



BUK Hosts Nigeria Customs Service PR Workshop 2025

The doors of Bayero University, Kano would be wide open for collaboration with the Nigeria Customs Service in the areas of training and institutional development, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, has disclosed.

Speaking when he received a delegation from the Nigeria Customs Service led by the Acting Deputy Comptroller General Enforcement Inspection and Investigation Department of the Nigeria Customs Service, Mr. Timi Bomodi, in his office on Monday 20th September, 2025, the Vice Chancellor said he was aware of the remarkable achievements recorded under the vibrant leadership of the Comptroller General, Mr. Bashir Adewale Adeniyi, particularly in terms of revenue generation in the country. He noted that it exceeded the targeted N5 billion to N6 trillion in 2024.

Professor Musa said he was informed that they were in BUK to hold its 2025 Public Relations Workshop in the University and thanked the command for choosing BUK to host the all-important workshop and wished them a fruitful deliberation.

Earlier, Mr. Bomodi, the Custom's team leader, had told the Vice Chancellor that they were in the University to hold their 2025 Public Relations Workshop, saying that the hosting of the event would go a long way to strengthen the existing collaboration between the two bodies.

He added that BUK was chosen to host the workshop not only for its pedigree in Nigerian Customs Service but also for the National and International recognition.

Mr. Bomodi further told the Vice-Chancellor that the workshop with the theme, "Beyond Masters of Ceremonies: The Strategic Role of Public Relations Officers for Institutional Growth and Stakeholders' Trust" was aimed at educating Officers with a view of developing their skills, through cross fertilization of ideas with academia for a better productivity in the service.

He thanked the Management of the University for the reception accorded to his team and prayed for a successful deliberation throughout the week of the workshop and hoped this would be the beginning of the strategic engagements with academia.

In his vote of thanks, the coordinator of the programme, who is from BUK, Prof. Sule Ya'u Sule, thanked the University for providing the support and the atmosphere for the workshop to thrive, noting that it was rare for Nigerian Customs Service to have their workshops or conferences in the Universities within the country, adding that for the Comptroller-General of the Nigeria Customs Service to graciously decided to hold this year's conference in BUK rather than the in the United States, showed the tremendous respect he had for the University.

NERDC Clarifies Revised Basic and Senior Secondary Education Curricula, Debunks Misinformation

The Nigerian Educational Research and Development Council (NERDC) has issued a public clarification on the newly revised Basic Education Curriculum (BEC) and Senior Secondary Education Curriculum (SSEC), urging Nigerians to disregard false claims and misleading statements circulating on social media.

In a statement signed by its Executive Secretary, Professor Salisu Shehu, the Council noted that the Federal Ministry of Education had already made a formal pronouncement on the approved curricula, with implementation guidelines released to schools, stakeholders, and the general public.

According to NERDC, the revised curricula are designed to be needs-driven, evidence-based, and reflective of both global best practices and Nigeria's unique social, cultural, and developmental contexts.

Professor Shehu emphasized that the reform is part of the National Education Sector Renewal Initiatives (NESRI) and follows the mandatory review of education content at designated intervals.

“The new curricula are the outcomes of broad stakeholder consultations and expert processes. They integrate 21st-century skills, encourage the teaching of digital technologies, robotics, and positive artificial intelligence, while also strengthening moral, civic, and cultural values,” the statement read.

Contrary to speculation, the Council stressed that no derogatory or divisive elements were introduced into the new curricula. Instead, the reforms seek to promote national unity, peaceful coexistence, and religious tolerance. It reaffirmed that Islamic Studies (IS) and Christian Religious Studies (CRS) remain elective subjects at the senior secondary school level, offered strictly in line with learners' faith backgrounds.

On subject offerings, NERDC highlighted that subjects have been streamlined to reduce overload and create more time for active learning. At the basic education level, learners will study between 9 and 13 subjects depending on their grade, while at the senior secondary level, core compulsory subjects include English Language,


Mathematics, Citizenship and Heritage Studies, Digital Technologies, and one trade subject.

The trade subjects—ranging from solar photovoltaic installation and fashion design to computer hardware and livestock farming—are intended to enhance employability and support Nigeria's industrial growth. For learners with special needs, resource-based subjects such as Braille Reading and Writing, Independent Living Skills, and Orientation and Mobility have been developed to ensure inclusivity.

Implementation of the revised curricula has already begun and will roll out at the start of each new three-year cycle—Primary 1, Primary 4, JSS 1, and SSS 1. The official subject listings and guidelines are available on the Council's website (www.nerdc.gov.ng).

NERDC also announced plans for nationwide sensitization campaigns, teacher training, and collaboration with the Nigerian Publishers Association to ensure smooth implementation.

