acquainted local participants with mentorship and training according to global best practices and opportunities.

Presenting the Keynote lecture on ***“From Local Insight to Global Impact: Reimaging Research Excellence in African Universities,”*** Prof. Jane Maguire, from University of Technology Sydney, Australia, described research as last-long living, saying that the impact research could not be overemphasized. She attributed this with

journal choices, Metrics-multiple (SNIP, SJR, Quartile Q1...) with clear examples of high-impact researches using megastroke and gigastroke (Nature v Journal of Cerebrovascular disease).

She concluded by saying that high-impact researches played a pivotal role in shaping policies, practices and addressing pressing public challenges. She added that high impact researches for academics in developing countries enhanced global visibility, open doors for funding opportunities, foster career advancement and strengthened institutional reputations, among others.

In another Keynote presentation, Dr. Fanfang Zhang, from Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand spoke on ***“Beyond Good Writing: What Editors and Reviewers Look for in High-Quality Papers.”*** In the paper, she

described readability in writing as very essential but researchers often wrote insufficiently. She explained that editors prioritized rejecting papers due to lack of quality, relevance and rigour. She added that a well-written- papers may easily be rejected by editors for weak study, which she explained in part.

Dr. Harisu Abdullahi Shehu, from University of Wellington, New Zealand, presented a paper on academic writing and high-impact publications and explained deeply on high-impact manuscripts and choosing the right journal.

In another Presentation by Dr. Muhammad Chutiya, from University of Technology Sydney, Australia, took participants through research foundations, designs, practical skills and ethics, which he analyzed with practical examples, among other presentations.

During the Day-2 Session, Prof. Abba B. Gumel, from University of Maryland, College Park, USA, made the Keynote presentation on ***“Overview of Competitive Grant and International Funding Opportunities for African Researchers.”*** He explained that high quality research served the foundation for high quality publishing and this lead to building of credibility and global visibility and thus, resulted to competitive grant funding, which he said brought about global collaboration and growth to a project and nation at large.

Dr. Zilfekar Adamu, from London South Bank University, UK spoke on Innovation and Technology Transfer. He dissected his paper on transforming research outputs into market ready innovations and intellectual property protection; patents licensing and commercialization. He concluded that “if you have a solution to a problem, then you already have a business,” he stated.

The event featured questions and answer sessions from the participants who attended both physical and virtual and concluded with a closing remarks from Director of DRIP, Prof. Abdullahi Suleiman Arabi.

Zoo Road Staff Quarters Occupants Congratulate VC, Professor Haruna Musa

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, has reaffirmed the commitment of his administration towards welfare of staff and students of the University aimed at transforming the University into a world class institution.

He gave the assurance on Friday, 12th December, 2025, in his office when he received a delegation of Zoo Road Quarters Occupants' Association, Bayero University, Kano.

The Vice-Chancellor disclosed that as part of his administration's blueprint to improve the welfare of staff and students in all the campuses of the University, Zoo Road staff quarters would not be an exception.

Prof. Musa stated that he lived at Zoo Road quarters for 14 years (1996 to 2010), specifically at Block FC 33, stated that he knew some of the challenges they face, assuring that his administration would continue to prioritize the welfare of staff and facilities at Zoo Road Estate.

While attending to the requests presented to him by the delegation, including the agitation for additional rooms

and renovation of the blocks, sanitation, solar-powered street light and electricity, among others, the Vice Chancellor pointed out that following the policy of direct remitting 100% of staff quarters and students' hostel rents to federal government, it had become difficult for the University to continue on the quarterly release funds for

the maintenance. He, however, assured that the University would look into the request passionately.

On electricity supply, the VC lamented that the University payed between N110 to N130 million-naira monthly bill. He assured that with solarization policy of the federal government under the renewed hope agenda and the recent groundbreaking project on rural electrification agency for rehabilitation and upgrade of the New Campus solar power to 6MW and the expectation of another launching of 5MW in the beginning of next year, the issue of power would be a thing of the past.

He added that with the completion of the two projects, the New Campus would be upgraded to 11MW solar plant in line with the solarization of the Nigerian federal government universities and teaching hospitals which is under the renewed hope agenda, noting that the University would now focus attention on improving power supply to

other campuses of the University.

On shortage of cleaners for proper sanitation and solar-powered street light, the VC assured that the University would look into the possibility for prompt engagement on the requests. He thanked the delegation for the visit and wished them safe journey.

Earlier, the leader of the delegation, Prof. Ghali Saidu, from Department of Adult Education and Community Development Services, stated that the delegation was at the office of the Vice-Chancellor to congratulate on the VC on his 100 days in office and to brief him on some of the challenges faced by resident of Zoo Road Quarters which needed the attention of the Management including additional rooms, renovation, sanitation, electricity, owner occupier, solar-powered street light, among others.
