



COREN Cautions Institutions Against Unapproved Engineering Programmes

The Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN) has cautioned tertiary institutions across the country against running unapproved engineering programmes, describing such actions as illegal and punishable under its regulations.

The warning was issued by the leader of COREN's accreditation team, Professor Engr. Abdulkarim Nasir, FNSE, during a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano (BUK), Professor Haruna Musa, fsi.

The visit marked the commencement of an accreditation exercise for seven engineering programmes at the University.

Professor Nasir said the Council was in BUK to assess Agricultural Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Mechatronics Engineering, Civil Engineering and Telecommunications Engineering programmes.

He expressed concern over the growing number of institutions offering engineering-related courses without securing the mandatory approval of COREN, warning that

the Council would not hesitate to impose sanctions on any erring institution.

“Any university or polytechnic that mounts engineering programmes without COREN's accreditation is acting outside the law,” Professor Nasir said. “Such programmes

Governing Council Ratifies Appointment of Prof. Tsauni as DVC (Academics)

The Governing Council of Bayero University, Kano has ratified the appointment of Professor Ahmad Muhammad Tsauni as the new Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), following the recommendation of the University Senate at its 428th meeting held on Wednesday, 2nd October, 2025.

According to a letter of appointment dated 24th October, 2025, and signed by the Registrar and Secretary to Council, Malam Haruna Aliyu, the appointment is for a period of two years, effective from Monday, 27th October, 2025.

The ratification underscores the confidence of both the Senate and the Council in Professor Tsauni's outstanding academic record, leadership qualities, and commitment to the University's mission of excellence in teaching, research, and community service.

As Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Tsauni is expected to oversee the coordination of academic activities across all faculties, enhance curriculum development, and uphold the University's standards for academic quality and innovation.

Professor Ahmad Muhammad Tsauni born in Tsauni quarters of Nasarawa Local Government of Kano state,

graduated with first class in 1998 and M. Sc in 2004 obtained his Ph.D. in Economics in 2009 all from from Bayero University, Kano, where he graduated as the best student at the undergraduate, M.Sc., and Ph.D. levels.

He began his academic career at Bayero University in 2004 as a Graduate Assistant and steadily rose through the ranks to become a Professor of Economics in 2019.

With more than two decades of experience in teaching, research, and policy engagement, Professor Tsauni has supervised over ten doctoral candidates and numerous Master's and undergraduate students. He has also served as an external examiner for postgraduate programmes in several Nigerian universities.

Over the years, he has held key academic and administrative positions within the university system. These include Level Coordinator at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels, Departmental Examinations Officer, Sub-Dean of the Faculty of Social and Management Sciences, Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, Head of Department of Economics, and Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences. He currently serves as the Director of Bayero University Press.

In addition to his administrative roles, Professor Tsauni has made valuable contributions as a member of numerous departmental, faculty, and university-wide committees, demonstrating a consistent dedication to institutional development and academic governance.

Professor Tsauni, delivered his Professorial Inaugural Lecture on 19th December 2024, titled "Economic Progress on a Tightrope," where he offered deep scholarly reflections on the dynamics and challenges of economic development.

His academic and professional expertise covers Development Economics, Energy Economics, Health Economics, and Industrial Economics. Through his research, publications, and service to the university, Professor Tsauni has made substantial contributions to policy analysis, academic advancement, and institutional strengthening across Nigeria.

Members of the University community have congratulated Professor Tsauni on his well-deserved appointment, expressing confidence that his vision and experience will further strengthen the University's academic standing and foster greater innovation and productivity in teaching and research.

Their combined efforts also facilitated the installation of solar-powered security lighting strategically placed across the

faculty premises to enhance safety and visibility.

This latest phase of solar power installation builds on an earlier project implemented last year, when the HausaNLP research group powered critical infrastructure in some departments of the faculty. The new development extends the benefits of clean, renewable energy to key teaching and learning facilities, reinforcing the faculty's commitment to sustainable solutions.

The solar upgrade is expected to enhance teaching delivery by ensuring stable electricity for projectors and other digital tools, as well as providing an enabling environment for students to use laptops during lectures. It will also improve the overall security of the Faculty of Computing's environment, contributing to a more efficient and technology-driven learning atmosphere.

NARS-BUK Chapter Conducts Community Outreach on Breast Cancer Awareness