Professor Shehu appealed to Nigerians to rely only on authentic information provided by the Council, adding that “the approved and valid list of subjects remains as indicated by NERDC. Speculative lists and fabricated

VC Pledges to Introduce Research Administrative Cadre in the University, Commend DRIP on Modest Achievements

The Directorate of Research Innovation and Partnership (DRIP) has played a pivotal role in shaping the University's international ranking, promoting Institutional Based-Research (IBR) monitoring framework, securing patent vendors to the University.

This was disclosed by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, when he received the Management of DRIP in his office on Tuesday, 16th September, 2025.

He commended the leadership of DRIP for the giant stride recorded and elevation of the Directorate and the

University to greater heights.

Prof. Musa pledged to support the Directorate aimed at raising research status as well as enhancing the international visibility of the University to rub shoulders among the top 50 in Africa and the top 500 in the world. He noted that with the current status of BUK, which was at 1,215, he strongly believed that with the vibrancy of the Directorate this could be achieved in the next five years.

The Vice Chancellor was happy with the Directorate's effective monitoring and fund utilization framework,

which he said was in line with the IBR grants policy. He urged the Research Ethics Committees operating in the Universities to continue to reach out to other stakeholders, industry and policy makers and sustain training and retraining of staff on capacity building and concept note proposal writings.

While commending DRIP on patenting, incubation and

other creations, Prof. Musa said visibility of the University was of paramount importance to the Management. He promised to continue to support DRIP on its effort to come out with research mechanism and effective guidelines and enforcement to researchers in the University.

He assured that the Management was in top gear in reaching out to potential national and international collaborators outside the University through A. A. Zaura and Prof. Muktar Aliyu Daneji of Vanderbilt Foundations, saying that the Management had laid down the foundation for smooth access to internet on research through engaging three ICT recognized vendors to operate in the University. He further assured the team that the University had a blueprint of creating a Research Administrative cadre in

the University.

Earlier, the Director of DRIP, Professor Abdullahi Suleiman Arabi, who led the delegation, congratulated the Vice-Chancellor and noted some progress, prospect and challenges of the Directorate to include successful training of Institutional Based-Research (IBR), National Research Fund (NRF) Grant Cycle 2025, concept note writing and quarterly meeting with stakeholders from faculties, research centres, units, on improving research in the University, among others.

Prof. Arabi disclosed the nine policies developed by the Directorate to include; Intellectual Property (IP) policy, Authorship policy, Journal Publishing policy, Research Ethics and Integrity policy, policy on Research Centres and ongoing Artificial Intelligent (AI) policy, among others.

The Director told the Vice-Chancellor that the Directorate had succeeded in securing funding from TETFund under the IBR with over N240 million and NRF with over N1.3 billion through 2020-24, adding that the fund had been the greatest and stabilize output in the University. He also noted that under the BUK small research grants 2025, the Directorate was able to secure 11 successful proposals, which were recently published.

He assured that DRIP would continue to encourage staff through the mechanism of training and workshop to increase external funding with the support from the Management.

Prof. Arabi further noted that the progress achieved was not without some challenges and mentioned some to include resistant patent, lack of collaborations among researchers, complexity of research environment and inadequate research fund through IGR, among others.

He solicited the support of the University Management for a provision of vehicle to the Directorate to ease its mobility on research activities, among others.

BUK Hosts North-West Indigent Scholarship Screening Exercise for Sir Ahmadu Bello Memorial Foundation – VC Commends Foundation for Promoting Sardauna's Legacies

The North-West screening exercise for the Sir Ahmadu Bello Memorial Foundation Indigent Scholarship took place on Thursday 18th September, 2025 at Bayero University, Kano.

Speaking during a courtesy call on the Vice-Chancellor before the screening exercise, the Director-General of the Foundation, Engr. Abubakar Gambo Umar, told the Vice Chancellor that the Sir Ahmadu Bello Memorial Foundation started the indigent scholarship scheme in 2012 with the vision to fill the gaps in Science-based courses in northern Nigeria.

He revealed that the team was at the University to conduct a screening exercise for the North-west region, comprising shortlisted students from universities in Jigawa, Katsina and Kano states, among other states. He stated that similar exercises were currently going on at various places in the

northern zonal regions. He added that the exercise was being conducted annually and ten (10) slots were allocated

per state, totaling 200 beneficiaries from the Foundation.

Engr. Umar further disclosed that the scholarship would last up to the students' graduation. He explained that the aim of the scholarship was a payback to the society and a modest contribution to education at large.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, appreciated the visit and acknowledged the support and prayers of the team leader. He thanked the Foundation for choosing BUK to host this important exercise, assuring the visitors that the University would support the Foundation to achieve its mandate.

