## Senator Barau to Build a State-of-the-Art Multi-Million Naira Twin Theatre at BUK

The Deputy President of the Senate, Senator Dr. Barau I. Jibrin, has approved the construction of a 300-capacity state-of-the-art twin theatre for Bayero University, Kano, in a move that has been described as a landmark intervention to address the infrastructural needs of the institution.

Disclosing the development, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Haruna Musa, said the gesture was one of the

"We are delighted that Senator Barau has once again demonstrated his deep concern for the advancement of education. This twin theatre, with a capacity of 300 seats, equipped with modern teaching and learning facilities, would serve as a major boost to our academic environment," the Vice Chancellor stated.

He added that the twin theatre would not only provide additional space but also set a new standard in lecture hall architecture within the institution.

The facility is expected to be fitted with modern multimedia technology, proper ventilation systems, and comfortable seating arrangements to enhance the learning experience for students.

Professor Musa commended Senator Barau for his unrelenting support to the university, describing him as a friend of education who has consistently intervened to uplift the sector in Kano and across the nation.

The Vice Chancellor stressed that such interventions bridge critical gaps in public university infrastructure, at a time when government alone could not shoulder the burden of funding.

"With this new theatre, students and lecturers alike will benefit from a conducive atmosphere that is in tune with global best practices," the Vice Chancellor said.

The construction of the twin theatre is part of broader efforts by BUK Management to expand its infrastructure to meet the demands of its growing student population and enhance its reputation as one of Nigeria's leading institutions of higher learning.

## BUK is Proud of the Global Recognition of ACEPHAP – VC, Prof. Musa

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, has described the Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) as one of the best performing Centers of Excellence not only in Nigeria, but also in the African Sub-region.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking when he received the Management of the ACEPHAP in his office on a

congratulatory visit on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2025.

He said the modest achievements of the Center since its elevation to the position of Center of Excellence courtesy World Bank grant gladdened the University Management, adding that “BUK is proud of ACEPHAP global

recognition, vast areas of partnerships and collaborations with stakeholders, and serve as one of the best World's Africa Centre of Excellence.”

On the Center's postgraduate programmes, the Vice Chancellor commended the Centre for producing 40 regional masters' students, 200 high impact journals, which he said added value to the global recognition of the University.

On the issue of regional students, Prof. Musa noted that the ambition of the University in global ranking would not be concluded without regional and other international students. He further disclosed that the University had a plan on regional students' drive and that the University had started discussion with foreign affairs on this.

The Vice Chancellor disclosed that TETFund had recognized BUK among the 18 public universities for PG programmes with N40 billion for upgrade of facilities in teaching and research, adding that this could be an opportunity in that regard.

He assured that the University had a robust plan to take BUK to greater height, adding that Management would continue to support and prioritize the university two Centres, CDA and ACEPHAP in view of the conclusion of the World Bank project to ensure their sustainability.

Earlier, the Director of ACEPHAP, Professor Hadiza Shehu Galadanci, said the management of the Center was in his office with 3 missions to congratulate him on his appointment of the 12<sup>th</sup> BUK Vice Chancellor, to brief him

on the position of the Centre and to solicit for support of the University towards regional students.

Prof. Galadanci went into history and told the Vice Chancellor that the Centre initially began as the Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRAT) and later metamorphosed into Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) after it participated in a competitive bidding and won a World Bank grant of \$6 million to become an ACE project.

She disclosed that the vision of the Centre was to be Africa Centre of Excellence and with a mission to produce human resources that can address developmental challenges of healthy living under sustainable Development Goals SDGs-3 (malaria, HIV, Tuberculosis and non-communicable diseases, among others). She added that the Centre collaborated with seven departments, including Obstetrics and Gynecology, Community Medicine, Pediatrics, Biochemistry, Community Health, Nursing and Psychiatry.

She added that the Centre also ran Masters and PhD programmes with students from ten (10) African countries including Ghana, Liberia, Cameroon, Kenya, Chad and Burkina Faso and Niger, among others. She said the essence of the programme was to promote the regionalization of resources across African countries.

## BUK REGISTRY ORGANIZES TRAINING FOR JUNIOR ADMINISTRATORS ON ADMINISTRATIVE EFFICIENCY

The Registry Department of Bayero University, Kano has organized a 2-day training on “Administrative Efficiency: Mastering Records, Reports and Minutes Writing.”

The training, which was held on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2025 at the Staff Training Toom, Abubakar Rasheed Senate, Building was aimed at equipping the participants with skills in record management, report writing and minute taking.

In his opening remarks shortly before he declared the workshop open, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, re-echoed BUK's commitment to excellence. He encouraged participants to maintain the tempo by being good ambassadors of the university.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the DVC Research and Development, Prof. Amina Mustapha, highlighted the importance and timeliness of the training, especially as the university strived to improve its position on global academic landscape.

