BUK Deepens Commitment to Qur'anic Studies with Two-Day Workshop on Teaching and Memorization Techniques

The Centre for Qur'anic Studies (CQS), Bayero University Kano, in collaboration with *Mafatihul Khair* Educational Consult (MKEC) and the Association of Model Islamic Schools (AMIS), has concluded a two-day workshop on Enhancing Qur'anic Education through Effective Teaching and Memorization Techniques.

The event, which took place on the 1st and 2nd of September 2025 at the Abubakar Rasheed Board Room,

reaffirmed the university's commitment to supporting the Centre, describing it as a hub for advancing Qur'anic scholarship and innovative teaching methods.

“The Centre has consistently lived up to the vision behind its establishment,” he said, “and this workshop is another milestone in its numerous contributions to the promotion of Qur'anic education.”

In his welcome address, the Director of the Centre, Professor Ahmad Murtala, highlighted the objectives of the workshop. He explained that the sessions were designed to help participants master modern and practical techniques of teaching and memorizing the Qur'an, to envision the model Qur'anic school, and to explore multiple intelligence strategies for effective memorization.

He stressed that Qur'anic education faced new challenges in today's world and teachers need innovative methods that blend tradition with contemporary realities.

The Chairman of the occasion, Sheikh Professor Ibrahim Mu'azzam Maibushira, charged participants to take full advantage of the opportunity. He reminded them that the role of a Qur'anic teacher goes beyond teaching recitation; it is also about instilling discipline, values, and faith in young learners.

“The knowledge you acquire here,” he said, “is not for personal pride but for building generations that will carry the Qur'an in their hearts and lives.”

Participants engaged in intensive sessions led by seasoned scholars. Ustaz Abdulhamid Aliyu Ibrahim spoke on modern techniques and approaches for teaching the Qur'an, while Dr. Shu'aib Mukhtar Shu'aib addressed practical strategies that teachers could adopt in classrooms

The bids were in 12 lots which were the expansion of the university clinic at the old campus; construction of Integrated Farm at New Campus; construction of Directorate of Research, Innovation and Partnership (DRIP); supply of specialized Veterinary equipment for the faculty of veterinary medicine; supply and installation of solar back up at the faculty of veterinary medicine and

construction of library for Open Distance and E- learning center.

The rest are; Furnishing and equipping of Center for Teaching and Learning at the New Campus; Construction of Plain Block wall fence (750M) along perimeter Boundary, New campus and Furnishing and Equipping of Micro- teaching Laboratory at the New Campus. The projects also included the 2024 TETFund Career Service Center Intervention Project to Supply assorted books and journals for the Career Service Center, Bayero University, Kano.

The 2021-2025 TETFund (merged) entrepreneurship intervention projects which are supply of Information technology Equipment for Entrepreneurship Center and supply, installation and commissioning of 177 Number Solar Street Lights at Bayero University, Kano.

The Director of Procurement, Alhaji Rabi Saggi in his remarks acknowledged the submission and assured all the bidders that their submission would be scrutinized by the technical evaluation committee, adding that those whose bids are technically responsive would be informed accordingly of the date for financial bid opening.

Registrar, Staff Laud Prof. Abbas for Historic Reforms and Global Recognition of BUK

The Registrar of Bayero University, Kano, Malam Haruna Aliyu, alongside senior staff and academics of the institution, have showered glowing tributes on the immediate past Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, for what they described as his gigantic impact in transforming the university's research, teaching, and community development.

receive a grant and certificate of occupancy for its land. He concluded that the history of BUK could never be written without the emphatic and meteoric contributions of Prof. Sagir Abbas.

The University Librarian, Dr. Kabir Dahiru Abbas, described him as a man of integrity and vision who always stood for due process. He congratulated Prof. Abbas on his legacy, stressing that his leadership had set a standard for accountability and excellence.

In her remarks, Professor Hajara Umar Sanda commended Prof. Abbas for navigating the university through some of its most difficult moments. She highlighted that despite the twin challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and prolonged ASUU strike in his first two years, he still delivered massive achievements that positioned BUK on a higher pedestal. She described his tenure as fulfilling and wished him success in all his future endeavors.

Professor Yusuf Garba, Director of Academic Planning, remarked that Prof. Abbas lived up to the expectations placed on him, noting that he began his tenure with prayers for good health and ended it with gratitude for having completed his five years successfully. Similarly, Prof. Nura Ibrahim, Head of the Department of Information and Media Studies, stated that the University community made the right choice by supporting Prof. Abbas, adding that his

leadership justified their confidence in him.

Other speakers, including Prof. Kassim of Engineering, Prof. Muhammad A.G. Zakariyya of Basic Medical Sciences, Dr. Gali Sa'idu, Prof. Fatima S. Koki, Kabiru Baba Mandawari, Comrade Sabiu, Professor Malami, Dr. Abba Ibrahim, Dr. Bashir Kaka, and Prof. Ali Abdullahi Tijjani, also lauded his achievements and prayed for his continued success.

He humbly reflected that although the first two years of his tenure were disrupted by the pandemic and industrial strikes, the remaining three were among the most productive in BUK's history.

“We have tried our best to do what we can,” he said, “and sometimes difficult decisions had to be made, which may have upset some staff, but in the end, they came as blessings to the University.”

Prof. Abbas concluded by thanking Almighty Allah for granting him wisdom, strength and resilience to achieve the successes celebrated today.

The ball swerved past a helpless Abdulmalik into the top corner, an absolute screamer that was worthy of any highlight reel and doubled SSANU's lead before halftime.

The second half resumed with high intensity as both sides chased more goals, making multiple substitutions to inject fresh energy into their squads. SSANU's Nura Garba came close to adding a third with a brilliant long-range free-kick, only for Abdulmalik to tip the ball away with the very edge of his fingertips in a spectacular save.

Despite the valiant efforts from both teams, no further goals were recorded, and the match ended 2-0 in favor of SSANU, who had earlier thrashed the Students' team 4-0 in another celebratory fixture.

The Registrar, Malam Haruna Aliyu, who graced the match, expressed heartfelt appreciation to both unions for organizing the thrilling event in his honor. He emphasized that such social engagements foster stronger bonds among staff and pledged continued support for staff welfare and unity.