He noted that the Foundation's activities, especially prioritizing on scholarship scheme to indigent students,

was in line with Sir Ahmadu Bello's legacies and ambitions on education and socio-economic development of northern Nigeria and Nigeria as a whole.

Department of Community Health Visits Vice Chancellor

Inadequate lower ranking academics are gradually eroding the culture of mentor and mentee relationship in the university, which is critical to developing practical skills and necessary guidance to enhance skills.

This was disclosed by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa, when he received delegates from the Department of Community Medicine who had paid him a visit in his office on Tuesday 9th September, 2025.

The Head of the Department, Dr. Fatima Tsiga, in her remarks congratulated the Vice Chancellor on behalf of the team for his well-deserved appointment, which would strengthen BUK's role as a center of excellence in teaching and research.

She said as a parent department and custodian of public health discipline organized into six specialty unit central to both undergraduate and post graduate training had the potential of evolving into full-fledged departments.

Dr. Tsiga said the department had 14 academics out which 10 were Professors with a proven track record in teaching, research and community service which aligned with the University's strategic vision of expanding into post graduate training and producing highly skilled manpower.

She said the department, despite its strength and potential, was faced with challenges, such as inadequate middle-level and early career academics to sustain teaching,

research and mentorship, lack of equipment and technical staff which was hindering practical training and research; inadequate infrastructure and a growing demand of postgraduate training, which could not be met without

adequate facilities and staff that would support for accreditation,

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Musa expressed his delight and appreciation for the visit. He promised to address all the challenges as soon as possible, which, he said, were part of the criterion to achieving the mandate of enhancing BUK's visibility internationally.

On the issue of inadequate lower academics, the Vice Chancellor disclosed that there was already a window of opportunity to recruit staff in the university, which would be based on the needs of the University and urged them to

come up with potential candidates, if they had any.

Prof. Musa said the management was already engaged with an agency to build a multi- purpose laboratory to address the problem of nonfunctional laboratory so as to enhance

This is to inform the general public that online sale of the Bayero University, Kano, Postgraduate Application Forms for the 2025/2026 Academic Session has commenced on Monday 22nd September, 2025.

All interested Applicants should visit the Bayero University website: www.mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/cpsforms2025 for details about available programmes and the procedure of applying online. Please note the following information:

1. The cost of each application is twelve thousand Naira (N12,000) only.
2. The duration of the sale and submission of Application Forms is from Monday 22nd September, 2025 until Saturday 16th May, 2026.
3. An Applicant should ensure that he/she has the entry requirements for the programme applied for, plus five 'O' Level Credits including English Language and Mathematics as appropriate.
4. Applicants for Ph.D/M.Phil and Academic Masters' programmes should ensure that transcripts of their academic records are sent to the Secretary, School of Postgraduate Studies, Bayero University, Kano. Note that Applicants for Ph.D programmes are to provide a short research proposal of not more than 350 words in the space provided on the online application form. The proposal should include title, statement of the problem and objectives.

The Application Procedure

STEP 1: Visit www.mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/cpsforms2025 and under the PROSPECTIVE STUDENT TAB click Applications at the home page. Login using FULL NAME OF THE APPLICANT and select "Applying for a Postgraduate Programme". A username and password will be generated for you. Please take careful note of them, as you need them for subsequent steps of the application process.

STEP 2: Login to your account and generate/print your BUK Personalised Payment Form (BUKPPF). Anon-refundable application fee of N12,000 (twelve thousand Naira Only) is reflected on applicant's BUKPPF, to be paid using *Remita ePayments* and *e-Collection* platform (www.remita.net). Applicants must make sure that they entered ALL the information of the BUKPPF EXACTLY. Applicants must also ensure that all of the following are captured exactly as they are written on the BUKPPF:

STEP 3: Return to www.mybuk2.buk.edu.ng/cpsforms2025 and login with your username and password to fill in the Application Forms;

Qualifications Form. (Make sure you state clearly your type of degree)
- STEP 4 Transcript Request Form shall also be filled by candidates for Ph.D, M.Phil and Academic Masters' Programmes in addition to the forms listed in Step 3 above. The applicant prints and processes this at the relevant institution.
- STEP 5 Review your forms to ensure accuracy of all information provided. Click 'SUBMIT' to complete the application process.
- STEP 6 An Acknowledgement Slip will be generated for you immediately. Print the Slip and keep it safe. The slip will be needed during the collection of admission letter, screening and during registration.

NB: successful applicants are to note that upon admission they will be required to submit their NYSC discharge certificates, certificate of exemption or exclusion, among other documents during the screening exercise.