Also speaking, the Registrar, Dr. Haruna Aliyu, who was represented by the Director, Establishment Matters, Malam Shehu Galadima, urged participants to demonstrate good work attitudes and sound judgment in decision making.

The head of Human Resource Department, Aisha Dahiru, in her remarks emphasized the importance of the training in enhancing their day to day activities in the registry. She, therefore, urged the participants to make the best use of the opportunity.

In his presentation, titled “Modern University Administrative Techniques,” the Director/Secretary, College of Postgraduate Studies, Dr. Garba Abdullahi Barume, emphasized the crucial

Prof. Galadanci revealed that the Centre had produced over 160 Master's students, including 40 regional students. She added that the Centre had entered into various academic partnerships within the country, regional and international in achieving its training and research goals and had published over 200 in high impact journals.

On capacity Building training, the Director stated that the Centre had trained over 120 staff of the University, both teaching and non-teaching. She however told the Vice-Chancellor that despite the achievements recorded, the Centre was facing a major challenge with the admission of regional students. She said since the completion of the World Bank grant in June 2025, which was being used to attract regional students through granting of scholarship, the center could not admit regional students again.

She told the VC that with the World Bank grant, the Centre made tuition fee and accommodation free to the regional students. In addition, the center also gave research stipends and transports allowances to them. But with the end of the World Bank grant, the Center could not afford to do that again. And as a result, the center could not admit regional students this year.

She solicited the support of the Management for a waiver of tuition fee for the regional students, adding that the regional students add value, positive impacts and visibility towards global recognition of the University.

He mentioned the essential functions of a registry, which

included report writing, minute taking, drafting memo, letter writing, organizing and handling meetings, which he said were vital for the day to day activities of the registry and the overall effectiveness of the organization.

Malam Mustapha Aminu, Senior Deputy Registrar in the Registrar, spoke on the “Roles and Functions of Professional Administrator.” He highlighted the critical roles and responsibilities of university administrators, particularly the Registrar. He said that according to the law establishing the Nigerian universities, the Registrar served as the Secretary to all University Committees, including Council, Senate,

Congregation and Convocation.

He said as the chief administrative officer of the university, the Registrar played a vital role in ensuring the smooth operation of these bodies, adding that university's professional administrators served as the secretaries to all university committees, underscoring their importance in supporting decision making process.

Mustapha Aminu, who is also the Chairman of SSANU, BUK Branch, identified the factors that could hinder the smooth running of the administration, including ineffective communication, inadequate information or knowledge, poor rotational plan and lack of mutual understanding.

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the training, Malam Sheriff Ahmed, the Director, Vice Chancellor's Office, in his presentation tilted: "Effective Minutes and report writing," he defined report as a brief note of memorandum, while minutes according to him refers to the official written record of a meeting which includes discussions, decisions and action taken.

He said the structure of minutes included title, date, time and the location of a meeting, the list of attendees, beginning with the Chairman and closing with the Secretary.

The Registrar, Dr. Haruna Aliyu, in his presentation, titled "Records Management," said without proper records there would be no registry. He defined records as documentary evidence of business transactions or documents created or received in an office setting that supported an organization's business and meets legal and regulatory requirement; it holds intrinsic and historical value and provides evidential value, ensure transparency and accountability.

Dr. Aliyu, mentioned the various types of records in university settings to include students records such as enrollment, admission, grades, transcripts, certificates and attendance. Others are faculty records, such as employment history, teaching evaluation and performance appraisal; academic records such as course syllabus, curriculum development documents and academic policies; financial records, such as tuition payments, scholarships, financial aids and grants.

## BUK Expels 57, Rusticates 8 and Exonerates 2

## Prof. Rijiyar Lemo Urges Modesty, Humility in BUK Weekly Lecture

Renowned Islamic scholar, Professor Sani Umar Rijiyar Lemo, has urged Muslims to embrace modesty and humility in all aspects of life, warning against arrogance, self-righteousness, and looking down on others.

Delivering his weekly lecture series Al-Fawā'id on Wednesday, September 24, 2025, at the Bayero University Kano (BUK) New Campus Central Mosque, Professor Muhammad Umar Sani Rijiyar Lemo reminded the faithfuls that true piety lies with Allah alone, who alone knows those that are close to Him.

He cautioned believers against displaying superiority in religiosity or assuming that they are more pious than others. "Only Allah knows who are with Him," he said, stressing that the habit of passing judgment on the spiritual

standing of others contradicts Islamic teachings.

Quoting from the Hadith of Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him), the Sheikh explained that no one should ever lose hope in Allah's mercy. He noted that Allah, in His infinite wisdom, can transform a sinner into a pious and God-fearing person, just as He can test a devout servant by leading him astray if he becomes arrogant, eventually causing him to die in disbelief. "This is why humility, modesty, and hope in Allah's forgiveness are essential in the life of every Muslim," he added.

The weekly ta'alim attracted a large congregation of students, staff, and worshippers who listened attentively as the scholar emphasized the importance of sincerity in faith and good conduct in daily interactions.
