The presentation was part of Policy and Programme Implementation in Nigeria that the President of the made a high-level presentation that impressed the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Muhammadu Buhari, participants with a paper titled "Intercontential Study GCFR, tasked participants of Senior Executive Course

43, 2021 to research on the theme **Getting Things Done: Strategies for Policy and Programme Implementation in Nigeria**. In pursuance of this presidential mandate, the Study Group Six undertook a tour of Greece between 5th and 16th July, 2021.

The seminar which took place on Thursday, 29th July, 2021 in the Seminar Room at the Political Party Leadership and Policy Development Centre of NIPSS, was aimed at providing a forum for professionals to rub minds and share ideas on comparative policy analysis. It is a way of contributing to how policy strategy frameworks can be improved. The study tour of Greece by Study Group Six afforded them the opportunity to navigate Greece experience in its way out of economic conundrum by getting things done through effective policies and programme implementation.

The group opined that policy and programme implementation is the connection between government desires and actual delivery of public goods and services. The paper further argued that the capability, ability and readiness of governments around the world to mobilise, deploy and effectively utilise resources for policy and programme implementation, vary from one context to another.

According to the study Group Six, despite the enormous human and economic resources at its disposal to become a great and prosperous nation, Nigeria is experiencing economic and other related challenges such as corruption, domestic instability, debt burden, neglect of target beneficiaries and lack of adequate consideration of the policy environment.

The paper which made comparative analysis between Nigeria and Greece, revealed that Greece shares some striking similarities with Nigeria. Firstly, it experienced economic recession in recent time and through proper implementation of policies, strategies and programmes, it has been able to pull out of the recession. Moreover, Nigeria is still struggling with the aftermath of economic recession.

The paper also cited that Greece depends on its natural resource endowment which drives its tourism industry while Nigeria depends primarily on oil for its revenue.

Therefore, the economies of both countries are vulnerable to externally induced shocks. It also analysed that Greece and Nigeria have historical legacies of military dictatorship, civil war and political instability, which set the scene for a political environment where corruption, patronage and institutional inefficiency thrived. However, according to the paper, Greece has already gained significant milestone in building resilience and diversifying her sources of revenue thereby improving her capacity for policy and programme implementation.

The study recommended that the Federal Government of Nigeria should set-up a High-Level Committee responsible to the President to monitor the compliance status of Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs).

According to Professor Adamu, polytheism was practiced for 3,000 years in Egypt, meaning the ancient Egyptians worshiped many gods, until when the Heretic Pharaoh, Akhanaten, worshiped only Aten.

He said Akhenaten lived in the city of Akhetaten for 17 years, and not as the Pharaoh but more as a religious leader. He added that Akhanaten introduced monotheism which is the exclusive worship of one deity and the denial of the existence of other deities.

The scholar said, with Akhenaten's death, the Aten cult he had founded was gradually abandoned. Tutankhaten (his successor and son) changed his name to Tutankhamunin in the second year of his reign (1332 BC) and abandoned the city of Akhetaten, which eventually fell into ruin. He added that practical

efforts were made to ensure that everything about Akhenaten was erased.

The paper presentation attracted great into debates, brainstorming and questions such as who was Akhenaten? Who was he referring to that one God? What was the relationship between Atenism and Islam? These were some of the questions raised by the participants.

The lecture was attended by erudite professors such as Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu, Professor Shehu Aliyu Rano and Professor Baffa Aliyu and others.

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for admission into Bachelor of Science Programme in Agricultural Extension for the 2020/2021 Academic Session.

A. THE PROGRAMME

- 1. The programme is specifically designed for already serving mid-career Agricultural Extension Workers only.
- 2. Students admitted into the programme are required to spend two and half years, which will cover On-Campus training and Off-Campus Supervised Enterprise Projects (SEPs).

B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENT INTO B.Sc. AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION PROGRAMME

- 1. Higher National Diploma (HND) in any field of Agriculture such as Agronomy/Crop Production, Technology/Horticulture; Agric Economics; Agric Extension; Animal Production/Animal Health; Fisheries; Forestry and General Agriculture, with a minimum of Lower credit.

- 4. Candidates should be recommended and sponsored by their employers.
