Mambayya House Leads Roundtable on the Dilemma of Democratization ...As Prof. Jega Advocates for Restructuring in Nigeria

Mambayya House, the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies in collaboration with the United States Institute of Peace (USIP) has organized a roundtable discussion on the dilemma of democratization process in Nigeria.

The round table which held on Tuesday, March 30th, 2021 at Sa'adu Zungur Auditorium Complex, Mambayya House, titled: **Nigeria and the Dilemma of Democratization**, has brought together Professor Attahiru M. Jega, *OFR*, former INEC Chairman, Dr. Abubakar Siddique Mohammed, Director, CEDDERT, Zaria, Amb. Sani Bala Saulawa (Wanban Katsina), also Director, Savannah Centre for Diplomacy, Democracy and Development (SCDDD),

Abuja, many erudite professors and other civil society organizations who actively presented their views on the matters discussed.

The roundtable was opened by the USIP Country Manager, Mr. Zango Abdu, who offered a welcome note to the participants and gave an overview of the activities of USIP. He further stressed the importance of peace to democracy by giving a brief background of the work of the Institution.

During the discussion, the quest for restructuring Nigeria and the challenge of corruption in democratic governance has generated ideas, strategies and recommendations that can be useful to overcome the challenges faced by the country's democratization.

Professor Attahiru Jaga, in his paper titled: The Quest for Restructuring and Nigeria's Democratization Process stated that there is a convergence between the demands for restructuring and the progress Nigeria should make in terms of making the country a fully democratic country.

Professor Jega argued that, although there is a lot of political brinkmanship by politicians and some extremist groups on the quest for restructuring, but we need to put that brinkmanship aside and look at the substantive issues in which restructuring can help the country develop socio-

economically and democratically.

Jega further argued that it is possible to between now and the year 2023 to restructure Nigeria in terms of devolution of responsibilities, powers and resources from the federal to states and local governments.

“It is possible to deconcentrate powers and resources from the Federal government to the states and local governments and it is possible to do so either by good leadership at the federal level or through a constitutional amendment,” he

Research and Innovation: CDA, DRIP Train Staff on Best Practices

In a bid to transform Bayero University, Kano into research-based institution, Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) and Directorate of Research, Innovations and Partnership (DRIP) trained staff on modern trend in research and innovation.

In a three-day workshop on *Responsible Research and Innovations in the Drylands* (ISFOSID) funded by the Africa Regional Scholarship and Innovation Fund (RSIF), held between 6th and 8th April, 2021 at the CDA, participants selected from different faculties and departments were trained on applied research with a view to solving myriad societal challenges. The idea is to engage the university staff at all levels to embark on cutting-edge researches and produce innovative products as well as ensure best practices.

At the end of the three-day workshop, the participants said their mindset on research was completely changed, stating that they would indeed put what they learned into use in order to promote the University's best practices in research.

The discussions included two sessions of paper presentations, discussions on the roots and sources, consequences and implications of restructuring and challenges of corruption on democratic governance in Nigeria.

Inputs were given by several speakers, which included Dr. Abubakar Siddique Mohammed, Director, CEDDERT, Zaria, who presented paper on the Challenges of Corruption and Democratic Governance in Nigeria; Professor Eham B. Mijah of Department of Political Science, NDA, Kaduna, the Menace of Insecurity in Nigeria: Challenges for Democratization Process; and Hajiya Halima Ben Umar of Women in Media, Kano who presented paper on Media, Hate Speech and the Sustenance of Nigeria's Democratization Process.

The speakers presented the audience with practical experiences, insights, and views both at national level and international level.

The feedback of the participants confirmed that the seminar was very much appreciated as well as that there is a pressing need for practical approaches and for more opportunities to discuss the many issues and the prospects for restructuring Nigeria, which would lead to peaceful democracy in the future.

Most remarkable was the contribution of Professor Habu Mohammed from the Department of Political Science, BUK who concurred with Professor Jega on the idea of restructuring. He believed that the existing structure can easily be made to be more effective by the way of devolution of powers from the central government to the various components units of states and local governments.

Also, Dr. Aminu Hayatu from the Department of Political Science advocated for the place of morality in the way actors undertaking government activities was involved.

Dr. Hauwa Sani Ahmed of the Department of Library and Information Sciences, said the workshop was educative

and interactive as she learned new dimensions in research activities. She thanked the CDA and DRIP for organizing the workshop.

Dr. Hassan Ya'u of the Department of Information and Media Studies commended the facilitators for their competence in using new methods and techniques in facilitating the training, expressing confidence that he would share the experiences with his fellow colleagues in order to improve the frontier of knowledge in research and development.

“The workshop has changed my thinking on research as I have developed interest in applied research rather than basic research,” said Muzammil Ahmed Khalid of Geography Department.

Professor Auwalu Bindawa said despite many engagements he had to stay till the end because of the importance of the workshop. He expressed optimism that they would take what they learned to their departments.

Sharing their experiences, some of the facilitators, Professor Rabi'a Sai'd and Dr. Munir Abdullahi Kamba, said the workshop was resourceful and interactive, saying that it would position Bayero University as a research based institution. They commended the participants for making the workshop lively having identified the challenges faced and how they showed commitment to overcome them.

“We emphasized on the challenges being faced by supervisor and supervisee and discussed many issues

related to it with a view to solving them,” said Prof Rabi'a Sa'id.

Dr. Kamba on his part said we reminded the participants on how to conduct applied research through best practices because a university cannot be called a research institution unless many of its staff conduct applied researches that will address societal challenges. He urged the University management to continue to support such workshops in order to promote the best practices in research.

Earlier in the opening session, the Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, said that Bayero University was among the eleven universities in Africa selected to host PASET programmes conducted by the CDA. “The idea of PASET programme is that Africans should train manpower at PhD level with the aim of addressing local challenges through the application of knowledge,” he added.

According to him, there are huge skills gap in Africa and shortage of man power development, but assured that such type of training would help to bridge those gaps and provide high level manpower in the region.

The Director of DRIP, Professor I. A. Rufai, said Bayero University has been making series of transformations not only in physical development but also on content development, adding that it has redefined its mandate to conduct cutting-edge research and knowledge transfer in order to graduate high quality graduates.

He further said that among the first directive given to him by the Vice Chancellor on his assumption of office, was to

revive the clinic for proper dissemination of services.
