### CALL FOR PAPERS

The Centre for Qur'anic Studies, Bayero University, Kano, invites interested scholars to submit research articles, papers, book reviews and Seminar/Conference reports for publication in the Maiden edition of its journal, Al Māhir Journal of Qur'anic Studies ( AJQS ). The Journal is a specialized, peer-reviewed, academic publication in the area of Qur'anic studies. Only articles that have clear relevance to the field of Qur'anic studies may be considered for publication in the Journal. The Journal would give special focus to issues related to the traditional Qur'anic schools (*Tsangaya*) in Nigeria and innovative ways of promoting their relevance in contemporary Muslim society.

#### **Notes for contributors:**

The article should normally be between 15 to 16 pages including endnotes and references, typed double-spaced, 12 font, with ample margins on one side of A4 sized paper.

Authors should submit two hard-copies and a soft copy of the manuscript. E-mail submissions are also accepted in pdf format and one formatted as an MS Word attachment.

**Cover Sheet:** The cover sheet should contain the title of the paper, name of the author, institutional affiliation and full contact details.

**Abstract:** An abstract of approximately 200 words should be provided.

**End notes/ references:** References and notes should be marked serially and placed at the end of the manuscript.

**Quotations from Qur'ān and ḥadīth:** Verses of the Qur'ān quoted in English should be preceded by the Arabic original (not transliteration) and

set apart from the body of the text. Reference to Qur'ānic chapters and verses should follow the quotation in the text, in brackets. Quotations from ḥadīth books should indicate volume, page or number of ḥadīth and also preferably stating the standard of the ḥadīth form dependable sources.

**Illustrations:** Illustrations made using a photograph, image, drawing, diagram or chart should be sharp and camera ready.

**Indenting of quotations :** Quotations of more than 3 lines should be indented by 1 cm on both left and right margins, with a line space above and below.

**Transliteration:** The standard table of transliteration provided below should be used

**References:** References are to be documented at the end of the paper to be arranged alphabetically according to the format illustrated below:

**Books:**

Author (surname first, honorific- *laqab*- is also acceptable), Date of publication, Title of book, Publishers, Place of publication, e.g;

Al Faruqi, I.R, (1998) *Al Tawheed; Its implications for Thought and Life*; IIIT, Herndon, Virginia.

**Journals and edited Books:**

Author, Date, title of article, editor's name, book title, Publisher, Place of Publication, e.g;
